When we are sent to a domestic dispute we do not have the capacity to act as marriage counselors or as mediators. If a deputy observes any indication of assault (including pain on the part of the victim) the offending party will be responsible for the altercation, both parties will be arrested and incarcerated. When children re in the home, the Department of Human Services may be called to care for the children in the absence of one or both parents if there are no other relatives available to care for the children.
