## Adopted Appraisal District, County Budgets Reviewed

Carson County and Carson County Appraisal District recently met and
adopted budgets for 1998 adopted budgets for 1998. The following is a brief outline of estimated expenditures. Keep in aducated guess at what each entity plans to spend. It does plans to spend. It does not have unforeseen expenses that
come up. When these come up. When these hings happen, readers will see where the governing boards will amend the budget in their monthly minutes.
The Carson County Appraisal District adopted budget of $\mathbf{3} 241,365$ for 1998. Included in the budget are $\$ 125,515$ in salaries, car allowance, insurance and other benefits. Other expenses such as building maintenance, legal services, collection costs, and utilities make up the bulk of the rest. The only other large expenses are $\$ 31,100$ for valuation engineers and 24,090 for Data Processing
The County Budget is very complex. There are many different categories. Below is a brief summary of what is in each one including the salary of elected officials.

Under the General Fund heading:
COMMISSIONERS COURT -Budgeted $\$ 101,775.00$ includes monies for tax appraisal district, Conference \& Education Museum attendant salary, Mealth Insurance, salary, Health Insurance, plus Judge's car allowance of $\$ 4,800$. other benefit costs, advertising, and other miscellaneous expenses. COUNTY AUDITOR Budgeted $44,510.00$ includes county auditor salary of $\$ 29,848$. plus $\$ 200$ mileage, computer related costs, office supplies plus health and retirement benefits, phone and postage.

budgeted $\$ 16,000.00$ includes only those expenses involved in preserving records.

GENERAL ELECTIONSBudgeted $\$ 7,526$ includes salaries for judges and clerks, ballot printing, and supplies.

JUDICIAL AND LAW Budgeted $\$ 262,250$ including a salary of $\$ 21,539$ for Justice of the Peace \#1; \$21,539 for

Justice of the Peace \#2 and $\$ 17,653$ for Justice of the Peace \#4. Also includes court costs paid includes court costs paid time help for JP's $\# 1$ part ime help for JP's \#1 \& $\$ 2$, health and retirement benefits, office expenses and other related expenses.
