The last significant moisture was received in September when the area got about two and one got about inches of moisture. In October 35 was In October. 35 was received. November was completely dry December, January and so far in February has only seen a trace of moisture in a few very

## dry snow flurries.

 If that was not enough of a problem for area farmers, greenbugs have invaded the Pampa area. Some farmers are choosing to graze their wheat down rather than add the cost of spraying again to the cost of a crop that may not produce.Knowledgeable sources commented that winter wheat can be safely grazed until March and still produce if conditions are right.
