## County Sheriff's Report

The major focis of the Sheriff's Department during the past week has been dealing with the many
storm-related arsignments and emergencies which occurred.

Sheriff's deputics assisted the Texas Highway Patrol at the scene of aumerous traffic accidents and provided traffic direction where semi-tractors had jackknifed on the interstate.
Deputies transported stranded motorists to shelter and assisted area farmers and ranchers in searching for and securing strayed cattle. The sheriff's department, Texas Highway Patrol, Panhandle EMS and Pantex EMS responded to a report of a woman who had been bit in the face by a dog. The call cane during the most severe pert of the blizzard and the injured party was transported from her home by four-wheel drive vehicle to the awaiting ambulance for transport to Amarillo.
The Carson County Sheriffs Department worked with area law enforcement agencies in cocrdinating missing person reports and keeping family merabers of stranded persons nformed of their location.
The sheriffs de dartment
was cance ion two joceations Wheif: in lestaurat pocasions Interstate 40 attenipted to evict nearly fifty persons from the building so the restaurant could be closed. With the assistance of the County Judge, the restaurant owne was
advised of the legal consequences of not complying with the current state of emergency and the necessity to protect stranded motorists from the blizzard conditions.
In another case, the Carson County Sheriff and deputies met with an Interstate 40 motel owner when attempts were made to raise the motel rates for persons who were stranded at the motel. The Carson County Attorney assisted our department in explaining the laws regarding such activities to the motel owner.

The sheriff's department is continuing to work with the South Carolina Bureau of Investigation and a South Carolina Sheriff's Department in an investigation dealing with the disappearance of a South Carolina man. Foul play is suspected in his disappearance.
A subject wanted for Forgery in Carson County has been located and arrested in Broken Bow, Nebraska. The subject has waived extradition and will be brought back to Panhandle to face trial on the charges.

The Ogden county unit system would address these two issues by creating 254 county units. These units could levy a tax up to $\$ 1$ that would be applied to all of the property within the county and used for education. The proceeds of the tax would be used only within the county.
