Farmers who participate in the 10 -year commitment receive annual rental payments. In addition, the U.S. Department of Agriculture picks up half the cost of establishing a permanent conservation cover.
Only highly erodible cropand is eligiole. The highly erodible designation is based on land capability class, soil loss tolerance and the erodibility index, explains the soils specialist.
The land also must have produced an agricultural commodity during any two years from 1981-1985.
"In Texas the maximum, or cutoff, bids have ranged from $\$ 35-55$ an acre, depending on geographic location in the state," says Harris. "Cut-off bids in Texas' seven bid 'pools' have not changed since earlier signups.
