Howard "Hop" Britten was appointed to the City Council last week. Britten fills the vacancy left by Greg Lamb when he was elected to the Mayoral seat. The split decision netted Britten three votes from Bill Homer, Jerry Thornton and Ronny Fields. Mary Sue Lyles, who ran in the last election and lost only by a narrow margin gained votes from Greg Lamb and R. E. Cornett.

In a motion by R.E. Cornett, the council voted to add a \$2.00 fee to all sewer connections. The fee



is designated to go into the capital outlay fund.

Stephanie Friemel was later hired in the meeting at state base salary at step 3, Experience 3 plus \$700.00 increment for a bachelor's degree.

A public hearing was held concerning the Academic Excellence Indicator System Report. The board accepted the results. This

information is open to the public and an in-depth look at these results will be published at a later time.

TAAS Text Scores were presented and accepted for grades 4, 8, and 10.

The Site Based Decision Making Committee will now be the recommendation making body to the school board concerning the Student Dress Code. The group will receive recommendations from various school and community groups, particularly the student council. Members of the site-based committee are Susan Burgin, Pam Hutsell, Marcia Davis, Debbie Addy, Steve Hutsell, Georgann Hinson, Belinda Britten, Mike Britten, Helen Witt, and R.E. Cornett. The committee will make recommendations to the school board.

The board voted to leave the career ladder Level II and III assignments, as constituted currently,

increasing the stipends to each staff member to expand the entry portion of the state foundation

program. Paying currently at Level II are Debra Addy, Susan Burgin, Charles Burk, Annetta Childress, Marcia Davis, Shirley Fields, Georgann Hinson, Steve Hutsell, and Leatrice Reck. Level III participant is Pamela Hutsell.

Leslie Crowell, now spanish teacher and librarian was reassigned to teach one daily period of English. She will receive an additional \$1,553.61 for the class per year.

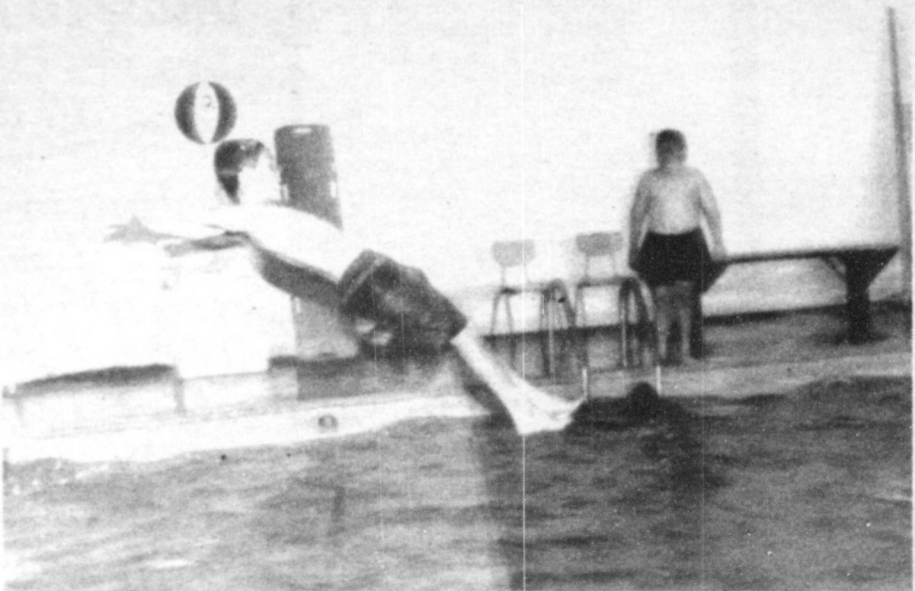
Yuvonne York was hired as school nurse at a yearly salary of \$1,800.00.

