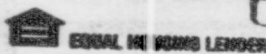

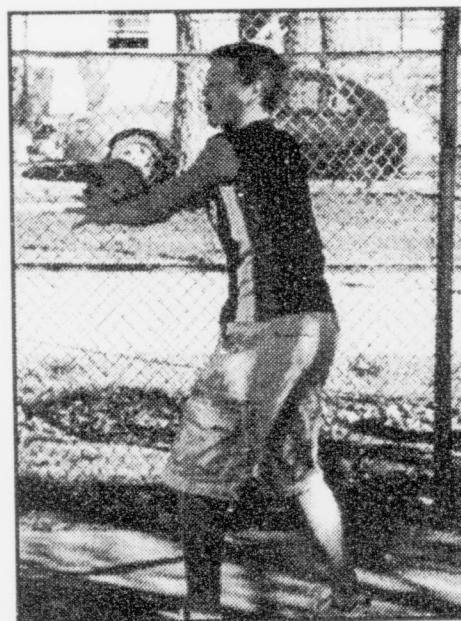

Alpha Mu Xi sponsors the annual event in which hundreds of eggs are hidden in the Memorial Park. The Easter Bunny made a command performance and was the

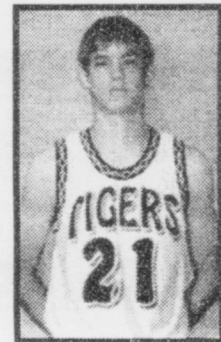

It was decided to cancel the May 7, 2005 election. 
