

#### SHERIFF'S REPORT

Officers from Carson County, Gray County, Hemphill County and

During the pursuit the suspects repeatedly rammed Oklahoma/Texas border in a DPS patrol car causing extensive damage. Shots were fired by the law enforcement officers to end pursuit the the after

suspects rammed the DPS patrol car and then began driving on the wrong side of Highway 60. Law enforcement agencies involved in the pursuit were concerned that the suspect vehicle would pose an extreme threat to other motorists on the highway.
