GROOM INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Harard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), Groom Independent School District (Groom BEEN) performed inspections of the Groom BEEN campus for asbestos-containing material (ACM) in September 1988. The inspection findings and asbestos management plans have been on file in the school administrative office. since that time.

The EPA requires that schools perform reinspection of the ACM every three years. During September 2001, accredited and Texas Department of Heatth (TDH)-Licensed Asbestos Inspectors performed the most recent reinspection at Groom BEEN. A TDH-licensed Individual Asbestos
Consultant reviewed the results of the reinspection and recommended sections we should take to saffly manage the ACM identified at the Groom BEEN campus.

ACM identified and currently present at the Groom BEEN campus consists of thermal system insulation (i.e., pipe and pipe fitting insulation), floor tile and mastic, and ceiling tile. These materials are included in our Operations \& Management (O\&M) Program and we will continue to monitor them for any changes in condition.

The results of the reinspection are on file in the Management Plan in the administrative office. Everyone is weloome to view these documents anytime đuring normal school hours.
