Citizens of the Shamrock and McLean area are reminded by the Shamrock Dispatch Office to please listen to their scanners, radios and televisions for and updates instead of calling updates instead of calling the dispatch office for weather information.
According to Belinda Daniels, Chief Dispatcher for the City of Shamrock, numerous calls are being received from area residents concerning the weather. "We simply do not have the personnel or time to update each and every individual who every concerning the weather We receive the weather. We receive the weather updates from the National Weather Service just as the television stations are broadcasting the information. In fact, sometimes the television stations receive the information before we do," stated Mrs. Daniels.
"We have to maintain contact with our weather spotters, relay weather information to those spotters as well as the regular duties of the dispatch office during the times of bad weather. If many would listen to their scanners, they will hear the weather updates being transmitted to the spotters and could relay this information to their friends or relatives who do not have scanners. This would alleviate a lot of the of the burden from our dispatchers and would allow them to perform their job better as well as keep everyone informed of the weather conditions."
"If our phone lines are busy with individuals wanting weather information, it will be impossible for actual emergency phone calls to
