

Pancho Clos Llega El Domingo

Pancho Clos, Santa's cousin from the South Pole will make his yearly appearance this Sunday, December 20th. Pancho will be arriving at Rodger's Community Center this year via the "Flight for Life" helicopter at approximately 2 p.m.

This will mark the 16th year that the Lubbock American G.I. Forum will sponsor the project which give up to 2,000 bags of candy and fruit to children from all over Lubbock. Forum president Robert Narvaiz said that the project is aimed first to bring a little cheer into the hearts of children and second as a way for the Forum to express its

thanks to the entire community for its support in their projects throughout the year.

"We have many different projects throughout the year and the community has always been very supportive. Through the Pancho Clos project, we can show our appreciation to the families by providing this little bit of happiness for the kids," said Narvaiz.

The Pancho Clos project was conceived 16 years ago after a story was written by G.I. Forum member and local writer Jesse Reyes from a record sung by Lalo Gonzalez. The story was published and copyrighted by La

Voz Newspaper, owned by the late Agustin Medina and edited by Bidal Agüero. Both Medina and Agüero were G.I. Forum members. Since then Pancho's origin and story has continually been published in El Editor Newspapers.

Controversy had recently come to the front in San Antonio about the origin of the Pancho Clos project. Two G.I. Forum Councils have gone to court over the rights to the project.

In an interview with El Editor, a spokesman for the Miguel Hernandez G.I. Forum Chapter said that the suit over the rights to the Pancho Clos project filed by

the Central and Alamo Forum Chapters were thrown out of court. "Their suit was frivolous. They hadn't even filed the proper papers or paid the filing fees," said Michael Rodriguez, a member of the Hernandez Chapter.

Rodriguez also said that the Central and Alamo chapters had scheduled a parade for last December 12th and that no one had shown up. "The City is currently investigating who should pay for the money spent to pay for policemen and manpower for the non-existent parade," said Rodriguez.

In contrast, the Miquel Hernandez Chapter held a parade



this past Tuesday which had 40 entries and attracted from 8 to 10 thousand people. "Pancho Clos activities will continue this Saturday with the Forum providing 250 families with food baskets which include Turkeys with all the trimmings and toys for the kids," said Rodriguez.

The Pancho Clos project was shared with San Antonio by former Lubbock G.I. Forum

member Raul Sanchez who is still an active member of the Miguel Hernandez chapter.

Lubbock's G.I. Forum is still soliciting contributions to sponsor the annual Pancho Clos project. "This year, probably because of the economy, contributions have been slow," said Narvaiz. More than 2,000 children are expected to greet Pancho Clos this coming Sunday.

Area LULAC Chief Says:

Tech Might Have Been Kept Out of Suit

Although most LULAC delegates to the State Board meeting held this past weekend in San Antonio were upset about not being notified about the impending suit against Texas universities for discrimination against Hispanic, the delegate voted unanimously to support the actions of the state director Jose De Lara.

"All of the delegates (who include district directors from all of Texas) were in agreement on the principle of the suit," said Jim Goss, president of Lubbock LULAC Council 4449, who attended the meeting. Delegate gave a unanimous "vote of confidence" to State Director DeLara for his actions during the board meeting.

District Director Pete Garza was said to be very vocal in his objection to suing Texas Tech. "I just brought out the fact that perhaps if we (Lubbock LULAC) had been consulted on the suit before it was brought, we could have kept Texas Tech out of it," said Garza.

According to Garza, the reason for not notifying the local LULACs throughout the state was that the state "didn't want to let it out. The suit, even though they had been working on it for quite awhile, was filed all of a sudden," said Garza.

Other issues addressed at the State Board meeting were the English Only issue and the boycott of the Amarillo Globe.

"The English Only resolution on the Republican Primary ballot was discussed at length," said Garza. Some were saying that we should work toward defeat of the resolution and some were saying that what should be done was to work toward just voting in the democratic primary election.

A special task force to address the English Only issue was formed to be headed by former state director Joe Botello.

Garza said that in a personal interview with national vice-president Rafael Acosta, Acosta had said that he had met personally with U.S. Senator Phil Gramm about the issue. "Rafael said that Gramm said that the issue was a waste of time," Garza stated.

A resolution was passed concerning the issue of the boycott against the Amarillo Globe which supported the article written about Hereford. "We supported the fact that facts need to be brought out, such as the fact that there is only one elected official in Hereford despite the fact that Hispanics make up the majority," said Garza.

The next LULAC state board meeting will be held in Lubbock during the month of February.

