Local Candidates Seek Election

McLean voters will have a wide variety of candidates to choose from come election day on May 4th.

The only uncontested race is for Mayor. Sam Haynes is currently the only candidate. Living in McLean with wife Linda and daughter Dollie. Civic minded Haynes belongs to the Methodist Church, the Lions Club, Hiway 66 Association and the Hillcrest Cemetery Association. He also serves on the Gray County Tax Appraisal Board.

Mr. Haynes said "I hope to continue to make efforts to make McLean a better place to live and to make it as attractive as possible to potential citizens as well as to attract tourism to our city."

Running for the office of Alderman are Joe Billingsley, Ann Pierce and Jessie Nell Allen.

Seeking his second term on the city council, Joe Billingsley would like to see continuity in the city government. "I hope to see some of the projects through that we have started and continue to try and interest new business to McLean."

Thacker Haynes, incumbent, has five years experience as the MISD school board. He belongs with wife Sharon and son J. T. to the First United Methodist Church where he is a lay leader. He is a member of the Lions Club, the McLean Fire Dept. and president of the McLean Athletic Boosters. Mr. Haynes is a graduate of McLean High School and received a BBA from Texas Tech University.

When asked what he hoped to accomplish if elected he stated, "...continue the efforts of the current board administration and faculty to improve the quality of education for all students in McLean."

Leland Myers, a life long resident of McLean, is a member of the Assembly of God Church and a trustee, along with wife, Wanda, and daughters Sarah, 8 and Jennifer, 4. He attended college at WTSU and SAGC.

If elected he hopes to "...see that control of the

school system is left local rather than state run. I desire for our children to receive a good balanced education.

Another life long resident of McLean Mr. Billingsley, was in business in McLean for 15 years. His wife is Myrtle Billingsley and has two daughters Susan Brannon and Cherri Byer and two grandsons.

Ann Pierce is currently secretary of the Old Route 66 Association and a member of Peddlers Pack 66. Family members include husband Clarence, daughter Robbie Sandersen of McLean, son Allen Turpen of Hobbs, stepson Chuck Pierce of McLean and stepdaughter Tammy Boykin of Hutting, Ark.

If elected she hopes to "...help keep down the rising cost such as utilities etc., promote McLean whenever and wherever possible, encourage and seek new business for the city. Lights for I-40 and billboards, I consider priorities. Tourism could be a lifeline for us. I feel the days ahead will be critical for our school and our city and I want to do whatever I can to help."

Jessie Nell Allen also running for city council, also feel that promotion of McLean should be a top priority.

"I hope to do what I can to help put McLean on the map with the promotion of Route 66 and the Museums. I think we should look at every chance to promote businesses in the area small and large. I believe if we continue to work together, as many did in preparation for the Devil's Rope Museum Open House, McLean will be a place that we will be proud to call home. Jessie and husband Jesse have two children and three grandchildren.

June Suggs and son Randy are long time McLean residents. She has served as Treasurer for the McLean Country Club for 18 years. If elected she hopes to continue the project to clean up the city so that McLean will be a place proud to have visitors.

"The Museum and the Route 66 Association have involved many, many hours

of work and planning to put McLean on the map and we need a clean and neat town for visitors to see. I would like to see the expenditures of the city held down as much as possible. We have an ideal location and work needs to be done to draw interest to our city for new business that will help us get back what was lost when the highway went around the city."

Casper Smith has served on the city council for three years. He is a member of the McLean Lions Club and Tiger Boosters. Jean Smith is his wife. When asked what his plans would be if elected he stated, "Be a good councilman and continue work for progress of McLean."

The McLean School Board election looks very exciting with candidates to choose from.

James Hefley and wife Charolette have four daughters, Holly, Jill, Lori and Nikki. Some of his civic endeavors are 4-H leader, Gray Co. Extension Agent Committee, ASCS Community Committee, Gray County Extension result demonstrator and the Texas Auctioneers Association. Mr. Hefley, small business owner, has served 8 years on the McLean School Board including one year as president.

"If elected I hope to maintain quality education in McLean. With school finance so unsettled, we will need levelheaded leaders for the next few years," he stated.

Joe Ray Riley intends to run. Mr. Riley is a 1974 graduate of McLean High. He graduated from WTSU

in '74 and is currently working toward his masters in counseling. Mr. Riley is a certified teacher as well as a certified probation officer for the Texas Dept. of Criminal Justice. He and his wife Jacque and daughter Randi Jo are members of the First Baptist Church. Mr. Riley is a member of the McLean Volunteer Fire Dept. and a member of the McLean Lions Club.

