




Lucas Ray Seymour

City of Groom Ordinance No. 187

An ORDINANCE amending the Public Utilities Code, concerning the water and sew rates for the City of Groom, Texas

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GROOM, TEXAS that Chapter 14, Section 18, Public Utilities, be amended to set rates or charges for services furnished by the Water Works System

Water rates shall be as follows:

A. Water rates within City Limits excluding businesses: Base rate for first Two thousand gallons - \$10.00; except for customers over 65 years of age who are enrolled in Seniors program - \$7.00; \$1.80 per thousand gallons thereafter.

(This is an increase of \$3 in the base rate for those NOT in the over 65 program and 20¢ per thousand thereafter)

The person that Freddy admires the most and has had the most influence on her life is her mom.