Next Week: El Editor's Christmas Edition Mexico como Prioridad Estadounidense de Relaciones Exteriores

"Tan lejos de Dios, y sin embargo tan cerca de los Estados Unidos," es un lamento mexicano que se cita a menudo sobre las relaciones con sus vecinos del norte. Los mexicanos pueden agregar ahora la falta de conocimiento en materia de asuntos mexicanos en el Departamento de Estado, si el Sub-Secretario de Estado, Elliot Abrams, tiene razón. Al poner objeciones a las rebajas presupuestarias impuestas por el Congreso al Departamento de Estado, el encargado de los asuntos hemisfericos escribió algo recientemente en 'The Washington Post' que debiera haber hecho que las cabezas se volvieran: 'El Departamento de Estado tiene muy poco conocimiento, ya sea sobre el Brasil o sobre México, y no tiene ningún programa para crear ese conocimiento. Abrams tiene razón. Además, tiene el valor de decirlo. Porque, después de toda la retórica al principio de cada nuevo gobierno, aún no damos a nuestros vecinos gigantes, incluyendo al Canadá, una atención suficiente. Tenemos que enfocarnos sobre México para que se nos recuerde su importancia? La relación es larga: Nuestro tercer asociado mercantil en importancia; rico en petróleo; los campesinos son pobres; la población aumenta desmesuradamente; es una fuerte de inmigrantes; tenemos una frontera común de 2,000 millas; las industrias se llevan los empleos; es una de las figuras importantes del trámite de Contadora; la deuda exterior, dirigente del Tercer Mundo; celebrará elecciones el año próximo...Sin embargo, tenemos muy poco conocimiento.

Me acuerdo de la reunión del entonces Presidente electo sustituir a Gavin en nuestra mayor embajada.

Carter había tratado igualmente. El designó al representante por Tejas, Robert Krueger, para ocupar una plaza especial con rango de embajador en el Departamento de Estado, a fin de coordinar los múltiples intereses a nivel del gabinete en los asuntos entre los Estados Unidos y México.

Lamentablemente, la confusión burocrática continuó.

El primer enviado de Carter a México, el ex-gobernador demócrata de Wisconsin, Patrick Lucey, fué un desastre. El sucesor de Lucey, Julián Nava, educador bilingüe y bien intencionado de California, no fué bien recibido en México. Carter lo coronó todo en una cena de estado en Ciudad México al declarar que estaba padeciendo de síntomas de la 'venganza de Moctezuma. Este disparate abochornó a los Estados Unidos e insultó a los anfitriones del Presidente.

La postulación del economista Carlos Salinas como candidato presidencial del partido gobernante es una buena señal. Los mexicanos dicen en broma que el apellido de Salinas parece haber sido 'instruido en los Estados Unidos' (él estudió economía en la Universidad de Harvard).

Parece que estamos contando con el adiestramiento de Salinas en los Estados Unidos y con su buen sentido económico para mejorar las relaciones.

Mientras tanto, se pasa por alto al factor del "conocimiento," y la declaración sorprendente de Abrams no ha ocasionado repercusiones. Los análisis de la lista es larga: our third largest trading partner; oil rich; peasant poor; exploding population; source of immigrants; 2,000-mile border; industries taking jobs; key player in Contadora; drugs; foreign debt; Third World leader; elections next year....Yet we have "very little expertise."

I am reminded of then-President elect Reagan's 1980 meeting with former President Lopez Portillo — gifts, good feelings, rhetoric (like that in the Carter Administration). As his envoy, Reagan sent able, albeit arrogant, John Gavin, who remained five years. The President also sought personal ties with Lopez's successor, Miguel de la Madrid, and named a highly regarded businessman, Charles Pilliod, to succeed Gavin at our largest embassy. Carter had tried, too. He appointed former Texas congressman Robert Krueger to a special ambassadorial post in the State Department to coordinate

Unos pobres pastores judíos, cuidando en la noche placida sus rebaños; un chorro de luz del cielo, un menajero celestial, y un aviso, una buena noticia digna de ser proclamada al mundo entero.

"Hoy ha nacido en la ciudad de David, un Salvador, que es Cristo el Señor."

Este mensaje, esta buena noticia, lleva ya dos mil años repitiéndose en el mundo, y hoy más que nunca, es necesario que se repita. El mundo de hoy está sobrecargado de terribles amenazas. El fantasma de la guerra nuclear se levanta cada vez mas ominoso sobre el horizonte cercano.