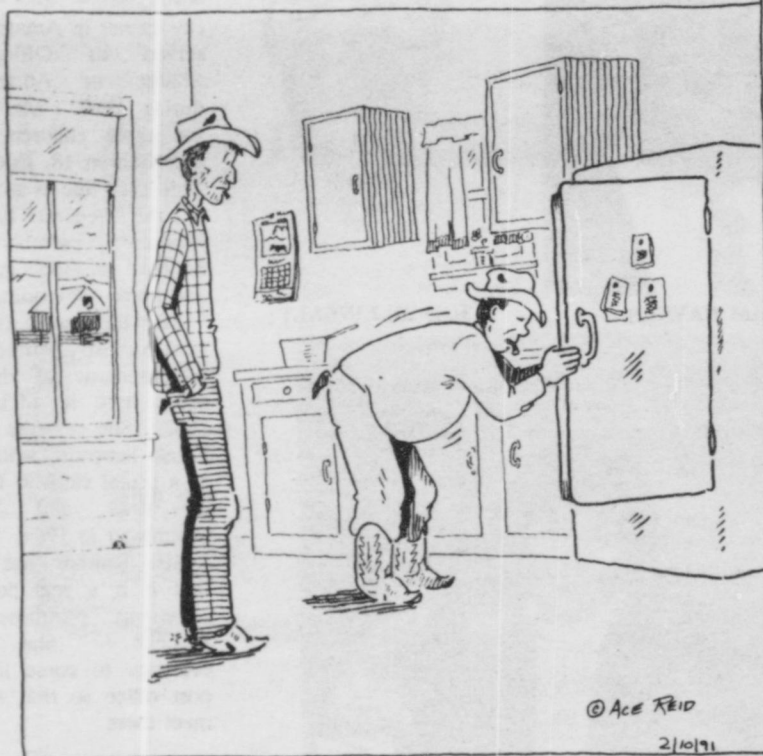

Public Notice

Southwestern Bell Telephone Company has filed two separate applications with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to introduce two new optional directory services. One service is Directory Assistance Call Completion (DACC) and the other service is Multiple List Directory Assistance (MLDA).

DACC is an optional service that provides customers the option of having their Directory Assistance call completed to the requested number (when they call Directory Assistance for a number) by either the Directory Assistance operator or a mechanized audio response system.

The proposed rates* for fully-automated DACC calls are: \$.30 if the call is sent paid or billed to a calling card, \$1.00 if the call is collect or billed to a third number and \$.25 from a coin telephone.

The proposed rates* for semi-automated (operator assisted) DACC calls are: \$.85 for calls that are sent paid or billed to a calling card, \$1.20 if the call is collect or billed to a third number and \$2.60 for a person-to-person call.

Multiple List Directory Assistance (MLDA) allows the customer to request more than two listing requests per call to Directory Assistance. Customers can either call on "demand" and receive up to 10 listings, or schedule an "appointment" and receive the assistance of a Directory Assistance operator for as long as required. The rates for "demand" MLDA are \$.30 per listing request (after applicable allowances), with a maximum of 10 listing requests per call. The rates for "appointment" MLDA are \$1.00 per minute, with a 15-minute minimum.

The optional services DACC and MLDA are intended for use by both residence and business customers. Those persons who qualify for exemption of Directory Assistance charges because of visual or physical handicaps will be able to use DACC and "demand" MLDA free of charge. If approved by the commission, DACC and MLDA will be available beginning May 13, 1991. First-year projected revenues for DACC are approximately \$9.6 million. First-year projected revenues for MLDA are approximately \$1.7 million.

The City of McLean has been notified by the Texas Department of Health that the water being supplied by our system exceed the following maximum constituent level for Nitrate specified by the Department "Drinking Water Standards" which were promulgated as required by the "Safe Drinking Water Act," Public Law 93-523(U.S.). The limit is set at 10 milligrams of Nitrate (as Nitrogen) per liter of water. The amount of Nitrate (as Nitrogen) in the water to be 11.73 milligrams per liter.

Adults and children over the age of 6 months need not be concerned about drinking water from the tap.

Public Notice

An excess Nitrate intake by an infant under the age of 6 months may reduce its available oxygen supply and possibly produce "blue baby" symptoms. Parents are advised to find other

sources of drinking water, such as bottled water, for their infants under 6 months of age. All doctors and hospitals in the area have been notified of this situation. The city will offer

to provide bottled water of acceptable quality to pregnant women and to infants under 6 months of age for cooking and drinking purposes.

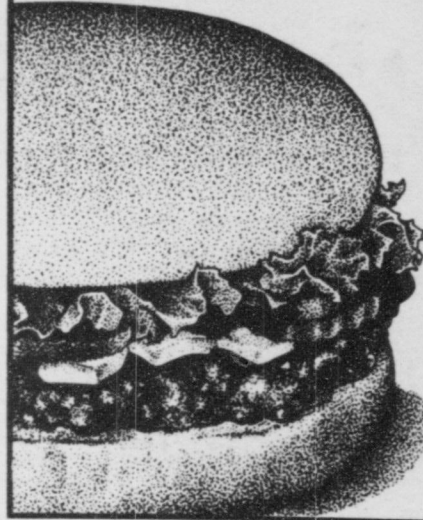

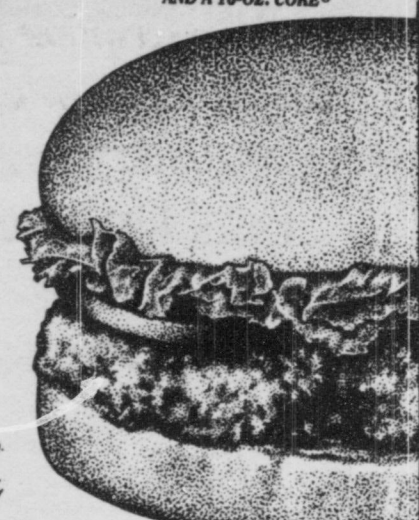

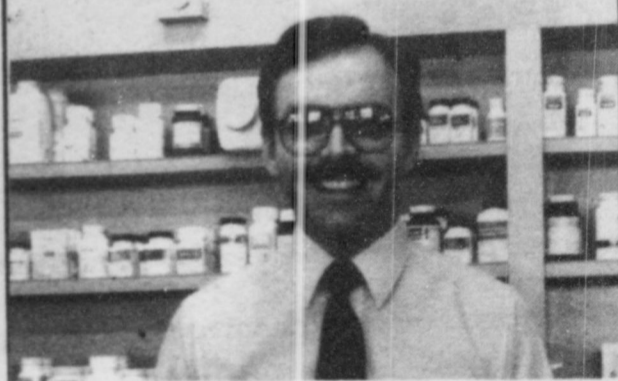
