Over the years, these people are either no longer here, gone during the day or are just not capable of getting off their daily duties to work the critical and very valuable service for the people in Groom or anybody in need that is passing through.
Currently the Groom
Ambulance Service is
made vp of six volunteers incluling, EBT, (Emergency Basic Technicians) of Sharon and Rick Prather, Dusty Babcock, and Lance Ollinger; EMT (Emergency Medical Techncians) Kerry Jenkins, Doug Kling, and Paramedic Charlotte Whatley. Inactive members are Daniel Treadwell, Dewayne Gray and Todi Gray.

Classes are needed to increase the ambulance service and one is hoped to be organized for November, on Monday and Tu sday nights in Claude. The EMT Class will include a minimum
of 140 clock hours of classroom, laboratory clinical on field instruction which shall include supervised experience in the emergency department and on the ambulance.
Now Groom must depend on White Deer, Claude and the surrounding area to assist people in need of care.

The job is an interesting and life fulfilling job helping others in a time of critical need. So the people of Groom are asking to please consider the responsibility and join the other follks in the class.
