by the O'Dell-Barnett team. Information was not available on who won the Calcutta's.

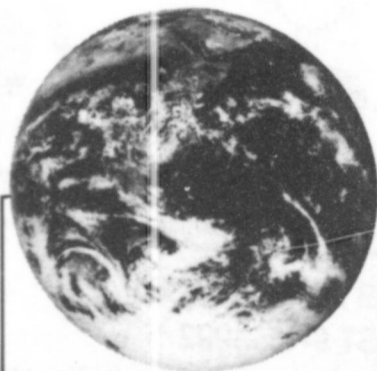
The parade was especially large this year. Two categories were judged. Winning the float category was the Groom Flying Service, Wheeler Evars

The Arts and Crafts and all the many displays were very well received.

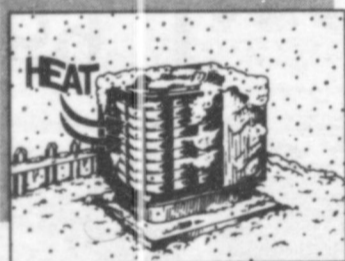

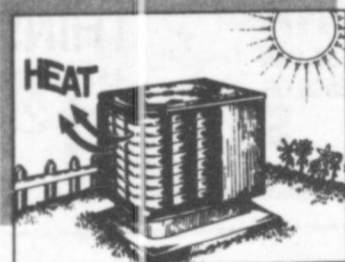

County Buys Electro-Magnet; Budget Time

The clean-up of debris caused by the recent tornadoes in the Fritch area has caused a rather expensive "flat-fixing" bill for Carson County. County Commissioners, in their regular session on Monday, July 27, took action that will hopefully eliminate additional costs for that.

The purchase of an electro-magnet, at an estimated cost of \$7,500, was approved by the Court.

Judge Roselius said that to date the county has spent around \$6,000 to have flats fixed on county equipment in the area. "That is over and above all the donated repairs from businesses and individuals," he said.

The magnet will also be used for county roads as the need arises.

Roselius also said that the clean-up process is going remarkably well and the only big problem facing

the county is the burn pit. "We are seeking financial aid from state agencies to help offset the expense the burn pit may add," he said.

Safety procedures and recommendations also drew the attention of the Court as they discussed other needs in the county.

Trinity Insurance Co. has recommended that fire extinguishers be placed in all County facilities and that See County, Pg. 5

1992 **Property Tax Rates in CARSON COUNTY**

This notice concerns 1992 property tax rates for CARSON COUNTY. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

metal containers be placed in maintenance shops to store oily rags. Those recommendations were approved.

A recent inspection of the War Memorial Building was conducted by the Texas Health Department and that also resulted in recommendations to fully comply with the American Disability Act (A.D.A.). It has been suggested that the restroom stalls in the building be widened, a partition be moved, the drinking fountain be repaired, door knobs be replaced with levers, and the handicap signs be lowered. Action on these recommendations will not be taken until an official report is received from Austin.

The Court appointed Peggy Butler to represent the County concerning the A.D.A.

Howard "Hop" Britten was approved on request of County Tax Collector Roslyn Watson, to register vehicles for county residents in the Groom area. This additional registration point is being introduced as a convenience to people living in that area who have, in the past, had to register their vehicles in Panhandle. There is already a registration location for people in White Deer and Shelytown.

A discussion was held on the 1992-93 fiscal year budget. Judge Roselius told the Panhandle Herald in a telephone interview that other than the normal operating expenses of the various departments of Carson County government, the commissioners are considering purchasing two new cars for law enforcement, rather than used vehicles as in the past. "We are also looking at County Attorney Ed Hinshaw's request for increasing his secretary's part-time employment to full time with full salary and benefits. And Hinshaw will hire another part-time secretary to handle his personal business," Roselius said. "We are hoping that this will speed up the workload in that office."

Other additional budget recommendations include a computer in the JP office at Groom and one in the County Attorney's office. The budget hearing and setting of the County tax rate will be considered in the commissioners' August meetings.

A letter from district Judge John T. Forbis informed the Court that County Auditor Agnes Bell has been appointed to another two-year term, beginning August 1, 1992.

