

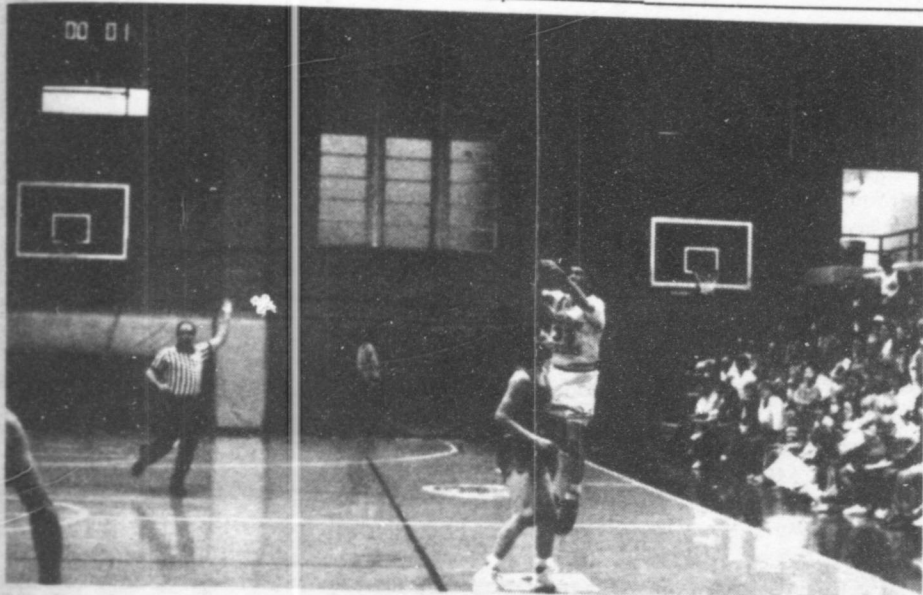

## Voters Have Choice In Justice Of Peace, Sheriff's Race In Tuesday's Demo Primary

Voters will go to the polls in next weeks Super Tuesday elections. Much has already been said about the national candidates for President. It is up to the voters now to decide who is the best man for the job.

Locally, Groom residents have two major decisions to decide. The Sheriff and Justice of the Peace are the two positions in which voters will have a choice. In the other positions incumbents have no opposition.

The Sheriff's election features Terry Timmons (incumbent) and Rick Morris. Timmons is currently serving as Sheriff of Carson County. He holds an advanced certificate in Law Enforcement and has attended many seminars on investigation and management practices.

Rick Morris has lived in the area for three years and has 15 years of law

enforcement experience, 800 hours of classroom training and holds an intermediate state certificate.

Another race that will interest area voters is the Justice of the Peace race. Bill Hinson and Jesse Baker are the candidates seeking this office.

Jesse Baker is the former superintendent of the Grandview-Hopkins Independent School District. He is a graduate of Texas Tech and has a B.S. in Education, Master of Education and Administrative Certificate.

He has 30 years experience in public administration.

Bill Hinson is the current appointee after longtime Justice of the Peace, Max Wade's retirement in January. Hinson has a BBA Degree in Accounting and 30 years business experience.

Mike Britten, county commissioner, precinct No. 1, is running unopposed, as is Roselyn Watson, Ed Hinshaw, David McCoy and John T. Forbis.

Good luck as you try to decide for the state and national positions.

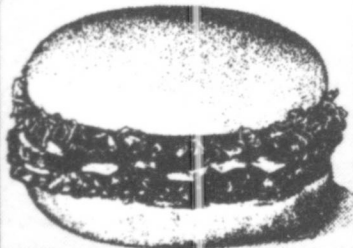

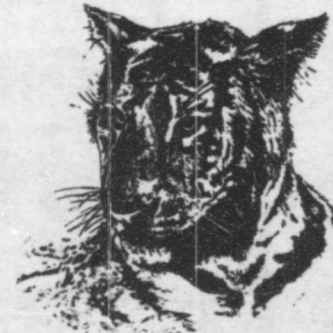

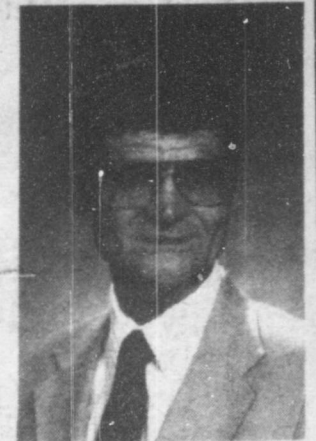

**POLLING PLACES**

Voting places have been renamed to correspond with the Commissioners' Precincts; that is, residents of Commissioner Precinct 1 will vote at locations whose numbers begin with "1", etc.

People voting in the Republican Primary will have a central location in Panhandle. The War Memorial Building will be the location for Precinct 103, 201, 202 and 301 voters. Election officials will be prepared to give the proper ballots to each voter.

The important thing to remember is to take your voter registration card with you on Election Day.

Panhandle residents voting in the Democratic Primary will have three voting places. Those in 103, the newly created portion of Precinct 1, will vote at the County Ag Building. Precinct 201 voters will vote at the Library on Main Street, and Precinct 301 voters will vote at the High School.

There are also new voting

places in White Deer. Republicans in 102, the newly-created portion of Precinct 1 in White Deer, will vote at the Elementary School as will voters in 401. Again, officials will be prepared to be sure voters receive the proper ballots.

Democrats, on the other hand, will have two voting locations in White Deer. Those in 102 will vote at the Elementary School and those in 401 will vote at the High School Gym.

Other voting locations have not been changed. In Groom, Republicans will

vote at the Community Center and Democrats at St. Mary's Parish Hall. In Skellytown, Republicans will vote at City Hall and Democrats at the School. In Fritch, Republicans will vote at the Dugan home on Santa Fe Trail and Democrats at the Jones home on Pawnee Road. In the Liberty Community (202), Democrats will vote at the Labus home as in the past.

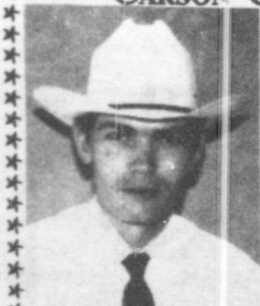

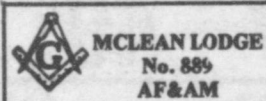
