

McLean Students Compete In Beef Challange

If the future of the cattle industry lies in its young people, prospects are bright indeed as an al group of cattle feeders exceptional young cattle feeders gathered recently for the Junior Fed Beef Challenge sponsored by the Texas Cattle Feeders

Association (TCFA).
The TCFA Junior Fed
Beef Challenge is a
program that allows
students in 4-H or FFA to gain practical experience in commercial cattle feeding. Students from Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico feed a pen of three steers, then compete on their knowledge of the cattle industry and the performance of their cattle. The contest also ream features a Team Challenge, where students who don't feed cattle can compete on their cattle feeding knowledge. This year, 39 students competed in the Junior Fed Beef Challenge and seven teams of two to three students competed in the Team Challenge.

Overall champion and top scholarship winner in the senior division was Jessica Fish of McLean, who won a \$2,000 college scholarship.
Garrett Anderson of \$2,000 Garrett Garrett Anderson or Menard captured reserve champion overall and a \$1,500 scholarship and Tyler Keeling of Hereford was first runner up, winning a \$1,000 scholarship

The overall winners are determined by combining scores in four areas, written exam, interview, record book and carcass performance of the steers. A plaque and \$500 cash award is given to first place winners in each place winners in each area and plaques go to second and third. In addition, each student who enters steers in the contest earns premium money.

In the carcass contest, Ansen Pond captured top carcass and Ryan Hyatt of Deming, N.M. captured second. N.M. captured second. Travis Fish took first place in the pen of three contest with Ansen Pond and Ryan Hyatt tying for second. Top honors in the live evaluation contest went to Zach Long of Canadian with Justin Johnson adding to his winnings by capturing Johnson adding to his winnings by capturing second.
