"We had about nine firefighters respond and many volunteers who helped us get the fire under control," stated Fire Chief Tony Treadwell. Treadwell suspects the

Treadwell suspects the car in the garage as the culprit. The 1999 Grand Am was a recent purchase of Ms. Eatmon's.

"I bought the car about

"I bought the car about two weeks ago from Brown Pontiac. I parked it in the garage at about 6:30 that evening.

Although most of the home and furnishings were a total loss, she was able to salvage some photo albums, some clothing and a few pieces of furniture.

Eatmon's immediate future plans are uncertain. The holiday weekend delayed the insurance investigators from arriving until Tuesday. She stated that she plans to
