

Abierta oposición de líderes a la tarifa que cobrará SIN por la amnistía

Líderes comunitarios han dado a conocer su oposición contra las tarifas de amnistía propuestas por el Servicio de Inmigración y Naturalización.

De acuerdo al SIN se pretende

cobrar 185 dólares por solicitud de amnistía a cada individuo y un máximo de 420 dólares por familia solicitante, medida que ha sido criticada severamente por grupos defensores de los derechos

civiles.

"Las tarifas provocarán penalidades para mucha gente", manifestó Gilbert Carrasco miembro de la organización Conferencias Católicas en Washington, quien agregó que no podía entender porqué el SIN se estaba comportando tan ruinosamente en torno a un programa que el Congreso pretendía que fuera liberal y bondadoso.

Mario Moreno, de la organización MALDEF, Fondo Legal Para la Defensa y Educación de los México Americanos, declaró que su organización pediría al Congreso que cambie las tarifas y regulación sugeridas.

El costo de 185 dólares por aplicación es mucho más alto de los 50 a 100 dólares que el grupo había solicitado.

Moreno manifestó que el SIN está suponiendo que las personas que se encuentran ilegalmente en el país pertenecen a una sociedad de la clase alta.

Por su parte la abogada Adelfa Callejo señaló que ella creía que la intención del Congreso y del SIN era eliminar un gran número de personas que podrían calificar para la amnistía, aseverando que cada día la situación se tornaba peor.

Moreno al criticar la sugerencia sobre las tarifas por amnistía expresó que costos más bajos eran indispensables, ya que muchos de los indocumentados ganaban el salario mínimo, agregando a esto lo que los abogados cobran por representar el caso, el costo de proceso y exámenes médicos.

Moreno también hizo hincapié en que no únicamente serán los 185 dólares de la solicitud, sino que en 18 meses después de recibir la amnistía estarán sujetos a otro cobro aún indeterminado para recibir la residencia permanente y en cinco años más tendrán otro saldo que cubrir para recibir la ciudadanía.

Mientras tanto Richard Estrada, miembro de la organización Federación de la Reforma Americana de Inmigración señaló que la crítica ha olvidado que las sanciones en contra de empleadores que contratan a indocumentados son la parte principal de la reforma migratoria firmada en noviembre de 1986, en lugar de las provisiones de amnistía.

Warren Leidn de la Asociación Americana de Abogados sobre Inmigración consideró que el movimiento en contra de las los nuevos reglamentos era muy importante, pero asevera que existen aun otras prioridades.

Dicha Asociación se encuentra entre los grupos que han sugerido que se revisen los reglamentos.

Women Recognized for Extra Mile Award

Eight Lubbock women were recipients of the Extra Mile Award presented by the Lubbock Committee for Women. The Extra-Milers were honored at a reception at the Municipal Building on Monday afternoon.

The honorees have together spent more than 100 years in service to the Lubbock community devoting long hours and extra time. Barbara Sommerville, who serves as the Executive Director for Guadalupe-Parkway Neighborhood Centers, began her involvement with these centers 24 years ago when Guadalupe Center was started. The center was designed to strengthen family life in the Guadalupe Neighborhood and to develop a better Neighborhood for the people. During its inception, Barbara spent countless hours visiting in the homes of people in the neighborhood to inform them of the services available at the new center and to learn of additional community needs. The center was truly a pioneering venture for the people in the neighborhood as they participated in English and Spanish classes, citizenship classes, recreational activities and much more. Subsequently the Parkway neighborhood center was opened. Barbara worked tirelessly following the tornado in 1970 to assist people displaced in

the tornado. Barbara possesses the unique ability to motivate persons to help themselves as they realize that someone is genuinely interested in them. As you watch her in action you are readily aware of her influence as people begin to develop self-esteem and community leadership. Barbara is totally committed to helping people to be proud of their culture and to strive to reach their full potential. She has truly tried to build bridges of understanding for people of all ethnic groups and to provide opportunities to stress the dignity and worth of every person.

Pat Harris was honored for her work in promoting girl scouting for young women in the entire community during her 17 years as Girl Scout Executive Director.