Guerras, rumores de guerras, pestes, hambres, angustia de gentes, violencia, crueldad, rebelion, bicios, drogas, alcoholismo, demencia, forman un cuadro espantoso, que pone pavor en los hombres de gobierno y en cada hombre padre de familia.

¿De donde podemos sacar una palabra de esperanza, una palabra de aliento y de fe, en esta hora crucial? Solo amigo, de las Sagras Escrituras. Solo de aquel antiguo mensaje de la primera Navidad, el mensaje del angel a los pastores: No temais, porque he aqui os doy nuevas de gran gozo, que será para todo el pueblo: que os ha nacido hoy, en la ciudad de David, un Salvador, que es Cristo el Señor.



Reagan, en 1980, con el ex-Presidente López Portillo—regalos, buenos sentimientos, retórica (como la del gobierno de Carter), Reagan mandó en calidad de su embajador a John Gavin, capaz aunque arrogante, que estuvo cinco años. El Presidente también procuró establecer vínculos personales con el sucesor de López Portillo, Miguel de la Madrid, y nombró a un hombre de negocios muy respetado, Charles Pilliod, para cursos de acción—van de una dependencia a otra, y los departamentos del gobierno federal discuten tonterías sobre sus papeles respectivos al tratar con México.

Los mexicanos continúan estando sorprendidos, divertidos y ofendidos por nuestra insensibilidad.

Nuestros intereses vitales exigen que el poder ejecutivo, el Congreso y nuestros propios candidatos presidenciales echen un vistazo en serio a las relaciones con México. Cuando menos, debiera crearse una comisión bipartidaria independiente para evaluar los asuntos y proponer medidas respecto de ellos—ahora! Hay que poner fin a las rivalidades burocráticas. El Departamento de Estado (y las demás dependencias) debieran de actuar para mejorar el conocimiento. (El dejar de rotar con tanta frecuencia a los expertos en asuntos mexicanos ayudaría.) Debiera consultarse a los especialistas académicos y del sector privado. Nuestros medios informativos debieran informar algo más que sobre los narcóticos y los desastres naturales.

Un paso útil que sería bien recibido en México sería el aprovechar mejor las perspectivas y sensibilidades de los dirigentes

hispano-americanos. Entre éstos se hallan los ex-embajadores Diego Ascencio y John Jova; el ex-administrador auxiliar de la Agencia para Desarrollo Internacional, Abelardo Valdez; el Alcalde de San Antonio, Henry Cisneros; el presidente del Comité para la Política entre los Estados Unidos y México del Consejo para Desarrollo Privado en Ultramar, Guy Feliz Erb.

Estas y otras iniciativas exigen más que buena voluntad. Exigen dinero. El Congreso debiera de prestar atención a la llamada de Elliott Abrams. Los candidatos presidenciales debieran de preguntar francamente qué está haciendo el Congreso para debilitar al Departamento de Estado y de qué modo este país va a tratar con su vecino mayor.

Cuando incumplimos una promesa de servir de anfitriones a la reunión de la Organización de Estados Americanos en San Francisco (al no asignar dinero para ella); cuando las rebajas presupuestarias nos obligan a cerrar consulados; cuando decimos al mundo que carecemos de conocimientos y cuando al Congreso parece no importarle éso; cuando nos faltan recursos para soluciones novedosas a problemas de mucho tiempo; cuando proyectamos hacia nuestros amigos y aliados una falta de decisión; y cuando nos atamos las manos con trifulcas partidaristas...me temo que comenzamos a comportarnos como algo menos que una potencia de primer orden.

Las relaciones entre los Estados Unidos y México debieran de ser una prioridad en materia de política exterior hoy y mañana, no solamente al comienzo de cada gobierno.

Mexico as a U.S. Foreign Priority

"So far from God, yet so close to the United States" is an oft-quoted Mexican lament about relations with their neighbor to the north. Mexicans can now add a lack of expertise in Mexican affairs at the State Department, if Assistant Secretary of State Elliott Abrams is correct. Objecting to congressionally imposed State Department budget cuts, the hemispheric affairs head wrote something in the Washington Post recently that should have turned heads: "The State Department has very little expertise on either Brazil or Mexico, and no serious program to create any." Abrams is right. Furthermore, he is courageous in saying so. Because, after all of the rhetoric at the outset of each new administration, we still don't give our giant neighbors, Canada included, sufficient attention. To focus on Mexico, must we remind ourselves of its importance?