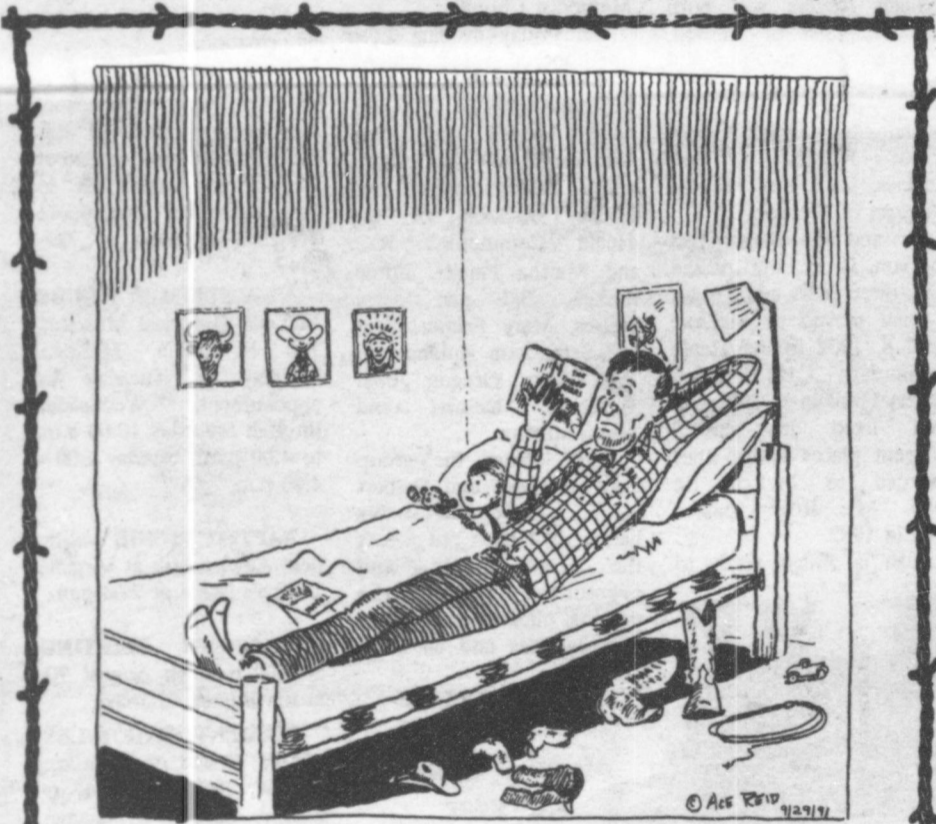

RACF is expected to generate first-year revenues of approximately \$643,000.

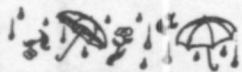

AT PRESSTIME

A light rain shower was occurring over downtown Groom. Thunderstorms are expected later in the week.

The Carson County Sheriff's Department is currently investigating the theft of three horses and saddles from the Panhandle area. Deputies are also investigating various reports of assault and theft in White Deer and Groom.

Deputies assisted the Panhandle Police Department with an injured child and with a coyote that had strayed into the city limits. The White Deer City Marshal and a Carson County deputy recovered a pickup which had been reported as stolen from Oklahoma City, Ok. The pickup is currently in the custody of the Sheriff's Department pending determination of the proper owner.

Deputies are investigating a case of fraud by check and are searching for suspects in one burglary and one forgery case.

The Carson County Jail is currently housing two subjects for Burglary, one for Sexual Assault of a Child, two for DWI and one for Failure to Appear on a drug charge.

The Carson County Sheriff's Department handled a variety of 9-1-1 calls for all of the emergency services in the county. It should be noted that calling the 9-1-1 emergency number will automatically show your telephone number on the computer (if your number is registered), but it will not tell the dispatcher the nature of your emergency. To give county residents the fastest emergency service possible, the Sheriff's Department requests that the caller stay on the line long enough to let the dispatcher know what the nature of the emergency is and whether you need the fire department, ambulance or law enforcement. When a call is received and the caller hangs up or leaves the telephone off the hook, the dispatcher has to either try to get the caller back on the telephone or send an officer to the location to determine what the problem is. Valuable time can be lost in responding to emergency

situations when the dispatcher can't tell what the emergency is.

The 9-1-1 system has been a tremendous asset to Carson County residents, but even with all its capabilities, it can't read minds. Please help the Sheriff's Department serve you by staying on the line when you call 9-1-1 and giving the pertinent information to the dispatcher.

Carson County Deputies and the Texas Highway Patrol assisted with a car fire approximately 2½ miles north of Panhandle on Highway 207. The car was owned by a Borger couple and was totally destroyed. There were no injuries.

Anyone having information regarding the theft of the horses and saddles or anyone observing subjects loading horses along highway 207 is asked to call the Carson County Sheriff. 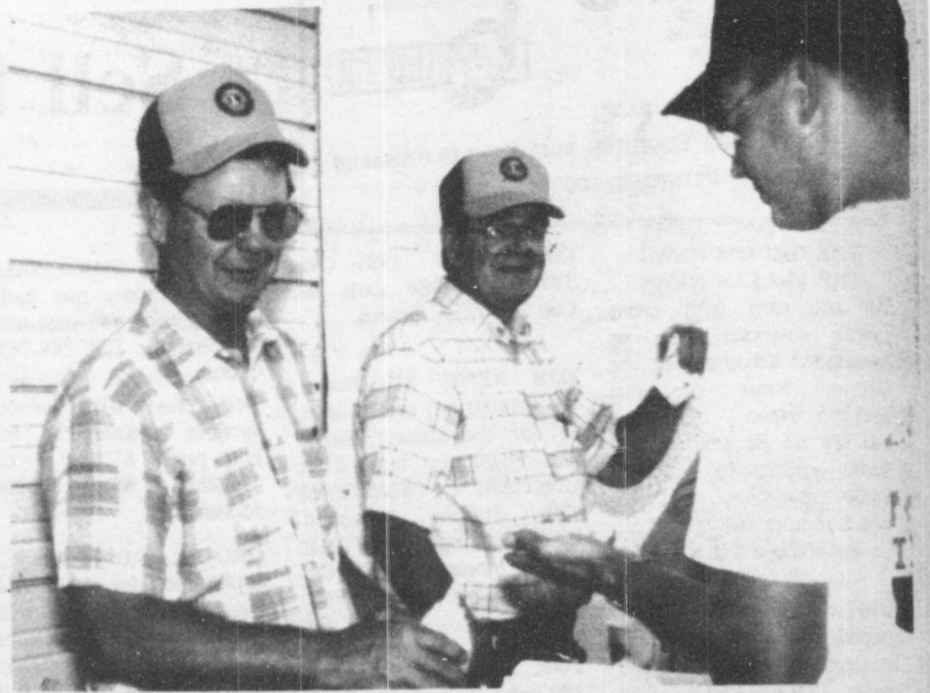
