During District Court sessions in Panhandle this past week, one defendant entered a plea to the charge of Arson, one to Felony DWI and Possession of Stolen Property (motor vehicle). The subject driving a stolen vehicle from Oklahoma plead guilty and Carson County for the costs of his prose caution in addition to his sentence.
The Carson County Sheriffs Department is currently investigating a drive-by shooting which occurred at a Skellytown residence. Offices are also investigating an shooting incident the fol owing day which involved gunshot damage to a motor vehicle. It is unknown at this time if the incidents were related.

The Sheriffs Department has received several phone calls regarding dog packs chasing and attacking cattle. Our only alternative when we receive these calls is to locate the dogs and destroy them. It is the duty of the owners to control and contain the dogs. Owners of the dogs cal be held

Payments ty mail must be postmarked no later than midnight February 1.
Taxes paid after February 1 will incur a 7 percent penalty and interest. The penalty and interest will climb to 9 percent after February $28 ; 11$ percent after March $31 ; 13$ percent after April 30; and 14 percent after May 31.

On July 1, the penalty and interest will hit 18 percent, an additional 15 percent assessment will be added for attorney collection fees.
