Keeping cool in the Texas heat

The temperature in Texas is rising, and with high temps comes heat-related illness and even death. The best defense against heat-related illness is prevention.

Heat precautions include:

- Never leave anyone, including pets, in a closed, parked vehicle.
- Drink plenty of fluids, but avoid drinks with alcohol, caffeine or a lot of sugar. Start drinking fluids before going out into the heat.
- Take frequent breaks when working outside.
- If you do not have air conditioning at home, go to a mall or other public place with air conditioning.
- Check frequently on people who are elderly, ill or shut in.
- Check with a doctor about the effects of the sun and heat exposure when taking certain prescription drugs, especially diuretics or antihistamines.
- At first signs of heat illness-dizziness, nausea, headaches, muscle cramps-move to a cooler place, rest a few minutes, then slowly drink a cool beverage. Seek medical attention immediately if conditions do not improve.

Legal Form Expresses Wishes About Guardianship

"People worry a lot as they age," says Sam Polk, an attorney for the Legal Hotline for Older Texans. "What will happen to them and their rossessions?" And they possessions? And they worry especially if there's a greedy relative in the picture.

Fortunately, those who confide such fears to Polk soon hear about a form called "Declaration Guardian Before Need Arises." This form "lets you disqualify people you don't trust and keep them from making decisions. about you, your property, your health care. It also lets you name the people you do want to put in charge in case the need ever arises," Polk says. "People breathe a easier after they sign this form and send back to us."

Only recently, Polk points out, he helped thwart the guardianship efforts that a caller's son making. woman called the hotline," Polk remembers, saying that she'd been in ospital for six weeks medical with no complaint that warranted hospitalization. She was 87, Polk says, "really sharp and mentally fit. "Meanwhile, her son

was seeking guardianship. The woman told me he

wanted to force her into a nursing home and sell Another house. relative of hers also told me the son seemed to be more interested in mom's money than her welfare.

"I told her that legally she was free to leave the hospital and I sent her one of the Legal Hotline Older Texans publications. It form. She shared it with an attorney the court had appointed to represent her. The attorney prepared the Designation of Guardian before Need Arises form, and the woman signed it and the son backed off.
