the Texas Highway Patrol recovered in excess of $\$ 2,000$ in cash and numerous weapons and other valuable items from the wreckage for return to the accident victims.
Our department is continuing to investigate reports of obscene telephone calls in the Fritch area and we have received new reports regarding Aggravated Sexual Assault of a Child and another case of Indecency with a Child. The Carson, Armstrong, Gray, Donley County "All Kids Count" immunization initiative task force, or Task Force 6, held its firsi meeting April 15 in Groom.

The "All Kids Count" Task Force 6 is one of 14 in the South Plains and Panhandie Region of Texas. The "All Kids Count" project is a program funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. The goals of this project are to:

1) Develop a plan to link health care facilities and physicians with a regional computerized databas computerized database network to monitor the immunization status of children.
2) Increase awareness of the importance of immunizations.