Georgia Booker was honored for 27 years of work as supervisor of the Municipal Garden and Arts Center.

Irma Perez is a tireless worker who gives many volunteer hours to the community. A person with strong attachment to family, it is not surprising that she has given a good deal of time to child and youth activities, including the South Plains Chapter for the Prevention of Child Abuse, P.T.A., steering committee for the Young Parent's Place, youth for understanding (international student exchange Program), Steering Committee for the

Science and Technology Center, Family Services Association, and the Rape Crisis Board. 2,500 students in 22 states attending the annual conference.

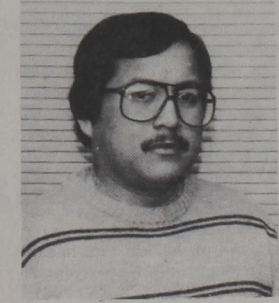

Public Service Announcement For Immediate Release

On March 13, 1987, a lawsuit was filed by several farm workers against Ben Moss of Hall County, Texas. The lawsuit alleges the farm workers were not paid the minimum wage required by federal law for cotton hoeing done during the summer of 1984, 1985, and 1986.

The lawsuit also alleges that other farm workers were not paid the minimum wage. Farm workers who worked for Ben Moss in 1986, 1985, and 1984 and who wish to officially become a part of the lawsuit must opt in to it.

Any farm worker who needs information about this lawsuit or who wishes to join the lawsuit should contact their family lawyer for assistance, or contact the United States District Clerk in Amarillo, Texas by writing a letter to the United States District Clerk, United States District Courthouse, P.O. Box F-13240, Amarillo, Texas 79189 or contact the law firm that filed the lawsuit for the farm workers. Chicanos And Mexico's President De La Madrid

On Feb. 20, a 13 member Chicano delegation met with Mexican President Miguel de la Madrid and three Cabinet Secretaries: Labor, Foreign Relations and State. We were invited by Dr. Romeo Flores Caballero, President of the House of Representatives' Border Commission who arranged the meeting with Primitivo Rodriguez of the American Friends Service Committee's "U.S.-Mexico Program" in Philadelphia.

We went to Mexico to inform the government and the public at large of the criticisms and responses of Chicanos to the new "Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986," signed on Nov. 6.

One might ask why Chicanos would be invited to present their views on immigration to the Mexican government and to Mexicans. The answer is both simple and complex. First, Mexico has historically utilized undocumented migration as a "safety valve."

The more complex answer entails understanding the international relationship between Mexico and the United States. The Simpson-Rodino law is perceived in Mexico as a unilateral decision on a binational issue. This unilateral decision has serious implications for the Mexican policy if the Simpson-Rodino bill is carried out stringently, in particular employer sanctions.

Alan Nelson, commissioner of the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, visited the same government officials in December of 1986. However, Commissioner Nelson conveyed a much different message.

Nelson informed the Mexican government and public that the new immigration law was passed, in part, as a manifestation of a sovereign right of a country to control its borders.

Where Commissioner Nelson defended the law, our delegation voiced criticisms and offered alternative perspectives. Some of our criticisms are shared by Mexican authorities. For example, in December, numerous Mexican officials raised their own concerns with the INS

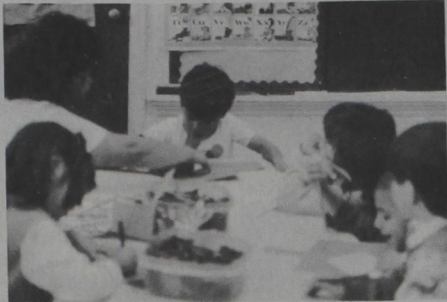

So I went back home. After that long day, when I got home I went to bed.

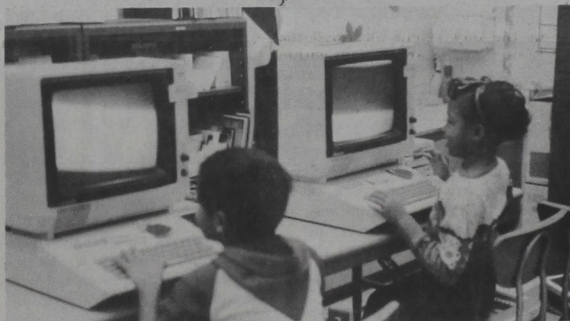

Applicants who are unable to pick up commodities for themselves must send their I.D. card along with a note authorizing someone else to do so. Families who have not received a new card since January must reapply this month. New applicants must have proof of residence and should know their income. The elderly and handicapped who are unable to go to distribution, must send

information with an authorized person.

