The City Council of Mclean met for regular meeting on September 12 , 2005 at $6: 00$ p.m. in the City Hall. Mayor, Bob Martin called the meeting to order and Betty Taylor gave the invocation.
All wotes are unanimous unless othervise stated.
The minuses to the August meeting were approved.
Billie Ward came before the Council with a concern about dogs in her neighborhood and inquired if a tranquilizer gun could be used. Due to costs and licenses, that is not possible for the city, however, Mrs. Ward was told that she could call the city cell phones at anytime day or night.
Wayne Bullis came before the council to request that the owner of the garage on 418 Waldron be asked to demolish it or repair it duse to flying debris. Mr. Bellis feared that the childres at the school could gat hit with some of it. The council asked City Secretary, Teai Bohler to sead the owaer a letter.
James Troy spoke to the Council regarding any relugeres that may come to McLeas. He was concerned thas there would be no exploynueat or shopping opportunities for them. He was also concerned that children that may attend school in the city would be carrying discases that would effect the children that already attend acchool here. The mayor told Mr. Troy that he had spokea with the pastors of McL cean and that they had offered McLean facilities as an overflow to the Amarillo Civic Center, but the numbers in Amarillo were decreasing.
Archie Cooper and Maggie Vines spoke with the Council regarding the

Hiswever, Mr. Cooper also to d the Council that other plices are also being loiked at for placement. Mayor Martin told Mr. Cooper that when a decision is made, he could or me back and the Council wruld make a decision.
Jayiene Watkins and Jim Rcyna brought proposals to th: Council regarding a Milean website. Ms. Watkins website is co rrently up and running. w ww.mcleantexas.com H. estimate for the w bsite was 1232.95 . Mr. Ryna would develop a IN website. His estimate $w$ is for $\$ 550.00$. However, Mr. Reyna stated that he w suld wave this amount if Uo city used his host of I tanium domains. Martin epplained that these proposals would need to go b fore the E.D.C. and w ien they made a choice, in would then be brought to tle Council.
Librarian, Sally Bohlar is formed the Council that to library had rectived a \$15,191.00 Tecker Grant $w$ hich will be used on non$f$ xion books and new desk ene. She also told the Couacil that with vemorial mosey, the Fricads of the Library and tie Library Board were going to make i aprovements to the t trary. She also informed of the libraries long term grals. Sally then requested fom the Council a city vehicle to drive to cut-oftrwa schools due to the r sing cost of gasoline. $T$ he Council declined her rexpest but offered her $\$ 100.00$ per trip for three rionths.
Roofing bids were epened. Parsley Sheet

Metal gave a bid of $\$ 6745.00$ for the three warehouse buildings. Locklear gave a bid of $\$ 9585.00$ for the three buildings. The Council accepted the Parsiey bid.
Director, Jim Adams and Marshall Hanes of Fairway Links Energy brought a three year history to the Council regarding McLean Well \#1. The well produces approximately 15 mef per day.
The E.D.C. budget was unavailable.
The generator, front end loader, locking in gas prices and the auditor engagement letter were tabied until next month. tabied until next month.
The Council approved the City of Pampa Landfilt Contract Ameadment which was raised from $\$ 24.50$ to $\$ 26.00$ per ton. This is used as the City of Mclean's back up system. The Council recognized the month of September as being National Preparedness Month in corjunction with the United States Department of Homeland Security and the American Red Cross.
Gas rate ondinance *301, Water rate ordinance \#302 and Sewer rate ordisance *303 were approved. Tax rate ordinance 304 was approved. These ordinances can be seen at City Hall.

In the Director's report, Mr. Adams told the Council that the City well was being cleaned out and that the clay liauling for the sewer plant was compiese.
Council member Teresa Simmons aaked for the handyman list and also inquired about spraying for mosquitos. Mr. Adams told the Council that the City of McLean is not licensed to spray and that it was costly.
Mindy Reeves expressed her concern over the drug population in Mclean and
what could be done about it She also told the Council that the Senior Citizens was compiling a post office box number list for the community. She also said that someone would be coming to the Senior Citizens to explain Medicare D coverage.
Mayor Martin passed out a letter to the community for all the council members to sign. The letter is available at City Hall. He also informed the Council that TML had reduced benefits for city volunteer firemen from $\$ 540.00$ to $\$ 370.00$ a week. Fire Chief, Clifford McDonald is aware of the issue.
The Council voted to pay the bills as presented and the meeting adjourned at 10:00 p.m.

