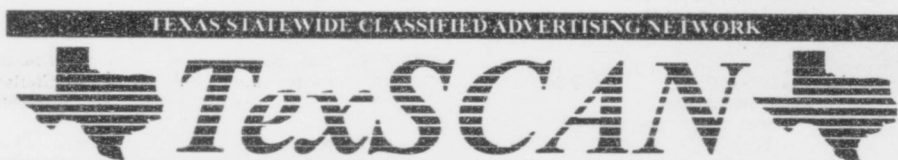

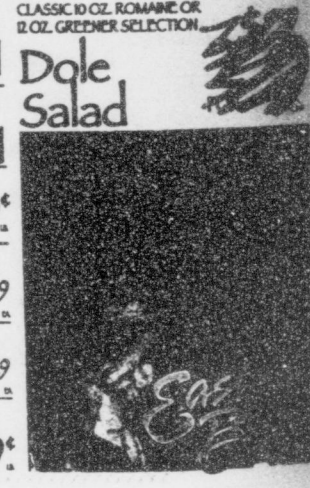

Group Discusses Options To Address Volunteer Ambulance Department Personnel Shortage



service as an EMT. 170 Class hours plus 2-12 hour shifts at Nwth Emergency Room and 2-12 hour shifts with the

Amarillo Medical Service Ambulance Department.

Bobby Euil Pool was asked by County Judge Lewis Powers to serve as moderator to explain the County's position on the money that was designated to go to Groom by the County Commissioners Court in the event that the organization decided to hire someone to man the ambulance during daytime hours.

The money would need to be matched by either the ambulance service, itself, or The City of Groom. According to the information that was provided by the ambulance service, the cost of hiring a full time employee to run the ambulance service would range from \$8.00 per hour to \$12.00 per hour, depending on their level of training.

The Service would then need to obtain a variance from the state of Texas that

Problems have occurred due to the lack of qualified people who are available during the daytime hours. The State of Texas and PEMSS have many requirements that an ambulance service must meet in order to provide service. Included

is that each ambulance service must be staffed with 2 certified EMT's 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Failure to do this could result in a \$7,500 fine per event. Groom's service like many others in the area, are having trouble getting and keeping qualified people to serve during the day when most of the volunteers are at work.

