Boys Place 1st, Girls 3rd At Meet

The Groom High School Track Teams roared into Miami with a little traditional March weather. Even with blustery winds and bone chilling temperatures the Groom boys pulled off an easy first place win with 124 points. Valley placed second with 73, Clarendon JV 66, Lefors 64, McLean 58, Ft. Elliott 37, Channing 25, Hartley 22, and Silverton 6. Seth Ritter brought home a first place win in the pole vault, clearing 10 feet. He beat second place by 6

inches, which was his brother Justin's vault at 9'6". Ty Lambert placed third giving Groom a clean sweep for the pole vault. Chris Burger placed second and Tom Lambert placed third in the discus throw. Harold Cave placed third in the shot. Justin Ritter placed third in the 800 meter run. Bryan Crowell placed second in the 110 meter hurdles. Wes Hall came in third in the 400 meter run.

Bo Burgin placed second in the 300 meter hurdles. Both of Groom's relay teams placed first. The 400 meter relay team had a time of 46.57. Longway, Fields, Friemel File

At presstime last week only one candidate had come out for the school board. True to form, on Wednesday, the deadline, three more candidates finally threw their hats into the ring.

Joe Longway, one of Groom's two, DPS officers, has filed. Coming to Groom in 1989 with wife Kim, daughter Shantel and son Brent; Longway is interested in the future of Groom School and has a deep desire to give back to the community.

"Everyone has been so nice to us since moving here . . ." he stated, "I would like to do my part to give back to the community."

Longway is a member of the Methodist Church and the Lion's Club. He also was a T-ball coach last year.

Barry Fields is a lifelong resident and farmer of the Groom area. He and wife Carol are active in the Baptist Church. They have three children, Brenda, Dean and Doug.

"I'm running for the Groom Independent School Board because I feel our children are our future. I'd like to see our kids continue to receive the strong education and achievements that they have in the past."

Gary Friemel is a former board member. He resigned last year because his sister-in-law had applied for a job at the school. According to nepotism laws, he can now, legally, run to get back on the board.

"I would like to continue my contribution to the community by serving on the school board", he stated,

"I want not what is best for my kids, or what is best for your kids, but what is best for all our kids."

Gary and wife, Julie have three children, Melanie, Jessica and Trevor. They are active in St. Mary's Catholic Church. He is engaged in farming interests in the area.

Curtis Downs is the candidate that was previously reported on. With his name, voters will be selecting two candidates from a field of four.

Only two of the three slots for the City Council will be filled unless a write in candidate comes forward in the next few days. Incumbents Hop Britten and Bob Cornett will go back on the Council unopposed.

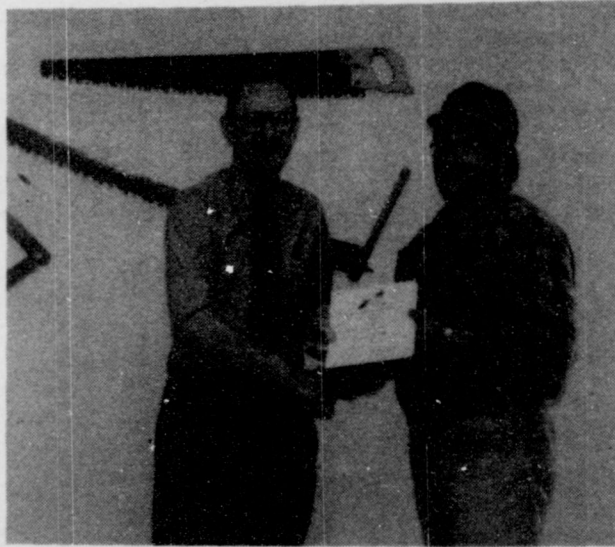

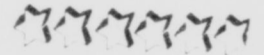

As the Interstate Turns... DPS Report

On the 15th of March an Amarillo woman was arrested one mile west of Groom for Failed to Identify and unpaid Amarillo Police Department tickets after the woman gave a false name and date of birth. The woman was transported to the Carson County Country Club where she was held until the arrival of the Amarillo Police.

On the 19th of March an accident was investigated at the intersection of US 60 and FM 2373 near Pantex. Two Amarillo youths were transported by Pantex ambulance to Northwest Texas Hospital after a Pantex employee failed to yield right of way to oncoming traffic. The Pantex woman suffered minor injuries and was issued one citation for Failing to Yield Right of Way. Later that evening an Amarillo man was arrested for DWI-1st and Aggravated Assault With A Motor Vehicle on IH-40 nine miles East of Groom after he fled the scene of the assault at Greenbelt Lake. The man was taken to the Gray County Sheriff's Office until he could post bond. Later that evening a Groom youth was issued a

citation for Minor in Possession of an Alcoholic Beverage after being observed throwing an empty beer bottle at the NAPA Store in Groom.

