The Carson County Commissioners met last week in their regular monthly meeting. All members were present.

Judge Roselius informed the court of the proposed installation of "safety arms" on the railroad crossing at road "W" and highway 60 and road "G" and highway 60. "The installation would be in the future and funded by the State and Federal governments."


Commissioner Smith informed the court of his intention to seal-coat .04 of a mile of asphalt road in the west portion of Prec. #2.


Dwight Brandt of Brandt Engineering, Amarillo, Texas, discussed bid specifications for debris removal caused by tornadoes in June, '92. Carson County will advertise for bids and hopefully take action on the bids July 28, '93, at 10:00 a.m., Carson County courthouse.

The court approved the release of two safekeeping receipts pledged by the First National Bank of Panhandle.

The recent P.I.L.T. meeting held in Washington, D.C. was discussed. It was pointed out that the Nuclear Communities Working Group met with Department of Energy officials to exchange information concerning a solution to compensate counties which have a D.O.E. facility located within their boundaries. It was also pointed out that due to the environmental clean-up of former Ordinance Plant facilities, Ordinance could be detonated at the former Pantex site located west of Panhandle on D.O.E. property. "Mr. Russell Holeman of the United States Army Corps of Engineers has been notified by the County Judge's office to inform officials before detonation begins if it is to be disposed of in this manner."

The court reviewed preliminary 1993-94 budget figures from the various offices, and the certified county wide values for '93-'94. Certified property values are \$517,533.461.00 See Commissions, pg 5







### **Carson Co. Sheriff's Report**

Our department assisted area agencies in an early morning search for an escapee from the Potter County Correctional Facility on Monday. We are also investigating the theft of a 1990 Chevrolet pickup from an area on west Highway 60. It is unknown at this time if the stolen pickup is related to the escapee from Potter County, but we are pursuing all leads in the The pickup has matter. recovered and been returned to the owner.

The Carson County Sheriff's Department is currently investigating a sexual assault which was reported in Carson County and we will be turning our information over to the District Attorney's Office for review and prosecution.

The Sheriff's Department responded to two reports of Domestic Violence and assisted the Panhandle EMS at a report of a man down at a residence in Panhandle. Our department received several reports of potential drunk drivers on I-40 and U.S. 60. We received a call this past weekend from a person reporting two

females driving from Stinnett south on Highway The females were 207. reported to be intoxicated. Further investigation showed that the caller was probably the husband of one of the females and that the call was most likely in retaliation for earlier Family Violence charges pressed by the wife. are currently We investigating the matter to see if charges can be filed for filing a False Police Report.

Our department assisted the Texas Highway Patrol at the scene of a truck fire on Interstate 40 which resulted the collision of two in vehicles. A milk truck from Amarillo caught fire on the Interstate and two passenger vehicles collided when one driver apparently failed to notice that all other traffic

had stopped. The Sheriff's Department was called to a truck stop on Interstate 40 to investigate the presence of 25-30 persons travelling in a Winnebago. Further investigation showed that the group is suspected of being a multi-state theft ring which hits truck

shopping malls. The main subject had a lengthy record of arrests but no current warrants, so the "group" was advised to return to the Winnebago and continue their journey. In a small jurisdiction such as ours, officers are normally faced with the need to handle calls on their own without the benefit of close back-up While I have support. never been one to comment generously on the appearance of Panhandle Police Chief Ken Rogers, I must admit that I have never found him to look more lovely than when he appears while I am confronting 25-30 suspected California thieves in a Winnebago.

A weapon stolen in a Carson County burglary was recovered during a raid in Amarillo by drug

investigators. Also recovered was another weapon which had been stolen from Borger and over \$40,000.00 in cash in the attic of the home. The suspect is a Mexican national who refuses to give information on where the weapons and cash were obtained.







The McLean School met in Board regular session last week.

Ð

Two teacher vacancies were filled as the board hired Janet Glass as an elementary teacher. T h e board also offered a contract to Sam Browning to serve as social studies teacher for high school.

The board accepted the resignation of Kristic Crockett, Chapter I Reading teacher, and Mary Bybee cafeteria cook for the las twenty years. The board plans to advertise to fill the vacancy left by Bybee.

In other business, the board approved a new contract with MD Physicians Insurance Company to provide the employee's health insurance policies. The district is expecting a \$16 per month increase on. the 40 full time employees making their monthly premium \$128.79 per employee beginning September 1.

The board approved a \$1,000.00 bid from Locklear Roofing of Hollis, Oklahoma for repairs to the roof of the business office.

The board will apply to the U.S. Department of Justice to approve plans to install a polling place at the former Alanreed School.

They delayed a vote on the proposed sale or purchase of a school bus to allow further study and a recommendation from Stanley Lamb.

The McLean Schools were disappointed to receive two more teacher resignations this past week. The school received resignations from Connie Guthrie and Belinda Masters. Mrs. Guthrie has accepted a position with the Canyon ISD and Mrs. Masters will work in the Wheeler Schools.

Previously, resignations were submitted by Cynthia Howard, the sixth grade teacher and Kristi Crockett, the chapter one teacher. Of course, the untimely death of Chuck Hill created a vancancy in the school's social studies department.
