It is unknown at this time if the city would be required to assist with funding or equipping this person. A constable has about the
same powers as a deputy and must be bonded.
Fines collected would be Fines collected would be paid to the county.
4. Hire a City Marshall. This person would be hired by the City and considered a city employee, and be required to have their basic peace officers licence. Should this happen the City of Groom would have to provide a car, uniforms, nsurance, etc. for this officer. A city marshall would have the same authority as a deputy or constable but also would be able to enforce city ordinances. Any
fines collected from citations would be paid to the city.
These are questions that officials will be investigating in the near future. If you feel that Groom is in need of one of these options let your city officials know how you feel.
