Carson County Law Enforcement Officers Respond To Armstrong Co. Chase

A home invasion and auto theft on the west side of the county ended when an Oklahoma man was shot during an exchange of gunfire with Armstrong and Randall County officers. Timothy Allen James, also known as Timothy Truelove, age 22, apparently abandoned his own pickup near the west county line after the vehicle became disabled. He then broke into a residence and stole the residents pickup from a locked garage. It appeared that James had not even taken the time to open the garage door when stealing the vehicle as evidence at the scene showed that he had simply driven through the door.

After leaving the area with the stolen pickup, Armstrong County officers observed the vehicle driving on a flat tire and attempted to get the pickup to pull over. James attempted to evade the pursuing officers until the stolen vehicle was totally disabled. James then used a 30-30 rifle which was in the stolen vehicle to fire shots at the officers on the scene and was eventually shot in the head by an Armstrong County deputy. James was taken to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo where he is currently being held pending state and federal charges.

James was wanted by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms in Tulsa, Oklahoma on charges stemming from his possession of an illegal weapons silencer and five counts of illegal weapons possession including possession of a machine gun.

Carson County officers securing the suspect's vehicle found a military issue rocket launcher behind the front seat of the pickup. Also found were a pair of bolt cutters and other items which could be considered as burglar tools.

Our officers are also investigating two unrelated burglaries in the Fritch area and another report of theft in the Groom area.

The number of transients along Interstate 40 appears to have increased over the previous years and our checks of these subjects have shown an alarming increase in the number of transients who have extensive criminal histories of violent crimes - male and female alike. If you choose to offer rides or meals to these folks you will have an 8 to 10 chance of having a less than pleasant experience or, at the very least, you will get to spend some time with persons possessing a high level of criminal sophistication. Don't take a chance with the odds stacked against you. If you

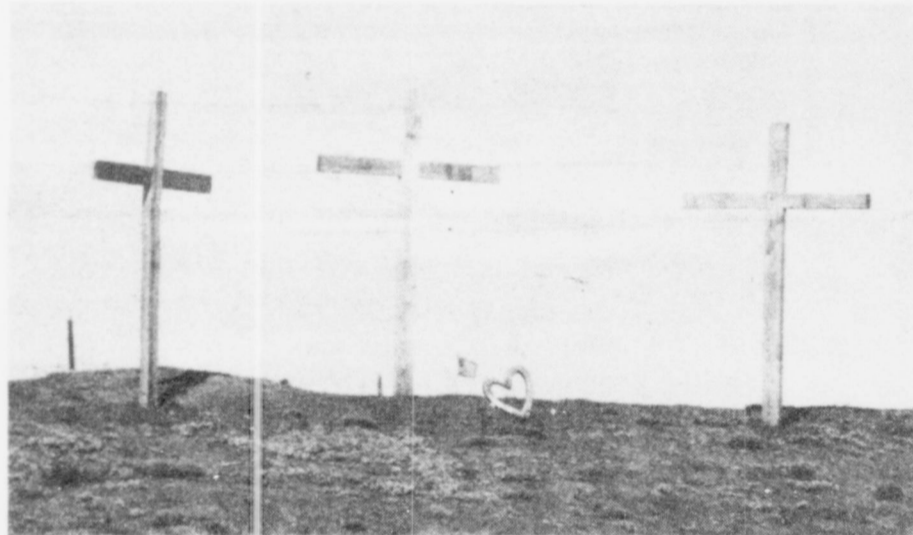
Site Of The Cross Of The Plains

Commissioners Accept Bid On Microfilming

Carson County Commissioners' Court met on June 9, 1997. All members were present. Minutes were approved read and approved.

All claims were approved as presented.

The court confirmed the closing of a county road in Precinct #4 in 1951. The road is located at Section 19, Blk. #4, and the north side of section 4, Blk 4, L. G.&N., Survey on record in Volume 10, page 40, Carson County Commissioner's court minutes.

The court opened and considered bids for the microfilming and reproduction of records in the county and district clerk's office. A requirement of the Records Management Program of the State of Texas. The court approved a bid from Government Records

Services, Inc., in the amount of \$34,345.55. An incomplete bid for the service submitted by Comgraphix was not considered.

Judge Roselius reported work which needed to be done on the courthouse roof and other areas of county maintenance. Bids will be taken for roof repair in the next few weeks.

The Court adjourned.

Commissioner's Court met on June 2, 1997 with all members present. The minutes were approved and all claims were approved.

Bobby Babcock, Groom State Bank, Beth Hodges,

Claude/Panhandle Bank, and Steve Sherill and Diana McGill, SunBank were in attendance as well as Gregg Morgan, Brown Graham and Company, Amarillo.

The court opened and

read depository bid contracts from county banks. After a short discussion concerning the bids, the court approved using all county banks as county depositories.

Gregg Morgan reviewed with the court a recent audit for Carson County, year ending September 30, 1996. The results of the audit disclosed no instances of noncompliance that are required to be reported under Government Auditing Standards.

The court discussed the possibility of the Square House Museum using the property north of the Callahan Memorial Library as a building site for storage for the museum.

The court also discussed the problem of water being over county roads in Carson County because of recent rains. Water is still over two roads at this time. Road fill will be hauled in on one road in order to help eliminate the problem in the future. The other road will remain closed until the road bed is passable. Both roads are located in the extreme southwest portion of the county.