## 50KG Cocaine Seized On I-40

Groom - A California man was arrested Friday morning, 9-9-05 on I-40 fter troopers found 50 KG of Cocaine in 50 KG of Cocainct uck tractor.
Rodolfo Martinez, 39 of La Puente California, was driving a 1997 Freightliner truck tractor
semi-trailer eastbound on 1-40. At $8: 45$, troopers stopped the vehicle 6 miles west of Groom for a traffic violation. After consent of search was given, $50 \mathrm{KG}(50,000$ Grams) of Cocaine was found in 2 U-Haul was located under the bed in the slceper of the truck
tractor. The Cocaine has an estimated value of \$5,000,000.00

Martinez was later was processed through the Carson County jail in Panhandle on drug related charges. Investigators believe the load originated in Los Angeles California
and was headed for Chicago, Illinois. The investigation is ongoing. This is the second Largest Cocaine seizure on I-40 this month. On Sept. 6 troopers seized 38 KG from 2 Californi subjects who were subjects who were also headed for Chicago.

PROPONIIIO: I (HJR 54)
HIR $i 4$ would creati a lexas rani relocathon and mprovement fund in the
state treavury and would authorize erants of state resente and issuance of puble debr to relocat : rehabilitate, and expand proately and publicly owned pasoenger and ireght rail fachities and to construct raliroad underpasses and oscrpasses

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows "The constitutional amendment creating the Texas rail relocation and improvement fund and authorizing grants of monev and issuance of obligations for financing the relocation, rehabilitation, and expansion of rail facilities.

## PROPOSITIOY 2 (HJR 6)

HIR 6 would provid that marriage in Texas is solely the union of a man and woman, and that the state and its polittcal subdivisions could not create or recognize any legal status identical to or similar to marriage, including such legal status relationships created outsude of Texas

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows. "The constitutional amendment providing that marriage in this state consists only of the union of one man and one woman and prohibiting this state or a political subdivision of this state from cre ating or recognizing any legal status identical or similar to marriage."

## PROPOSITION 3 (HJR 80)

IIIR NoI would provide that local economb development program loans or Erants (other than debts secured by a ptedee of at valorem taxes or financed by the issuance of any bonds or other oblugations pavable from ad valorem taxes) do not consttute or create debt ins prowsion of slate constitutional taw that may prohbit or limit the athority of a poltitcal subdivision of the state to meur debe does not apply to those loans of grants.

The propontion will ippear on the ballot av follows The constitutional amendment clarifying that certain economic development programs do not constitute a debt.

PROPOSITION 4 (SJR 17)
SJR 17 would authorize a district judge to deny remstatement of bail or new bal to a person accused of a felony, if the person's ball had been revoked or for feited as a result of the person's volation of a condition of release related to the safety of a victum of the alleged offense or to the safety of the commun-

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows "The constitu tional amendment authorizing the denial of bail to a criminal defendan whe violates a condition of the defen dant's release pending trial.

## PROPOSITION 5 (SJR 21

SJR 21 would authorize the Legislatur to exempt commercial loans from state usury laws that set maximum interes ates "Commercial loans" are loans made primarily for business. commercial, mevestment, agncultural, or similar purposes and not primarily for personal family, or household purposes

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment allowing the legislature to define rates of interest for commercial loans."

## PROPOSITION 6 (HJR 87)

 HIR 87 would increase the sire of the State Commission on Judicial Conduci from eleven to thirteen members by increasing from four to five the number of public members and by adding a constitutional county court judge The additions would ensure that the commission has an odd number of mem bers, which is required by another provision of the state constitutionThe proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows "The constitutional amendment to include one additional public member and a constitutional county court judge in the membership of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct."

PROPOSITION 9 (HJR 79)
HJR 79 would authonze the Legislature to provide staggered six year terms of office for board members serving on regional mobility authonties, with no more than one-third of the board positions being appointed every two years
