Students Honored For Academics

Matthew K. Fields, son of Mr. and Mrs. Keith Fields and Karen L. Babcock, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Babcock, students at Groom Junior High School will be honored for their academic achievement at a statewide ceremony on June 17 at Baylor University in Waco. The recognition ceremony is sponsored by the Duke University Talent Identification Program (TIP) to salute the seventh-graders from Texas who qualified in TIP's ninth annual Talent Search. All students invited to the ceremony have earned scores on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or the American College Testing Assessment (ACT) comparable to college-bound high school sen-

The students will receive certificates of distinction at the ceremony. The highest scorers will also receive scholarships and books.

TIP conducts recognition ceremonies in each of the 16 states it serves in the Southeast, Midwest and Soutwest. Over 50,000 mathematically and verbally gifted seventh graders are identified by this program each year. TIP offers additional education opportunites for gifted students in seventh through tenth grades.

TIP is a non-profit educational organization established in 1980 with a five year grant from The Duke Endowment. The program receives continuing support from student fees, individuals, corporations and foun-

Hopkins Barbeque

The Grandview-Hopkins Annual End of School Barbecue will be Thursday, May 25 at noon.

In 1926 three schools consolidated to become Grandview. The first Grandview Community End of School covered dish picnic was the next spring, 1927. At that time the picnic lasted all day with baseball games and water fights. The picnic evolved into a barbecue with the men of the community cooking the meat all night. They would also take turns feeding a calf for the next

In the early 1950's John Baggerman began contributing the meat for the barbecue, a tradition his wife and later his son Ruben have continued.

The Hopkins Community always had an End of School picnic and when the two schools consolidated in 1973, the barbecue and covered dish picnic continued as a community activity. Baggerman now has the meat prepared by Dyer's Bar-becue. The PTO members prepare beans and appricots in every available corner.

All friends of the community are invited to bring a salad, vegetable or dessert and join in the fun, food and festivities.
