The analysis by county for the retail trade division of how much money was spent locally and the sales Carson stayed in County showed 46 reporting outlets in 2005 as compared to 59 outlets reporting in 2004's 3rd quarter. There was an increase of 21.6% increase to \$7,938,210.00 as compared to \$6,534.00 collected in 2004's 3rd quarter.



let the ambulance operate like the GEDC with a slate of officers and a budget.



He served in the Navy during World War II as a captain on a sub chaser. After returning to Amarillo, he began working for Texaco. In


