



Lobos Gives Mats Setback

Levelland (Sp) - The Estacado Matadors had already clinched the District 1-4A championship when they played the Levelland Lobos here Tuesday, so they were treating it as a practice game. The Lobos, however, were all business.

For their trouble, the Lobos beat Estacado for the second time this season - the Mats' first district loss - 11-6.

Going into the meaningless contest, Estacado coach Hodie Garcia said his team wanted to continue winning to have momentum going into the playoffs. He also wanted to give his reserves some playing time.

Both teams scored three runs in the

second inning, and the Mats took a 5-3 lead in the fourth inning when two more runners crossed the plate. The Lobos tied it 5-5 in the fifth and followed that up with a big six-run inning after allowing Estacado to score one final run.

In that big inning, Levelland started the rally when Estacado made one of its two errors in the frame. The Lobos were also helped by a base on balls and a couple of wild pitches while coming up with three base hits. Those wild pitches allowed two runs to score.

The Matadors collected seven hits in the contest, one of which was for extra bases. Levelland had 10 hits, half of which were for extra bases.

LCC Ends Baseball Season

Lubbock Christian College ended its 1981 regular baseball season schedule Tuesday as the Rice Owls defeated the Chaps 7-0 and 4-0 in a non-conference double-header at Cameron Field.

The first time in LCC's history that it has been defeated two times in the same day. This gave the Chaps a 38-38 record and continued their seven-game losing streak.

the fifth inning and Leland Creel followed with a single of Durham. Durham was called out at home plate when he tried to score from second base.

Rod Cline gave up 10 hits and single runs in third and fifth and two runs in the sixth inning while walking one and striking out four.

First baseman, Frank Dishongh of the Rice Owls was three for four with two RBI.

Track And Field Results

The track and field team came home from competition in Fayetteville, Arkansas this past weekend with a fourth place finish recording a total of 25 team points. The University of Texas took first place honors, accumulating 280 points, followed by Arkansas in second place (156) and Texas A&M in third place (76).

Individually, Kayla Jones-Morrison came in first place in the 800-meter dash event with a new conference

record time of 2:09.7-1/10th of a second off the national qualifying time. "Kayla looked very strong," Coach Jarvis Scott said. "She led the entire race. I feel confident that she will do it next weekend (Southwest AAU Championships)."

Ella Rich took a sixth place finish in the 400-meter dash recording a time of 57.0. Pat Jefferson came in fourth place in the discus event recording a distance of 129.9m and Sue Slutz took a third place finish in the 400-meter hurdles with a time of 63.3.

Cooney Stops Norton

Gerry Cooney took advantage of what he planned a million-dollar step to a heavyweight title shot when he fought Ken Norton Monday night. Cooney smashed Norton to the floor with six punches to the head and stopped the former World Boxing Council heavyweight champion in the first 54 seconds of the first round. This was schedule to be a 10-round fight at Madison Square Garden.

Approximately 12,000 to 15,000 people were at this fight Monday night (just to see 54 seconds of the fight). The fight was televised live by Home Box Office, a cable company.

The 35-year old Norton slumped to the floor in his own corner. The referee, which was Tony Perez did not even bother to count. Norton remained in his corner, where his handlers and a doctor worked over him for several minutes after the fight ended.

Cooney hurt Norton with a right hand shortly after the fight started. He followed this with a couple of hard lefts to the body, but Norton fought back.

Norton was cornered by Cooney and received lot of hard hits on the head. Norton was able to block many of these hits. Then came six lefts and rights to Norton's jaws. Following these hard hits Norton's bent as he slowly slumped to the canvas. Perez signaled that fight was over.

Cooney's big victory and Norton's bitter defeat came four years to the night that Norton had knocked out then highly regarded Duane Bobick 58 seconds into a scheduled 10-rounder at the Garden.

It was the second one-round knockout loss for Norton in his last four fights. After losing the WBC title

to Larry Holmes in 1978, Norton was kayoed in the first round by Earnie Shavers March 23, 1979, then was held to a 10-round draw by Scott LeDoux on Aug. 19 of that year. He then announced his retirement.

But Norton did not like the way things ended. On Nov. 7, at the age of 35 - many boxing people think he's older - Norton came back and won a split 10-round decision over previously unbeaten Randy Cobb. That set up an \$850,000 payday against Cooney. He never made quicker - or harder - money.

Cooney, who weighed 225 1/2 Sunday came in to the ring looking cool. He left it without breaking a sweat with his 25th victory and 21st knockout...and an easy million-dollar payday. It was his second consecutive first-round knock-out stopped Ron Lyle in the opening round last Oct. 25.

For Norton, 225, it was his seventh loss against 42 victories and a draw. Marvis Frazier, fighting for the first time in Madison Square Garden where his father scored his greatest victory stopped Steve Zouski in the sixth round of a heavyweight bout Monday night and remained unbeaten in four pro fights.

The scheduled six-rounder was on the undercard of the Cooney-Norton heavyweight bout.

In 10-round junior welterweight bout, Miguel Montilla of the Dominican Republic scored an upset when he knocked down Domingo Ayala with a right hand and stopped him at 1:15 of the third round.

The 20-year old Frazier, with his father, Joe, the former heavyweight champion, in his corner, hurt Zouski several times with right uppercuts and also scored well with left hooks to the head. Frazier, 201, of Philadelphia, was landing head punches at will when referee Billy Graham decided Zouski, 206, of

NFL Objects To Jury

According to the Los Angeles news the National Football League showed its view Tuesday in the Federal Court trial. The NFL attorney objected to Los Angeles County members serving on the jury which will decide if the Oakland Raiders can move to Southern California.

There are 68 prospective jurors, with 10 to be chosen, for the trial. The interrogation of the first one in the judge's chambers took more than an hour.

Mrs. Georgia Willie told U.S. circuit Judge Harry Pregerson that she didn't even know which of the NFL teams had won the last Super Bowl. The Raiders won.

Also he was said the Mrs. Willie also confused her husband's boss with Bill Robertson. Robertson, the man trying to bring a professional football team to the Los Angeles Coliseum which was vacated by the Rams when they moved to Anaheim for the 1980 season.

Yet Patrick Lynch, attorney in charge for the NFL, wanted to disqualify Mrs. Willie because she and her husband are property owners and taxpayers in Los Angeles County.

It was also said since Mrs. Willie was identified with the city of Los Angeles and was a tax-payer with a financial interest and her husband is a union member, she was bound to look more in favor of Mr. Robertson's testimony.

Robertson is the local head of the AFL-CIO but also head of the committee seeking a new tenant for the Los Angeles Coliseum since the Rams move to Anaheim, in Orange County about 30 miles south of the Coliseum.

Raiders' chief counsel, Joseph Alioto objected to the objection by Lynch and the judge said that residence in Los Angeles County was no reason to disqualify a juror.
