## McLean Students Compete In Beef Challange

If the future of the cattle industry lies in its young people, prospects are bright indeed as an exceptional group of young cattle feeders gathered recently for the Junior Fed Beef Challenge sponsored by the Texas Cattle Feeders Association (TCFA).
The TCFA Junior Fed Beef Challenge is program that allows students in $4-\mathrm{H}$ or FFA to gain practical experience in commercial cattle feeding. Students from Teras Otlahoma and New Mexico feed pen of three steers, then compete on their knowledge of the cattle industry and the performance of their cattle. The contest also features a Team Challenge, where students who don't feed cattle can compete on their cattle freding knowledge. This year, 39 students competed in the Junior Fed Beef Challenge and seven teams of two to three students competed in the Team Challenge. Overall champion and top scholarship winner in the senior division was essica Fish of McLean, who won a $\$ 2,000$ college scholarship. Garrett Anderson of Menard captured reserve champion overall and a
