a member of the McLean Volunteer Fire Department may simultaneously serve as a member of the McLean City Council; and WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of McLean adopts this resolution to clarify certain issues regarding the McLean Volunteer Fire Department; and WHEREAS, the McLean Volunteer Fire Department is an independent organization which is not under the control of the City of McLean; and WHEREAS, the City of McLean owns all of the vehicles and building used by the McLean Volunteer Fire Department; and WHEREAS, the City of McLean pays certain expenses associated with the McLean Volunteer Fire Department, including insurance on the building, vehicles, and equipment, volunteer fireman insurance, utility bills, operating expenses, training expenses, stipend to the fire chief, nominal sums to volunteer Fire Department members, and contribution to the local Fireman's Relief and Retirement Fund; and WHEREAS, the McLean Volunteer Fire Department will occasionally seek approval from the McLean City, Council regarding vehicles, equipment, building, repairs, maintenance or expenses; and WHEREAS, the City of McLean does not control the McLean Volunteer Fire Department, or does it assign duties to the fire chief or members of the McLean Volunteer Fire Department; THEREFOREIT IS RESOLVED by the City Council

Volunteer Fire Department; THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of McLean as follows: THAT the McLean Volunteer Fire Department is an

THAT the McLean Volunteer Fire Department is an independent entity; THAT the McLean Volunteer Fire Department is not under the control of the City of McLean; THAT a member of the McLean Volunteer Fire Department may simultaneously serve as a member of the McLean City Council; THAT in order to avoid even the appearance of impropriety, a member of the McLean Volunteer Fire Department who is a member of the McLean City Council should refrain from voting on issues involving the McLean Volunteer Fire Department. Elderly Homeowners Can Defer **County Property Taxes**

Texans age 65 or older delinquent and current property taxes on their homes. They may take advantage of a tax option called "over 65 deferral" by signing an affidavit at

by signing an arridavit at the Carson County Appraisal District. This special form of tax relief also halts a lawsuit filed to collect delinquent property taxes on an older Texan's on an older Texan's home, according to Donita Davis, chief appraiser of the Carson County Appraisal District. "To stop a delinquent tax suit", Davis said, "the over 65 homeowner files the deferral affidavit with the court in which the

the court in which the suit is pending."

homeowner Once a files an over-65 tax deferral affidavit with the appraisal district, no taxing unity can start or continue a lawsuit for delinquent taxes as long as that person owns and

lives in that home. Davis stressed that the tax deferral for elderly only postpones paying quent taxes on the delinquent home, it does not cancel them. During the deferral time, taxes and interest of 8 percent per year continue to add up. She said, "When the elderly elderly taxpayer no longer owns and lives in the home, the taxes become due. If the taxes are not paid, taxing units can then sue to collect all the deferred taxes and interest.

There is no penalty on the the delinquent taxes during the deferral time. However, filing the deferral affidavit will not forgive penalties that were already due. Also if the taxes remain delinquent more than 90 days after the deferral ends, a taxing unit may charge an added penalty if the account goes to a delinquent tax attorney. Tax deferral forms are available at the appraisal district office.

"The homeowner should fill out the form and have the signature witnessed by a notary public," Davis said. For information. more taxpayers may contact the Carson County Appraisal District, at 102 S. Main District, at 102 S. Main or call 806-537-3569