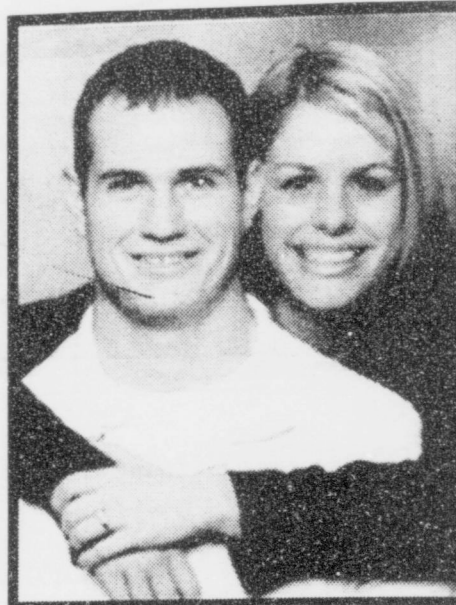

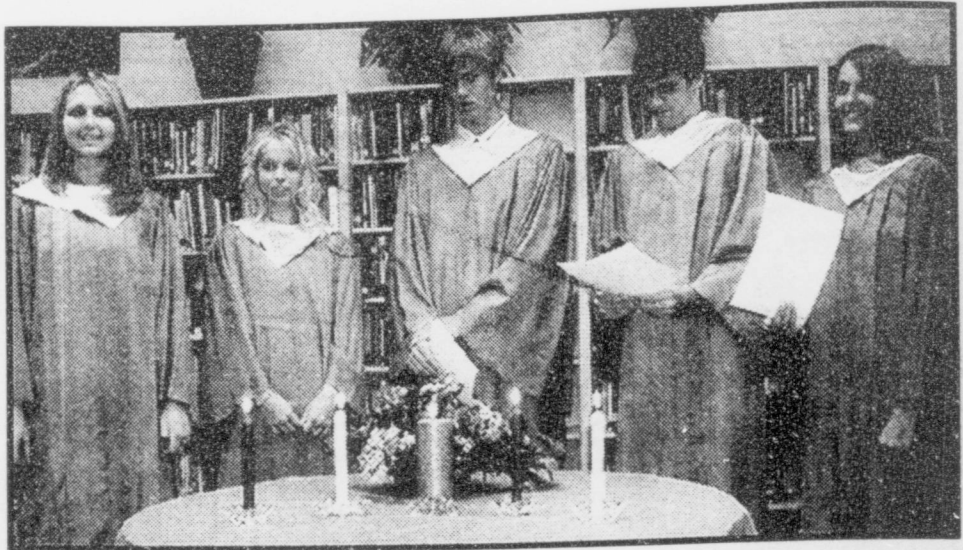

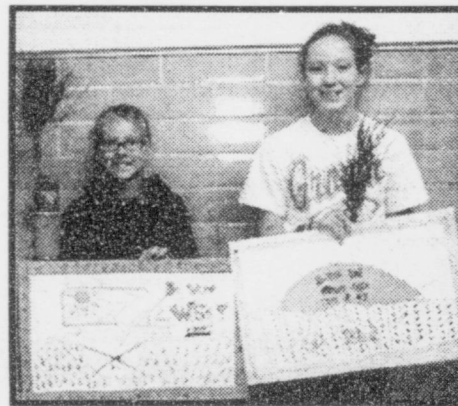
Winners and runner-ups were selected from each school. Trophies and ribbons were presented to first, second, and third

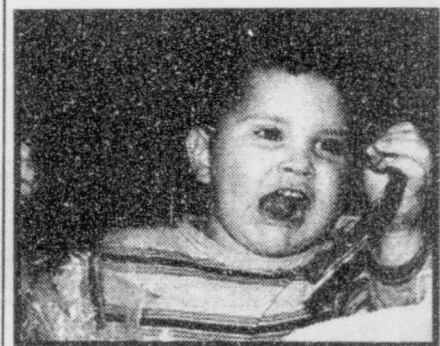

Carson County Sheriff Reports Arrests

The Carson County Sheriff's Office and Panhandle PD responded to a call in reference to a possible explosive device in Panhandle on 4-6-06. A local resident had discovered an item that appeared to be a WWII vintage Japanese made arming fuse for a military munition round. The discovery was made while going through the property of a deceased relative. The fuse was probably brought home as a war souvenir. It is illegal to knowingly possess such a device. The law also requires that all recovered military munitions be returned to the military. The Amarillo Bomb Squad was contacted and they responded to the scene and took custody of the device.

It was later picked up from the Bomb Squad by the US Army EOD unit from Fort Sill.

Sheriff Tam Terry stated that anyone finding suspicious items should always report it to the local authorities. While it is illegal to possess these devices, our main concern is not in prosecution but in protecting our citizens from possible injury or death. Old devices like this can be unstable and are capable of exploding on their own under the right conditions.

Judge Powers Declares Burn Ban

Carson County Judge Lewis Powers declared Carson County under a Burn Ban last week. Additional guidelines are in place due to the extreme circumstances that the area is under... WHEREAS, the Texas Forest

Service has determined that drought conditions exist within the county, AND WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has determined that circumstance present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard the would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Carson County that all outdoor burning in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code §352.081, or other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas

Commission on Environmental Quality for (1) fire training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agriculture

crops; (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code or (5) have been granted exemptions since Jan. 3rd, 2006 by action of the Commissioners Court. Any person is entitled to injunctive relief to prevent the violation of a prohibition or restriction established by an order adopted under this section (g) of the Local Government Code §352.081.

This burn ban does not prohibit the use of outdoor grills or welding activities but will be restricted based on guidelines adopted by the Commissioners Court in accordance with this burn ban order.

This order supersedes executive order dated April 4th, 2006.

In accordance with Local Government Code §352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

ADOPTED this 10th day of April, 2006 by a vote of ayes and nays.
