buying materials. measuring, cutting. welding, grinding, and paint, McLean FFA competed in the Ag Mechanics contest at the Amarillo Tri-State Fair on Saturday, September 17 , 2005. One of the three entries, a $5^{\prime} \times 8^{\prime}$ utility crailer with a folding ramp captured Grand Champion honors. The Ag Mechanics classes at MHS last school year and the classes since the start of school this year were involved in the construction of all three projects.
Jacob Tolleson, Jacey Carter, Matthew Applewhite and Try Skipper represented McLean at the contest. They were interviewed by the judges, answering very detailed questions about the equipment and supplies used to build the projects. Questions included what welding process was used, and the settings for voltage and wire speed. Student knowledge and worl manship were the two most important factors considered by the judges. Other factors were design and materials, practicality, diffi culty, finish, plans, bill of materials and phot graphs.
The other projects McL ean exhibited included a snall animal cage that fits in the back of a pickup o tri nsport pigs, goats, or lambs. It was awarded a third place in the livestock prodiction class. Also enter sd, was a T-post puller that was third in the small metal project class.
Along with Grand Cha apion honors, a plaque, and $\$ 250$ in prenxium money, McLean came home with a Lincoln 225, AC/DC arc welder, a toolb 3 x and several other smal prizes including weld ng gloves, a lawn

chair, and auto darkening lens, tape measure and several pairs of safety glasses.

The semi-truck was hauling a trailer load of grapes that scattered all
over the highway on-ramp and the parking lot of the Groom Dairy Queen. The back of the local man's trucl: ended up approx mately 50 yards in front of the semi's cab.

Paramedics from Groon, White Deer and Aerocire were on the scene of the accident that occurr xd approximately 12:10 p.m. on Friday, Septeraber 16, 2005. Lifestar was unavailable to mike the trip but Acrocire of Lubbock just happeaed to be in Amari lo at the time the
call for help came in. DPS Troopers, Carson County and Armstrong County officials were all on the scene.

Witnesses Jack and Betty West were near the scene at the time of the accident. They were eating lunch when they heard two loud pops and they said they knew it had to be an accident.

The truck driver, said to be out of North Carolina, was from Russia and spoke broken English. His condition

## PROPOSITION 2 (HJR 6)

HIR 6 would provide that marnage in lexav is solely the union of a man and woman. and that the slate and its politial subdivisions could not create or rec ogntre any legal status identical to or similar to marriage including such egal status relationships created out ade of Texas

"The constitu tional amendment providing tha marriage in this state consists only of the union of one man and one woman and prohibiting this state or a political subdivision of this state from cre ating or recognizing any legal statu identical or similar to marriage.

PROPOSITION 4 (SJR $1^{-}$ to deny remstatement of bail or new bal to a pervon accused of a felony, if the pervon's bal had heen revoked or tor fented as a result of the persons viold the safety of a victim of the alleged offense or to the safety of the communi

on the ballot as follow, "The constitutional amendment authorizing the denial of baii to a criminal defendant who violates a condition of the defendant's release pending trial.

## PROPOSITION 5 (SJR 21)

SJR 21 would authorize the Legislature to exempt commercial loans from state usury laws that set maximum interes rates. "Commercial loans" are loans made primarily for business, commer cial, investment, agncultural, or simila purposes and not primarily for personal. family, or household purposes

The proposed amendment will appea on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment allowing the legislature to define rates of interest for commercial loans."

## PROPOSITION 6 (HJR 87)

HJR 87 would increase the size of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct from eleven to thirteen members by increasing from four to five the number of public members and by adding a constitutional county court judge. The additions would ensure that the commission has an odd number of mem bers, which is required by another prousion of the state constitution

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows "The constitutional amendment to include on additional public member and a constitutional count court judge in the membership of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct
