Veterans Speak To McLean School To Celebrate Texas Public School Week

Mr. and Mrs. Price, parents of Mrs. Cynthia Hauck, who lives in Odessa, were here on a visit. They were both in the service in World War II. 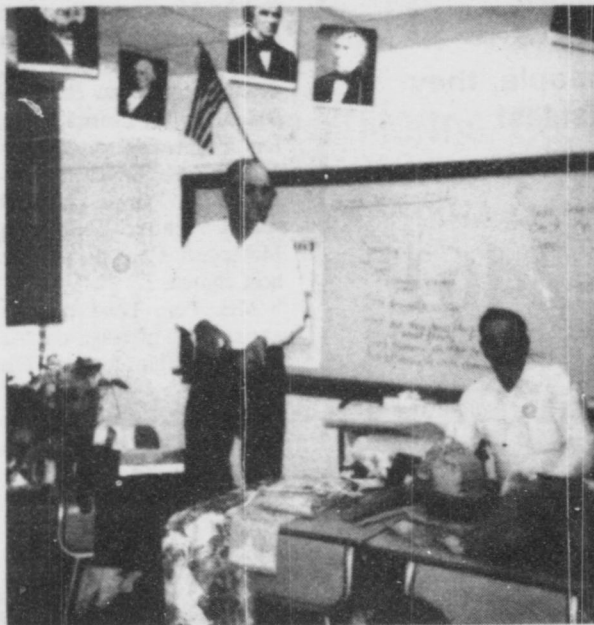
On Tuesday morning the High School started their day of activities by a flag raising ceremony which will be covered in next week's paper.

Grand Opening Of National Museum Slated For March 23

Grand opening of the Devil's Rope Museum - Texas Old Route 66 Exhibit, featuring "one-of-a-kind exhibits," is set for March 23.

Established entirely with donated funds and labor, grand opening of the museum complex is the culmination of a 1-1/2 year effort to establish a national barbed wire museum and to provide the Texas Old Route 66 Association with space for exhibits.

Devil's Rope Museum Complex is housed in a formerly abandoned 14,000-square-foot factory building at 100 Kingsley St. and Old Route 66.

The grand opening marks completion of the initial renovation phase, according to organizers. The first phase included remodeling the interior of the building to fit museum needs.

The second phase, which begins with the grand opening ceremony, consists of an all-out effort to advertise, educate and distribute materials and information concerning the museum complex. Museum volunteers will be recruited and trained and an "Education Week" program involving area schools is expected to be implemented.

The third phase is expected to include installation of a wire identification display, professional organization of a reference library and addition and continual upgrading of artifacts as they become available.

Devil's Rope Museum, a state-chartered non-profit corporation, was established to bring together in one location barbed wire collections as well as better recognize the history of barbed wire.

Joseph Farwell Glidden, of DeKalb, Ill., is credited with inventing barbed wire in 1873, according to museum officials.

Old Route 66 Association of Texas was established by a group of McLean area residents when it was discovered Texas did not have an official organization aimed at promoting and preserving the historic highway.

The association plans to publish a quarterly newsletter for members and

act as liaison between the other eight states with official Route 66 associations.

Memorabilia of Old 66, a hall of fame program and a Texas 66 historical marker program are expected to be featured in the Texas Old Route 66 Exhibit housed in the museum complex.

According to Delbert Trew, museum agent and curator, celebrities from along Old Route 66, national collectors, organization dignitaries, local club members and area elected officials have been

Joseph Glidden, Jacob Haish and Isaac Ellwood each received inspiration from observing the Henry Rose demonstration at the fair that day. We've told how Glidden invented and started manufacture of the "Winner."

Isaac Ellwood also went home and made some samples of barbed wire, and a few weeks later, as he was driving by Glidden's farm, he stopped and studied the wire made by Glidden and installed on a fence. His wife told him that Glidden's wire was much better. Although, it made him angry, he also could see the advantages of Glidden's wire. He then contacted Glidden and bought a one-fourth interest from Glidden and

they formed the "Barb Fence Company."

Jacob Haish made several varieties of barbed wire before he finally settled on the "S" barbed wire variety. On August 31, 1875, he was issued Patent No. 167, 240 and started to manufacture it for sale.

Other people saw these ideas, made wire varieties of their own and in a few years over 50 companies were engaged in making various types of barbed wire. Many of these companies did not worry about patents but some applied for patents. This led to the Patent Wars, which we will tell of next.

The school is held in compliance with Supreme Court Rule and Statue (Art.

27.005) Texas Government Code which requires newly elected or appointed justices of the peace to attend a 40-hour course within one year of taking office. Topics covered included court management, setting-up court, liabilities, judicial ethics, financial management, court security, criminal jurisdiction and venue, parks and wildlife

laws, traffic laws, alcoholic beverage laws, civil jurisdiction and venue, forcible entry and detainer statutes, basic civil procedure, peace bonds, emergency commitments, duties of a magistrate, truancy, administrative hearings, rules of evidence, search warrants, vital statistics and inquests.