Lubbock City residents should go to the two day distribution within the city and should take something with their current Lubbock county address. Following are the dates and places of distribution for the county.

Marvelous One Showing Mr. HBO No Mercy

 PALM SPRINGS, Calif.—It's a tough job, but Marvelous Marvin Hagler figures someone has to do it, so it might just as well be him. Boxing's basic brutality has never offended him, because that's the nature of the business. What bothers Hagler is that a guy can win so many rounds and score so many points wearing makeup and a pretty smile.
 "That's why I want to put Sugar Ray Leonard back in his place, at ringside wearing a tuxedo," says Hagler. "That's where he belongs, sweet-talking the public. He's a phony, and that's perfect for him. Mr. HBO. Outside the ring, not inside."

The Marvelous One has been skipping rope and punching out interviews at the Canyon Hotel since well before Super Sunday, and we are still a few days away from Super Monday, April 6 at Caesars Palace in Las Vegas. But if this case of venom is the last the 32-year-old Hagler will ever work

up, his 67th professional fight should require no further stimuli. "He's got the gift of gab, but I got the gift of this," says Hagler, smiling as he brandishes his left fist.

That, Hagler promises, will put Strong stuff. Strong will. Strong man. Hagler always left you with the impression that he'd prefer canvas to the podium, but a proposition of this magnitude—promoter Bob Arum imagines a gross of \$100 million for the

bout—demands strong answers and a strong story line, too. Hagler seems elated to oblige, especially when you resurrect Leonard's lates line—that he, the challenger, has the upper hand on Hagler, the middleweight hampion. Leonard has the gall to suggest that Hagler even told him so.

"You don't think I'm gonna tell him something he doesn't want to hear, do you?" Hagler says. "When I said it was getting harder for me to train, harder for me to psych myself up, harder to take the punishment of getting hit, I was setting him up. Reverse psychology, he thought, 'Well, I've got Mrvin just where I want him. On the way out. Now after years of avoiding him, I can take off my tuxedo and fight him, because he's on the way out.' That's what Leonard thinks. This is chess and checkers. I know one thing. I can go one more fight. Can he go one more?"

"I've gotten older, yeah, but so has he. And I've been fighting, he hasn't. It's hard enough to stay on top in this game when you keep active, he hasn't done that. His last fight was three years ago, and (Kevin) Howard almost beat him, Howard did a good job. Leonard wasn't nearly what he used to be. Hewas rusty, but it was like he stepped in there and wasn't supposed to get hit. You know, he's Sugar Ray Leonard, the dictator.

"Now, Leonard's trying to come back against me and he'll be rusty again. I think he should have fought a lesser opponent to prove he was worthy to fight me. He

should prove he deserves a fight against me by having a rematch with Thomas Hearns or fighting John Magabi. He says I took too much punishment against Magabi. Well, let Leonard try Mugabi and see if he can take less punishment. But, no, Leonard wants to fight me, and he's gonna, and I'm gonna make him sorry for it.

"There's nobody who's ever done what he's trying to do, staying away from boxing so long, and nobody's ever tried to do it the way he's doing it. By coming back against somebody like me. That's Leonard's ego, he can't stand that I've won all these fights, that I've made all this money, that I've gone into places like Washington, his own backyard, and made so many friends. That kills him. I think he's crazy to be doing what he's doing, and I don't admire him one bit for it. I'm not taking him lightly, though. This is the highlight of my career."

Hagler deflects all jobs. Is there a possibility his pressure could be neutralized by Leonard's finesse? No way. Will a pro-Leonard crowd affect Hagler's mind? Who says it will be a pro-Leonard crowd? Can Sugar Ray, the great thinker, outwit a champion who is favored to prevail, and will chastised if he doesn't, convincingly?

