At that ime the pienic lasted all day with baseball games and water fights. The picnic evolved into a barbecue with the men of the community cooking the meat all night. They would also take turns feeding a calf for the next year.
In the early 1950's John Baggerman began contributing the meat for the barbecue, a tradition his wife and later his son Ruben have continued.
The Hopkins Community always had an End of School picnic and when the two schools consolidated in 1973, the barbecue and covered dish picnic continued as a community activity. Baggerman now has the meat prepared by Dyer's Barbecue. The PTO members prepare beans and appricots and set up tables and chairs in every available corner.