The list is long: our third largest trading partner; oil rich; peasant poor; exploding population; source of immigrants; 2,000-mile border; industries taking jobs; key player in Contadora; drugs; foreign debt; Third World leader; elections next year....Yet we have "very little expertise." I am reminded of then-President elect Reagan's 1980 meeting with former President Lopez Portillo — gifts, good feelings, rhetoric (like that in the Carter Administration). As his envoy, Reagan sent able, albeit arrogant, John Gavin, who remained five years. The President also sought personal ties with Lopez's successor, Miguel de la Madrid, and named a highly regarded businessman, Charles Pilliod, to succeed Gavin at our largest embassy. Carter had tried, too. He appointed former Texas congressman Robert Krueger to a special ambassadorial post in the State Department to coordinate

the multiple cabinet-level interests in U.S.-Mexican matters. Regrettably, bureaucratic confusion continued. Carter's first envoy to Mexico, former Wisconsin Gov. Patrick Lucey, was a disaster. Lucey's well-intentioned, bilingual successor, California educator Julian Nava, was not well received in Mexico. Carter capped it off at a state dinner in Mexico City by stating that he had contracted a touch of "Montezuma's revenge." This blunder embarrassed the United States and insulted the President's hosts. The nomination of economist Carlos Salinas as the ruling party's presidential candidate is a good sign. Mexicans joke that Salinas' last name appears to be "U.S.-educated" (he studied economics at Harvard). It seems we count on Salinas' U.S. training and good economic sense to bolster relations. Meanwhile, the "expertise" factor is ignored, and Abrams' shocking

statement hasn't caused a ripple. Policy analyses flow from one agency to another, and federal departments pick nits over their respective roles in dealing with Mexico. Mexicans continue to be baffled, amused and offended by our insensitivity. Our vital interests demand that the Administration, the Congress and our own presidential candidates take a serious look at relations with Mexico. At minimum, there should be created an independent, bipartisan commission to assess the issues and propose measures to address them — now! Bureaucratic rivalries should be stopped. The Department of State (and other agencies) should act to improve expertise. (Rotating Mexicanists less frequently would help.) Academic and private sector specialist should be consulted. Our media should report on more than drugs and natural disasters. A useful step that would be well

received in Mexico would be to take better advantage of the insights and sensitivities of Hispanic American leaders. Among these are former ambassadors Diego Ascencio and John Jova; Abelardo Valdez, former assistant administrator of the Agency for International Development; San Antonio Mayor Henry Cisneros; and Guy Feliz Erb, chairman of the Overseas Private Development Council's U.S. Mexico Policy Committee. These and other initiatives require more than good will. They require money. Congress should heed Elliott Abrams' call. Presidential candidates should ask boldly what Congress is doing to weaken the State Department and how the country is going to deal with its largest neighbor. When we renege on a pledge to host the Organization of American States meeting in San Francisco (no money); when budget cuts force us to close

consulates; when we tell the world we lack expertise and when the Congress seems not to care; when we lack resources for innovative solutions to long-standing problems; when we project to our friends and allies a lack of resolve; and when we tie our own hands with partisan squabbles...we begin, I am afraid, to behave like something less than a first-rate power. U.S.-Mexico relations should be a foreign policy priority today and tomorrow, not just at the beginning of each administration. 

Presently, the Browns hold the tie-breaker edge with a better division record.


The Houston Oilers are in third place and can win the division only by beating the Steelers and the Bengals and hoping Pittsburgh then beats Cleveland.

Belly-up Cowboys, Choking Vikings Hold NFC Key

The belly-up Dallas Cowboys and the choking Minnesota Vikings hold the key to the last playoff berth in the National Conference.

The Cowboys, eliminated from playoff contention by the slings and arrows of the Washington Redskins Sunday, play their last two games against the two teams vying with the fast-fading Vikings for the last wild-card position.

The other four NFC playoff positions—but not home-field advantages—have been nailed down by the Central Division champion Chicago Bears and the East Division champion Redskins.

Two West Division teams, the San Francisco 49ers and the New Orleans Saints, also have clinched playoff berths but the championship of the NFC West is still in doubt.

Dallas journeys to Los Angeles Monday night to face the resurgent Rams, right now the hottest team in the league, where and when the Cowboys should get their anatomies waxed, polished, and buffed.

And in their season finale the following Sunday, the 'boys will entertain the St. Louis Cardinals in what should be the smallest crowd in the history of the Dallas franchise, given the notorious Janus-faced attitude of Cowboys yuppie "fans."

