



EMS call, "What is wrong with the patient? Is it minor or life-threatening?

We wish you could know the frustration we feel in the cab of the engine or a personal vehicle, the driver with his foot pressing down hard on the pedal, my arm tugging again and again at the air horn chain, as you fail to yield the right-of-way at an intersection or in traffic. When you need us however, your first comment upon our arrival will

be, "It took you forever to get here!"
We wish you could know our thoughts as we help extricate a girl of teenage years from the remains of her friend? What if this was my sister, my girlfriend or a friend? What were her parents reaction going to be when they opened the door to find a police officer with hat in hand? "What if this was my sister, my girlfriend or a We wish you could realize the physical, emotional and mental drain or missed meals, lost sleep and forgone social activities, in addition to all the tragedy of

We wish you could know the brotherhood and selfsatisfaction of helping save a life or preserving son property, or being able to be there in time of crisis, or creating order from total chaos. We wish you could understand what it feels like to have a little boy tugging at your arm and asking, "Is Mommy okay?" Not even being able to look in his eyes without tears from your own and not knowing what to say. Or to have to hold back a long time friend who watches his buddy having rescue breathing done on him as they take him away in the ambulance. You know all along he did not have his seat belt on. A sensation that we have become familiar with

Unless you have lived with this kind of life, you will orners you have lived with this kind of upe, you will never truly understand or appreciate who we are, or what our job really means to us... We wish you could though. Support your local EMS workers. The next life they save, could be yours. When you see them coming with flashing




