 David Swinford was in town on Thursday to present a flag that he flew over the capital to the students and faculty of Groom ISD in honor of their accomplishment of reaching six of a possible seven Gold Star Rating, an achievement accomplished by only four schools (including Groom) in the state of Texas The program is new this year, implemented by the Texas Education AgencyRepresentative Swinford told students how proud he was of them and how great it was to represent an area it was 10 represent an area
that took education so that took
seriously,
"Only four schools in the whole state of Texas accomplished what you students and teachers have done," he said "That is really something to be proud of!"
After the presentation Representative Swinford took time to talk to "The Groom-McLean News" concerning the crisis facing our schools.
"In 1991 the state of Texas was faced with a deficit in our education budget At that time 1 represented 56 school represented in the Texas districts in the
Panhande. It took us a Panhandle. It took us a
regular session and 5 regular session and 5 special sessions to come up with a the Robin Hood Plan," he said, "a bilt that I voted against because I

"That was 11 years ago, anyone who has been elected since then has never had the opportunity to discuss school finance. It will take time to educate the 110 new members (since 1991) on all the aspects of school finance. aspects of school finance. We will have to address all the issues associated with school finance such as tax caps and property valuation and many other issues that factor into how the state funds the tax."

"In two years, at least 500 of the 1040 school districts will be at the taxation cap of $\$ 1.50$ per $\$ 100$ valuation," he said, something has to give.
Schools in the metropolitan areas like Plano are growing so fast that they need money to meet their needs for building and hiring new teachers two or three years before their tax base can catch up with them.
Where the money will come from in the state coffers is another problem. According to Swinford According $5 \%$ to $7 \%$ of only about $5 \%$ to $7 \%$ of the state's education budget comes from the Texas Lottery. There are two schools of thought about where the rest needs to come from.
One is to have a state income tax which

Swinford says he is opposed.
A state income tax is not a popular idea with many people. Such a measure would have to voted on as a

## passing.

Another possibility is to look at the business tax and the way it currently leaves out a wide group of multi-million dollar businesses.

According to Swinford, under the current system; businesses that incorporate pay a certain kind a business tax that would be similar to a business income tax However, businesses that are formed as a partnership do not have to pay the tax.

Just to be clear, however, my wife and I don't have any plans on moving and we're going to meet this challenge head on. I just feel like the school board would
have enjoyed more support if have enjoyed more support if posture from the start and posture from the start and Budget, I believe we pay our Budget, I believe we pay our superintendent a fair salary to know our school's budgel down to the cents, we also elect officials to oversee this
matter. Yet when the dollars matter. Yet when the dollars
and cents were questioned Kevin suggested he didn' kevin suggested he didn't
know off the top of his head and then later another gentleman was under the gentleman was under the
assumption there was a $\$ 400,000$ surplus in the school budget. He was answered very hastily that was incorrect. Now being objective that was confusing. There were conflicting messages. Either you know or you don't know. However It wouldn't be fair if I didn't say Kevin offered an open
office and review those numbers. Here's my point, how in the world do you attend a meeting, especially a meeting focused on money without that information on hand?
Another topic vital to this agenda was the amount of students in Groom ISD particularly the high school which if I hear right there will be 35 next year. Now if I understand the reason for the personal property tax it is supposed to hotd us over until "If the good Lord is willing, and the creek don't rise" we get help from the state. Now whiat I would like to know what is our projected amount of students in high school two years and three years from now. Where this appears to be important to me is this. If we're going to have less than 35 students in high school, I'm quite certain the state isn't going to come to the rescue, if we are going to have more than 35 students maybe there is hope and the property tax makes sense. Again I empathize with the school board, however it seems to me that perhaps pressures and lack of support on themselves by not acting decisively, being reactive to this crisis and not proactive and quite frankly not creating an effective, clear solution to our budget challenge that an entire community can an behind and support. At the end of the day there is only
two options that one has when sustaining a business or in this case a school. They are to increase your cash flow to support your expenses, or down size your operation to match your existing income. In our case, the school board now has done a flip flop. We started by cutting programs, and one program Ag just so happened to have produced more scholarships for our children than any program in school. I'm not suggesting that the board reinvent the wheel but it is time to solve this problem, or concede either way there is no margin for error left, no more money, and nothing left to cut but salaries, or jobs.

So what do we do? I will tell you what I am going to do. I'll continue to support my community, and sehool. I'm like everyone else I don't want to step out of my comfort zone and pay an added tax, but I will. I'll encourage the city and school officials to keep working for a better future, and next year T'll run for a spot on the school board. I'll do these things because I believe it will make a difference. But the most important reason 1 pledge this, 1 owe the ones before me, the ones to come and above all, I owe it to my children Sandie, Erynn, Zac and Victory.
