Other counaty offices are required to pay a foe of $\$ 1,250$ or a fice of $\$ 750$ with signatures. Justices of the Peace Justices of the peace
candidates pay $\$ 1,000$ or candidates pay $\$ 1,000$ or Signatures.

While there are no specific educational requirements listed for County Judge and other County officials. Candidates will need to be prepared to state their prepared to state their
qualifications. Incumbent qualifications Incumbeat
candidates should be prepared to have their records scratinized.

Anyone who is seriously interested in participating in the democratic process should consider applying for a place on the ballot.
