Wealth Equalization Election Approaching

......McLean I.S.D. In Voters Hands



The crowd at the school cafeterio listened intently as Mr. Hannon explained the election and the options that will be presented to the voters.

A small number of tax payers along with principals and board members gathered at the school cafeteria on Monday night to listen to Superintendent, Jimmy Hannon explain the wealth equalization election that will take place on October 11.

Mr. Hannon explained that McLean Independent School district has become a Chapter 41 school. "McLean will be a Chapter 41 District this year because the property value

for the tax year 2004, as cert fied by the State Comptroller's office and divided by the projected 2005-2006 Weighted Average Daily attendance, exceeds the \$305,000 equilization wealth level."

Nr. Hannon then went on to explain the five available options that the district could choose to reduce it's wealth per resident student. He explained option one, which is to consolidate with another district. Option two was to detach

school property to another district. Option three is to purchase credits from the state. Option four is to contract to educate nonresident students, or option five which is to consolidate tax bases with another district.

"The board has opted to go with option three, but needs approval for both options three and four for the future," stated Hannon. "Now the voters will See Election, pg. 8

Follett came looking for revenge on the Tigers this year after a tough loss last season to the Tigers on their own turf and a loss last week to the Samnorwood Eagles


The Tigers struggled in the first half with the Panthers leading 44 - 14.

The McLean Cubs took on the Follett Panthers last Thursday night in


The Cubs fought a hard battle, but suffered a loss in the end to the Panther with a score of 48 - 20.





Investigators Are Working Leads But Keeping Quiet To Secure The Cases Integrity

A lonesome wind ripples the out-of-place crisse scene tape in front of the farm house that should be waking up to start a new day. Instead the world is a sadder place because death has visited the high plains.

Early in the morning hours of Friday, September 31, someone broke into the Conrad home, 13 miles south of Pampa and took the lives of Brian Conrad 31, Michell Conrad 35, Zach

Doan, 14 and Michell and Brian's unborn child.

Actording to investigators there are no suspect at this time. No motive is apparent, either. According to friends, the Conrad s were very well liked and were looking forward to the birth of

their child. Zach was attending school in Pampa and was a freshman. Brian was a very upbest person. When the weather was not co-operating with his farming ventures, he did not sit around and

complain.

"They were just too nice of people to have something like this happen to them." said a

family friend, "they didn't have any enemies."

Investigators are keeping their cards close to their vest on this one. At this time nothing has been reported missing, and no suspects have been identified, but some are being carefully scrutinized. Investigators did say that they did not believe that this was a



A lonesome wind ripples the out-of-place crime scene tape in front of the farm house that should be waking up to start a new day. Instead the world is a sadder place because death has visited the high plains.

Early in the morning hours of Friday, September 31, someone broke into the Conrad home, 13 miles south of Para a and took the lives of Brian Conrad 31, Mich ell Conrad 35, Zach Don 1, 14 and Michell and Brian's unborn child.

According to inve tigators there are no suspects at this time. No motive is apparent, either. According to friends, the Com ad's were very well liked and were looking forward to the birth of

their child. Zach was attending school in Pampa and was a freshman. Brian was a very upbeat person. When the weather was not cooperating with his farming ventures, he did not sit around and complain.

Investigators are keeping their cards close to their vest on this one. At this time nothing has been reported missing, and no suspects have been identified, but some are being carefully scrutinized. Investigators did say that they did not believe that this was a

of 140 clock hours of classroom, laboratory clinical on field instruction which shall include supervised experience in the emergency department and on the ambulance.


Now Groom must depend on White Deer, Claude and the surrounding area to assist people in need of care.
