





## Carson County Emergency Planning Committee Holds Meeting

Carson County's Local Emergency Planning Committee has been established to organize and coordinate a local emergency plan in case of any emergency that might arise throughout Carson County.

This plan will establish emergency response procedures, such as information to assist the public in case of chemical, gas or any other hazardous waste spills whether it be from local gas plants around Skellytown of White Deer to truck accidents spilling hazardous materials on the highways through out the county.

This emergency plan will

coordinate information provided by industry to identify the facilities and transportation routes where hazardous substances are present, establish emergency response procedures, set up notification guidelines, determine the occurrence and severity of a spill or release and the area and population likely to be affected. Also the plan will include ways to notify the public of a release and identify emergency equipment available in the communities of Groom,

Panhandle. The plan will include a program and schedule for training local emergency

response and medical workers who will be responding to an emergency.
