The 33 days of training provides the best possible professional training and evaluation for all cadets in





degree felony of possession of more than 400 grams of cocaine with intent to deliver. on January 19, 2005. Cause # 3451

Joel Cazares for a 1st degree felony for possession of a controlled substance (cocaine) with intent to deliver, 400 grams or more on Janua 19, 2005. Cause # 3452

Jacob Mize for a State Jail Felony for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, namely a Yamaha Raptor ATV with out the consent of the owner. on June 17, 2005. Cause # 3453