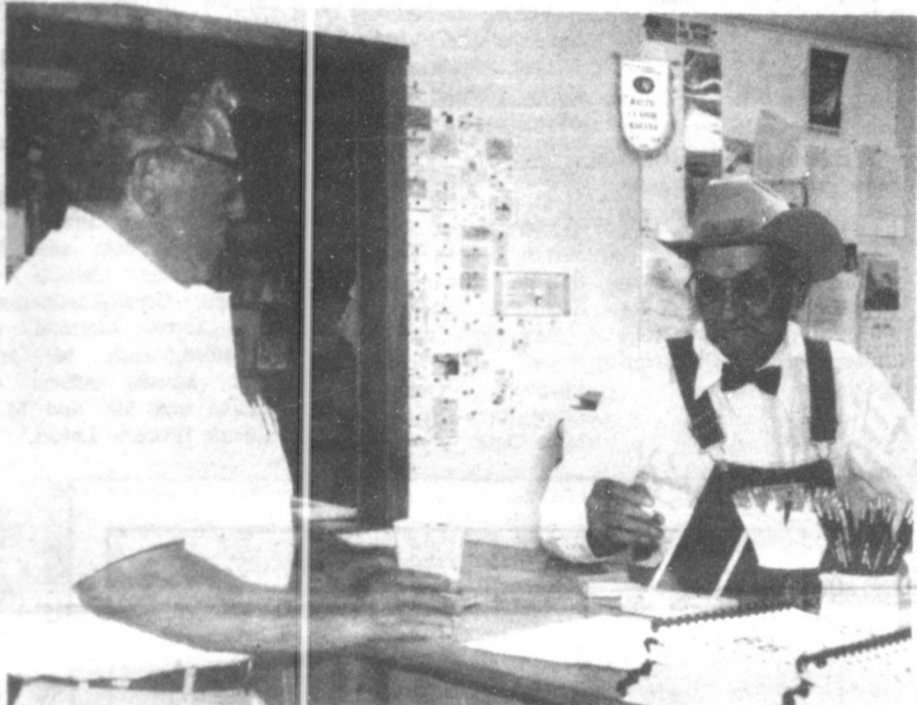

Motion by Harold Smith, second by Wayne Bybee, to hire Darlis Joiner as Librarian, at \$4.25 per hour, while Martha Parker is recovering from surgery.

Motion by Sid Lands, second by Wayne Bybee, to purchase cellular phone for gas system 24 hour number.

Applications for Executive director of the Housing Authority, from Amber Kinston Kirkland, Charles R. Ferguson and Mary Basham, were reviewed. Motion by Mary Dwyer, second by Harold Smith, to hire Mary Basham as E.D. The Council requested a monthly financial statement and that the ED attend council meetings each month. Council will review job performance after three months.

Motion by Harold Smith, second by Andy Eck, to pay current bills.

Motion by Harold Smith, second by Sid Lands to adjourn meeting at 8:30 p.m.

Remembered

Letter To The Editor.

The world lost a friend with the death of Chuck Hill last week. To me, he personified what the word "Teacher" means. How I wish I could be one! He walked in the doors of McLean High School each morning with one purpose in mind - teaching kids. And teach them he did. I don't know how much the kids got from his teaching out of the textbooks, but I know they got more than they know from his example. He set about his tasks with the single-minded purpose of teaching kids, and he didn't let much distract him. He talked, he laughed, he bullied and he taught. He never showed any signs of the bad side of

life, not for long anyway. He had a physical handicap, but that didn't keep him from his job of teaching kids. He was very rarely absent even if he did not feel well. He was never backbiting, bitter or angry with kids. He was mad sometimes, mischievous sometimes, but never bad. He gave the kids and the rest of us leadership through his teaching with his happy manner and his quiet ways. Sometimes at the time we didn't even know that he was teaching or leading us, but he was. He was not an outstanding person physically, but mentally and morally he was at the top of the ladder. He believed in God, Family, Love and Kids, in that order. He was not greedy and never wanted money except for the salary that was due him personally, and money for the small schools

of Texas to stay open. He loved to travel and see the places he taught about, but he only did that when he could. His world was small, really. Mainly just Hedley, Clarendon, Memphis and McLean. He had his day to day problems in the teaching profession, but he never let them bother him long. The kids and the rest of us learned from him the traits of respect, goodness, and morality. He will be missed by all of us. I thank God that I had the privilege of knowing Chuck Hill. His successor has some big shoes to fill.

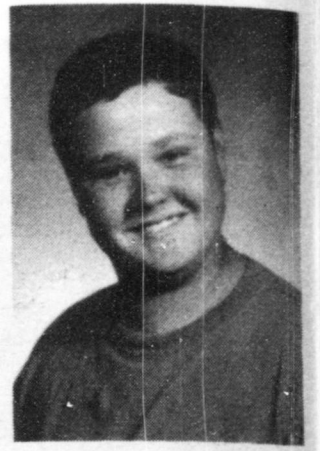
and Treasurer.