If the Vikings win their last two games—Sunday in Detroit and next week in Minneapolis, they will qualify as the fifth NFC team.

But Minnesota, in two years under Jerry Burns, has developed a reputation as a team that cannot hold fourth quarter leads or win important games.

Last year, the Vikings blew four

games in the fourth quarter by a total of six points. This year, they tried hard to lose on Thanksgiving to the stricken Cowboys, then followed with consecutive losses to the Bears and Green Bay Packers, both in the fourth quarter.

If the Vikings lose one of their remaining two games, the Cardinals can beat them out of a wild-card berth by licking the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and the Cowboys.

The Rams, who play the 49ers in every body's favorite city after hosting Dallas, could win the playoff berth only if Minnesota loses twice



Robin: Top Opponent Soon Ruben: Las Vegas Debut

Fresh from his rapid knockout of Grant Walters in the Coliseum Saturday night, Rockin' Robin Blake wants to throw his next left cross at the jaw of a top ranked junior welterweight in the Hub City early in '88.

Blake's manager, David Gorman, said "We'll fight anybody in the top 20, and we're fixin' to get a ranked fighter here in Lubbock in February or March."

Blake kayoed Grant Walters, substituting for no-show Ramon "Chino" Cardenas, with three knockdowns in the first round of a scheduled 10-round junior welterweight bout.

After circling Walters for the first minute of the fight, Blake dropped the New Orleans fighter to his knees with a short, straight left cross that effectively ended the short, one-sided match.

Moments later, Blake dropped Walters again, this time with a left hook, as the sparse crowd of about 1,000 booted lustily.

The final coup de grace, another left hook, landed on Walters' jaw seconds later.

Under Texas boxing commission rules, three knock downs in one round mandate an automatic finish.

Blake acknowledged the boos of the disappointed fans in his dressing room after the fight.

"Yeah, I heard 'em," Blake said, "but it's kind of like golfing. It looks real easy, but when you go

out and try it, it's not so easy. We work long and hard in the gym and then it looks easy."

Gorman said Cardenas cancelled because of "an ankle problem or a weight problem, I don't know which."

Blake's manager also said Walters, who did not seem to land a single blow in the brief bout, "had been working out. He claims he was training for a fight scheduled for the 20th (of December)," Gorman said.

Cardenas was not the only fighter who did not show up. Two other bouts were cancelled and Roddy Blake, Robin's brother, fought a three-round exhibition with Ricky Goree of Hobbs, New Mexico.

In another three round exhibition, Lubbock kick-boxer Ruben Valderaz sparred with former world featherweight champion Steve Cruz.

In the best fight of the night, middleweight Dwayne Lockman stopped Miguel Hernandez of Nueva Laredo in the third round of a slugfest.

Hernandez started strong and almost put away Lockman in the last 15 seconds of the first round by cornering the Forth Worth battler against the ropes and staggering him with looping left and right hooks.

"I was stunned: I had blurred vision. He was tough," Lockman said.

Lockman rallied in the second round as the two fighters stood toe to toe and exchanged hooks and crosses.

Late in the third round, with Hernandez tiring visibly and in trouble, Lockman unloaded a quick and vicious series of left and right hands to the face and head, dumping the Mexican fighter into a pool of bloody syrup in Hernandez corner.

Hernandez seconds protested the referee's stopping the fight without counting as their fighter struggled to get to his feet. But an hour after the bout, Hernandez still seemed to be staring blankly in his dressing room.

In a junior lightweight fight scheduled for eight rounds, Lupe Miranda of Fort Worth caught up with elusive Juan Carlos Nuniz of Juarez to score a knockout.

Midway through the third, Miranda caught Nuniz with a right cross that snapped back Nuniz' head and bloodied his mouth.

Miranda followed with combinations that rocked Nuniz and dropped him in the corner against the ropes.

Nuniz appeared to be clear-headed enough to wait for an eight count, but when the time came to get up, Nuniz could not command his legs to rise, and collapsed.

Valderaz said Saturday night that he and his manager, Andy White, "are negotiating right now with Dave Gorman to join his stable. We're looking at Vegas and a featherweight fight on the Cruz card."

Steve Cruz, the former world featherweight champion who sparred with Valderaz on the

undercard of the Robin Blake match, will meet Jim Franklin December 18 in a bout scheduled to be televised on ESPN, the cable sports network.

"I'm a fighter, and boxing's where it's at," Valderaz said. "I've learned a lot working with Cruz, not just tonight, but working with him during the week."
