President Clinton announced that disaster assistance will be available throughou Texas for agriculture producers suffering losses because of this summer's drought. Secretary of Agriculture Dan Glickman has designated the entire has designated the entir State of Texas as a disaster area due to drought and excessive The drought has
damaged most Texas damaged most Texas crops to the extent that many fields may not be worth harvesting. Many areas of Texas hav received less than a third of their normal annual rainfall, and soil conditions in the entire state are classified "severely dry."

The National Weather Service predicts a high Service predicts a hig probability of continued drought theroughout the rest of the 1998 growing season.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes available low-interest loans to eligible farmers who have suffered a loss of 30 percent or more on any single crop. Qualifying single crop. Qualifying producers must be creditworthy, unable to obtain credit elsewhere, and have adequate collateral to secure the loan.
FSA authorized emergency haying and grazing of Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acreage in counties with significant losses in hay and pasture production Producers cannot both Producers graze the sath graze the same CRP land.
Farmers and ranchers who have suffered damages are encouraged to contact their loca USDA Service Centers or FSA county offices for further information These are listed in telephone books under "U.S. Government Department Agriculture.
