When you purchase a vehicle at any dealership, it is your right as a taxpayer to request that the money you pay be sent to the county of your choice. The dealer must collect the money initially but then it is sent to the county in which it is sold, the county of buyer's residence, or the county of the lienholder. It is the purchaser's choice.

Carson County is losing a large sum of money to the dealer's county because the purchaser does not request that the money be sent to their home county. On each vehicle sold, the County retains $\$ 5.00$ for each title, $5 \%$ of the sales tax and a large part of the registration money.

If you request that the money be sent to Carson County and the dealer refuses, please contact the Carson County Tax Office. Don't let a dealer give your money to another county, it is your choice where the tax money goes.
