


When evaluating at all the candidates that are running for

"Imagine what that's like as an inliner (to watch Ohno),' Malone said. "It's like, 'He came from inline. Why can't I? ""

His life has taken him around the world to more than 154 different cities in 18 different countries on four different continents. Constant competition made attending a typi-

To receive his high school degree, Malone said he chose to attend TTUISD after hearing about it from some friends. The distance-education program within the University College of Texas Tech University offered Malone

It's been nearly three decades since Hector Camacho won his first world title, and almost two decades since he won his last.

For those 10 years in between, he was among the most exciting and controversial figures in boxing. He was a brawler who reinvented himself as a defensive fighter, whose rivalry with Julio Cesar Chavez made just as many headlines as his outsize oversonality.

He's 47 years old row, reduced to fighting in places like Coconut Creek and Billious instead of Las Vegas and New York: The glitry casinos and glamour of Madison Square Garcha have given way to hotel ballrooms and small convention centers, as the man inclearance "Macho" keeps trying to stave off obscurity the best he can.

"This is something I've done all my life, you know?" Camacho said by phone after a workoof for his next fight, against Alla Vester on March 26 in Kjellerup, Denmark.
"A couple years back, when I was doing it, I was still enjoying it. The competition, to see myself perform. I know I'm at the age that some people card to this no more."

Canacho's life and career have taken more turns than a pulp novel, from the gritty streets of Spanish Harlem to the bright lights of the Golden Gloves, from walking between the bars of a jail cell to stepping between the ropes of the ring.

His record stands at 79-5 with 3 draws, the most recent win coming just last year against Yoo Book Campas, another lighter far past his prime. But scroll down the list of Camscho's opponents and names like Occar De La Hoyar, Felix Trimidad and Ray Leonard are sprinkled among the nobodies and never-weres that hoped to make a name for themselves.

"Hoctor Camacho is a fantastic boxer, one of the greatest in history," said Vester's promoter and father, Anders Vester. "(Camacho is) the biggest boxing name who has visited Denmark since Mike Tyson in 2001."

Camacho claims he doesn't need the money - that's not why he's fighting in Europe for the first time, in the co-main event alongside a women's title fight. He simply needs action, and points to guys like Georg Forerman who had successful comebacks years past their prime.

"He's still very confident," said Carnacho's adviser, Steve Tannenbaum. "He's still got a bit of that wild child in him." Like many fighters who achieved fame and fortune during the 1980s, Camacho became entangled in a web of drug and alcohol abuse - problems he said are now in the past. Twice his wife filed domestic abuse complaints against him, and she finally filed for divious exercal suras ason

More receiving, Camacho was sentenced to the maximum sever years in prison for a burglary change in Mississippi, A judge suspended most of the sentence and gave him probation, which Camacho said he violated about three months ago. After a two-week stint in jail, Camacho was back in the gym

"When I came out, I've been training ever day for four, five months it's been," he said. "And now I'm ready to take on someone like Allan Vester, you know?"

Camacho became reviled during his car for his showboating style, making the long walk to the ring in everything from diapers leotards to loincloths.

He promised that hasn't changed.
"Ill give them satisfaction," Camacho said
"I never fought in Denmark, I never fought in
Germany. Those people want to see me, they
want to see the Macho Man."

white he claims to waith to fight at least five or six times over the next year, Camacho is also realistic. He admits that losing in Denmark would likely be the end, and he might turn his attention fully to promoting or training young fighters.

Camacho Jr., who turned 31 not long ago. The two once appeared on the same undercard in Tucson, Arizona, and they have even fought a common opponent.

"They're the best things I put in the world,"

Camacho said of his kids. "I want them to be proud of me, which they are. I just want to do this and do it well."

Animogai to the recognition and a transfer of contemporaries such a Roberto Duran, Camacho could sell tickets. He brought a certain actualerance to boxing that never diaminished, one of the reasons he was continually featured on high-profile undercards. Even if those days are long past, that boy

Even if those days are long past, that boyish enthusiasm hasn't dimmed entirely.

"This is what I do best," he said. "I can probably come back and promote rights. I'd like to go to Hollywood, do movioes, entertainment. But this is what I've done all my life, so I'm just going to ride it out. I'm going to ride it out."