On the 21st of March an Afton, Oklahoma man was arrested for DWI-1st Offense at the Love's Parking Lot after several citizen complaints. Later that evening a Lefors man was transported from the Gray County Jail to the Carson County Jail for unpaid DPS tickets from Judge Harpers Court in Skellytown.

On the 22nd of March a Garland woman was issued a citation for Drug Paraphernalia on IH-40 three miles west of Groom. Later that afternoon a Texan was arrested by Trooper Chris Ray of Panhandle for DWI-1st Offense on US 50 near White Deer. The woman was taken to the Carson County Cross Bar Hotel until she could post bond.

On the 23rd of March a Roswell, New Mexico man was issued a citation for Failed to Identify after giving a false name and date of birth on IH-40 twelve miles west of Groom.

Special Session Report...

New Gym Estimates Too High

The McLean ISD Board of Trustees met in special session Thursday, March 24, 1994. The special session was for discussion of the construction of a new gymnasium.

The meeting was called to order by President James Hefley @ 7:05 pm.

Opening prayer by Jake Hess.

Members present: James Hefley, Jake Hess II, Eugene Galley, Jay Dee Fish, Billie Ward, John Holland.

Members absent: 0

Guests: Neil Odom, Jim Doche, James Rittenbury, Bob Davis.

Mr. Lamb addressed the board and stated that the architect had met with coaches and administration to make a requested list of needs for the new gymnasium. The gym would have a 50' wide by 90' long playing court, 22' ceiling in the court area, training area, laundry, offices concession area, dressing areas-showers,

handicap facilities a maple floor, glass back boards, and would use the bleachers in the current gym. Estimated cost would be \$47.00 per square foot or \$818,000.00. This was considered a basic gym of metal outside construction. The presentation of plans for the proposed gym was made by Mr. Jim Doche.

Mr. Bob L. Davis of Southwest Securities Inc. presented the proposal of the issuing of bonds for the gym construction. A \$400,000 bond issue was proposed with 10 maturities, estimated interest rate 5%, estimated annual requirement 50,991.67. Fees to the bonding company for preparation of a bond election would be \$8,600. Filing of legal notices and applications with state and federal agencies would be approximately \$5,000.

A presentation by James Rittenberry of Page & Associates Contractors was given concerning construction management.

The company works with the architect to keep a project within budget. The company's fee is 7% of the building cost.

After hearing each presentation, the Board of Trustees was in unanimous agreement that the proposals presented were far above anticipated costs. The Board did not feel that this proposal was within the school districts budget range.

The Board requested Mr. Lamb to contact other contractors for additional proposals. Mr. Lamb will contact the architect Mr. Jim Doche and request that he submit a proposal for a gym with maximum cost of \$400,000.00.

Repair of the current gym floor was discussed, but no action was taken.

The gymnasium issue will be discussed again at the April board meeting.

Motion to adjourn by Jake Hess, second by Jay Dee Fish.

Meeting adjourned @ 9:20.

He wrecks his car, resulting in the death of his passenger, another high school student.

The students were given information about their characters and the basic situation, and then were assigned to prepare the prosecution and the defense of the student. The judge is John Dickey; defense attorneys are Jill Hefley and Monty Joiner; prosecuting attorneys are Randall Greer and Holly Jasper. Court

officers and policemen are Michelle Basham, Chris Martin, Jeremy Crutcher, Rojelio Albarado, and Mike Stone. High school students who will be witnesses in the trial are Clay Gordy, Jennifer Pennington, Andy Glass, Seth Brown, Casey Carter, Shelly Holland, Leigh Anne Flores, Jonathan Galley, and Doris Serna.

The trial will serve as the main news for a 30-minute news cast about alcohol abuse. The health students will travel to Pampa April 5 to tour Coronado Hospital Emergency Room and the Gray County Jail. During their tours they will interview the head nurse of the ER, Cathy Land, and also an official of the Sheriff's Department.

Wendi Stump is serving as the court's reporter, and Mary Basham is videotaping the proceedings. Health class instructor is Linda Haynes, and practical writing teacher is Jacque Riley.

Elementary and junior

high students are working on the slogan for the month, writing and filming commercials, and preparing posters.

According to Buckhaults, the video of the trial and the video of the newscast will be available to any club or organization in town who wishes to use it.

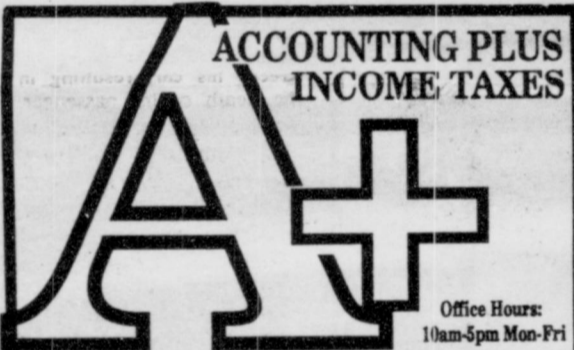