Well, says Hagler, it is something of a no-win situation for him, but there are ways to swallow that pill too.

"Leonard's doing this because he's a showoff, an egomaniac who has to feel like he's the best or else he can't live with himself," reasons Hagler. "What's he going to do when I embarrass him in front of the whole world? Will it be worth it to him then? He'll have all his money, but what's he gonna tell HBO then? He had the bad eye, he's got a secure position, but he still wanted to fight me. He's gonna get his chance, but when I destroy him, how's he going to talk his way out of that? I don't feel sorry for him, because I don't like the man at all. He's nuts, but he's still a phony. Until April 6. Then he can't act no more. No more. No mercy."

Hagler y Sugar Leonard

PALM SPRINGS.—La pelea entre el campeón indiscutido de los medianos Marvelous Marvin Hagler y Sugar Ray Leonard, programada para el 6 de Abril, ha tropezado con complicaciones imprevistas debido a la actitud asumida por dos de las tres entidades rectoras del boxeo a nivel mundial.

Hagler podría perder los títulos de la Asociación Mundial de Boxeo y de la Federación Internacional de Boxeo sin subir al cuadrilátero, e incluso si esas entidades no lo despojan de sus cetros, han dicho que no reconocerán la pelea con Leonard.

Aparentemente solo el Consejo Mundial de Boxeo está dispuesto a reconocer el combate.

James Binns, asesor de la AMB, dijo que el comité ejecutivo de la organización se reunirá el 21 de este mes en Maracay, Venezuela, para decidir si despoja a Hagler o no.

El comité de campeonatos recomendó que se desconociera a Hagler por negarse a defender el título ante el británico Harold

Graham.

Binns indicó que incluso si Hagler no es desconocido, el título quedaría vacante de todos modos aunque venciera a Leonard porque los reglamentos de la AMB prohíben que un campeón enfrente a un rival que no figura en el escalafón en una pelea a más de diez rounds. El combate sería a 12 asaltos.

Leonard no pelea desde mayo de 1984, cuando interrumpió su retiro para medirse con Kevin Howard, a quien noqueó en el noveno round luego de sufrir la primera caída de su carrera. Debido a su inactividad no aparece en los escalafones de ninguna de las tres entidades.

El presidente del CMB José Sulaiman, en cambio, dijo que su organización puede obviar esa regla si se trata de un ex campeón de distinguida carrera. Leonard fue campeón indiscutido de los welter y monarca mediano junior de la AMB.

En caso de que Hagler no fuera desconocido y Leonard lo venciera, la corona sería declarada vacante.

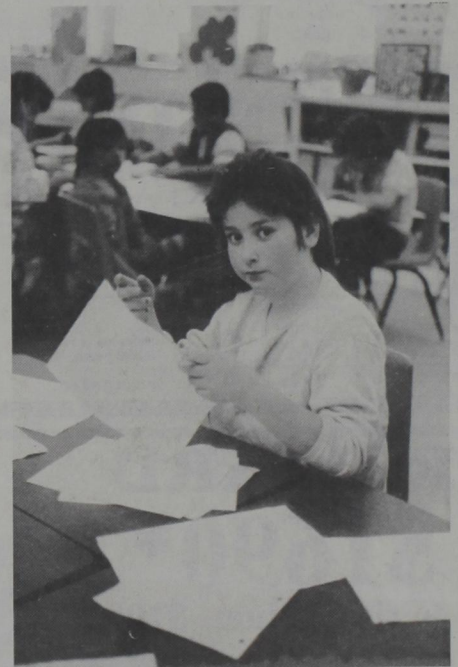

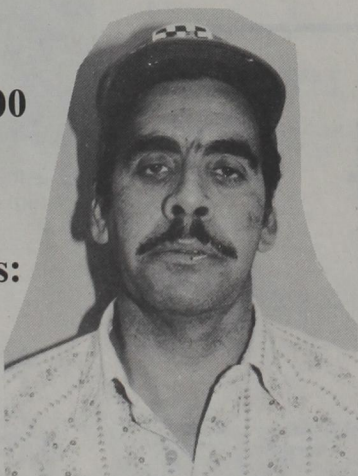
