## Groom City Council Sets Effective Rate Of .488982

In a called meeting of the Groom City Council, the Mayor called the meeting to order with the following members present: Mayor Greg Lamb, Alderman Danny Ashford, Jr., Jay Lamb, Ronny Fields, Don Case and Mary Sue Lyles.

Danny Ashford, Jr. made the motion to propose a effective tax rate of Ronny 0.488982/\$100. Fields seconded. members voted ayes.

Jay Lamb made the motion to adjourn and Mary Sue Lyles seconded. All members voted ayes.

School bells rang Friday morning, August 16, officially declaring the fall semester for students at Groom Independent School District. For 11 kindergarten students it was the beginning of a 13 year odyssey. For Pam Hutsell, Groom's kindergarten teacher for a number of years, this class will be much smaller than those of previous years. Last years class opened with 17 students, although that number had been considerably diminished by mid year.

Groom will begin the 1996-97 school year with 191 students compared to last year's 213. At least 10 of the number can be attributed to the loss of the 10 student difference between the 21 who graduated in the spring and the 11 who began in the

There also could be, as is the case of one family, a reason why some students have not started to school yet, such as an illness in the family, etc.

## School Board Sets 1997 Budget

Groom ISD Board of Trustees met in regular session last week. Present were board members Barry Fields, Tony Treadwell, Dennis Babcock, Pat Britten, Adela Kotara and Steve Anthony. Also present were Ben Ingham, Danny Chisum, Joyce Hutsell, Curtis Downs and Andy Alexander.

The Board went into executive session at 8:07 p.m. and reconvened into open session at 8:30 p.m.

Resignations were accepted from bus drivers Kent and Donna Watson.

Nadine Thornton was offered employment as a bus driver at approximately \$3,600. per year. (Salary depends on driving days, extra curricular activities, etc.)





## Texas Assessment Of Academic Skills Table

Groom ISD has once again been notified that it has achieved "Recognized" status with the Texas Education Agency where its TAAS scores are concerned. Texas Assessment of Academic Skills test students in grades 3-8 and grade 10 in areas of reading, mathematics and writing.

Students in Groom ISD scored in the 90 percentile range on all of their tests with the exception of one area of mathematics.

"Due to Groom's small enrollment figures, it could be that only one student failed to reach to 90% range in one area of a test that brought one of the math grades down to 87.1%," stated Superintendent Ben Ingham.

Results were also reported on the class of 1995's College admissions 20 of the 23 graduating seniors took the test. 8 of those students scored above the average criterion, which is 34.8%.

These results are also figured into the "Recognized" status for school accountability data. One other figure that is considered into the indicator is a schools attendance rate. Groom had a 97.8% rate for 1994-95.



### Head Coach Larry Reid **Evaluates 1996 Tigers After** "2 A Days" Come To An End

With "two-a days" behind him, Head Coach Larry Reid has a much better ideal of what he has to work with for the upcoming football season.







#### It's All Trew.....

During the 1970's, I farmed both dryland and irrigated crops in Ochiltree County. In the winter time I grazed cattle on wheat and stalks. The enterprise required several employees, especially during the summer months.

A Bracero, who had been with me for several years, tended the irrigation water, and the big en ines on the pumps. My foreman was a good mechanic and welder, and he kept everything running. My problem was getting help to drive the tractors.

The best answer seemed to be hiring older men. The work was light and I had sun shades on the equipment. I just needed someone to put in the hours plowing. Two men returned year after year, and were my mainstays, but from time to time I needed one more man.

I asked Charlie if he had any friends who might want to work. He said a new man had come in the night before and he would ask him. The next morning I

hired the new man and put him on a moldboard plow.

I carefully set the depth of the plow, counting the notches on the lever. I explained the tractor to Ed and started him off around the field. In about an hour I came to check on Ed and found his plow was not plowing deep enough. I made the adjustments and left. An hour later, the same thing happened. I later caught Ed raising the plow out of the ground.

I reprimanded Ed sharply, reset the plow, and the same thing happened again. This time I really chewed him out, loaded him up, took him to town and dumped him out.

Later when I explained to Charlie what I had done, he asked me what Ed had said or done when I chewed him out? I replied, "Ed just sat there all the time and didn't say a word. Why did you ask? He explained, "Maybe Ed has finally learned his lesson. He just got out of the pen after serving 9 years for killing his last boss."

From that moment on, I selected my employees a little more carefully.




