## Good Shape For Drinking

Groom residents recently received a quality assurance report ahout their city water system. The report is an annual notice that informs residents if any kind of contaminates have been found in their drinking water. The analysis was made be using the data from the most recently U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) required tests.
Groom's water comes from wells that tap into the Ogallala Aquifer When drinking water meets federal standards there may not be any health based benefits to purchasing bottled water or point of use devices.
Drinking water, including bottled water may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water posed a health risk. More information about contaminants effects can be obtained by calling the Environnmental

Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).
Of the listed contaminates, none came above the listed acceptable levels. Arsenic, barium, chromium, fluoride, nitrate, selenium, and copper are almost always found in water. They are not dangerous as long as they are monitored and levels do not rise over what the EPA considers safe levels. In Groom's water all fell well below this maximum contaminate level.
Coliform bacteria were also measured. Coliforms are microbial contamination. They are found in the digestive tract of warm blooded animal. While not disease Wroducers disease producers themselves, they often are found in association with other microbes that are capable of causing disease. Coliform bacteria are more hardy than many disease-causing organisms; therefore their absence from water is a See Water, pg. 2
