Linda McDonald also brought up the fact that if five members of the Fire Department are elected and all are abstain from voting five Fire Department ing on no bills for thent issues, no bills for the Fire Department could be paid. ## Elderly Homeowners Can Defer County Property Taxes

Texans age 65 or older may postpone paying delinquent and current property taxes on their homes. They may take advantage of a tax option called "over 65 deferral" by signing an affidavit at the Carson County Appraisal District. This special form of tax relief also halts a lawsuit filed to collect delinquent property taxes on an older Texan's home, according to appraiser of the Carson County Appraisal District. "To stop a delinquent tax suit", Davis said, "the over 65 homeowner files the deferral affidavit with the court in which the suit is pending.

Once a homeowner deferral affidavit with the appraisal district, appraisal district, no taxing unity can start or continue a lawsuit for
delinquent delinquent taxes as long as that person owns and
lives in that home. Davis stressed that the tax deferral for elderly only postpones paying delinquent taxes on the home, it does not cancel them. During the deferral time, taxes and interest of 8 percent per interest of 8 percent per year continue to add up. elderly said, "When the elderly taxpayer no longer owns and lives in the home, the taxes become due. If the taxes are not paid, taxing units can then sue to collect all the deferred taxes and interest."

There is no penalty on the delinquent taxes during the deferral time. However, filing the deferral affidavit will not forgive penalties that were already due. Also if the taxes remain delinquent more than 90 days after the deferral ends, a taxing unit may charge an added penalty if the account goes to a
