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Tensión por acuerdos en el Congreso

Sube la tensión en el Capitolio. Sólo tres semanas le quedan al Congreso para llegar a un acuerdo sobre la extensión de los recortes al impuesto de nómina. En juego están millones de familias indocumentadas y la presión por mayor liderazgo en este tema.

Ayer se celebró la cuarta reunión del Comité de Conferencia, con la esperanza de lograr avances. Sin embargo, nadie quiso ceder: "Espero que la gente que vino aquí hoy, no se vaya con la impresión de que esto es imposible. Necesitamos actuar yくるな poco tiempo", dijo el congresista Sandy Levin (D-MI).

El grupo de 20 legisladores, que representan a ambos asambleas, debatido ayer sobre la manera en que se puede finalizar la extensión de los recortes y del seguro de desempleo por 18 meses. En el documento que enumeró la lista de 15 alternativas de financiamiento, incluidas en el proyecto de ley aprobado por la Cámara de Representantes.

Entre las opciones está negarle el acceso al Crédito Tributario por Hijos (CTC) a los inmigrantes que utilizan un Número de Identificación Personal del Contribuyente (ITIN), en su lugar, se exigiría que las familias presenten un número de seguro social.

ITIN es la única forma que tienen las personas sin papeles para reportar sus impuestos. El Consejo Nacional de la Raza (NCLR) ha estimado que de ser aprobada, la iniciativa afectaría a 4 millones de niños, en su mayoría hispanos y le quitaría de los bolsillos 1,800 dólares anuales a las familias con ingresos de 21 mil dólares.

"Los republicanos tienen propuestas que para nosotros son ofensivas. Le quitan beneficios a la clase media. Esto de aplicar impuestos sobre niños, es inaudito. En cualquier negociación se va a hablar de todo, pero los demócratas estamos diciendo que no queremos incluir este punto", aseguró a La Opinión, Xavier Becerra (D-CA). El líder demócrata en el Senado, Harry Reid (D-NV), ya ha exige-

sado públicamente que se opone a la medida. La Casa Blanca no la incluyó en su propuesta para financiar las extensiones.

Si embargo, legisladores del Caucus Hispano y Asiático están pidiendo mayor liderazgo sobre este tema a los demócratas. "Niños pobres, especialmente aquellos que viven en familias de inmigrantes, pueden ser el blanco más fácil, cuando se trata de

pagar por recortes de impuestos, pero necesitamos de su continuo liderazgo para rechazar propuestas que castigan innecesariamente a niños", dice una misiva, obtenida por La Opinión, enviada por líderes de ambos cauces, además de los presidentes de sus grupos de trabajo de inmigración.

Al otro lado del pasillo, senadores como Mike Crapo (R-ID) —miembro del comité de conferencia— insistieron en las diferencias entre ambos partidos, pero la importancia de mantener el enfoque en no aumentar el déficit. "Sólo porque tenemos desacuerdos, que reflejan recortes en los que ha habido apoyo bipartidista, no significa que tengamos un paso libre para aumentar la deuda", dijo.

Tras varios momentos de tensión durante el encuentro, Levin le pidió a los legisladores republicanos que dejaran de referirse al proyecto de ley aprobado por la Cámara de Representantes como "bipartidista", ya que sólo unos pocos demócratas lo apoyaron.

En tanto, la organización circular apoyó avisos publicitarios en torno al acceso a CTC, en los periódicos que circulan en las manos de la élite política en Washington.

El Fondo de Acción del Centro para el Progreso Americano, publicó ayer en "Politico" un aviso en que llama a realizar la elección correcta entre recortes en contra de los niños o que los ricos puedan comprarse un Rolex.

House GOP closer to vote on making English the official language

Spurred by Republicans running for the White House, GOP lawmakers on Capitol Hill are moving closer to a vote that would make English the official language of the United States.

Republicans believe a vote on the bipartisanship measure would put the Obama administration on the defensive. President Obama voted against the effort when he served in the Senate.

GOP White House hopefuls, including former Massachusetts Gov. Mitt Romney and former House Speaker Newt Gingrich (Ga.), have clashed on immigration reform, but they have united officially recognizing the English language.

Rep. Steve King (R-Iowa), aardent illegal immigration foe who has introduced the "English Language Unity Act of 2011," sees a clear policy and political opportunity for his party.

"It's one of those 84 percent [approval] issues. I don't know what the [Republican] leaders have up on the board that is more popular than official English," King said in an interview with The Hill.

King's measure has been referred to the House Judiciary Committee.

Rep. Lamar Smith (R-Texas), chairman of the Judiciary panel, told The Hill: "I support efforts to make English the official language and may consider bringing up the issue in the House Judiciary Committee down the road."

King's bill, which has 106 co-sponsors, including Democratic Reps. Jason Altmire (Pa.) and Mike McIntyre (N.C.), would require official functions of the United States to be conducted in English. It would also establish



the English language as a requirement for naturalization.

It is unclear whether Smith will move King's bill or another version.

After Republicans won control of the House in 2010, King was passed over for chairmanship of the Judiciary's subcommittee on immigration, including Sen. Ben Cardin (Md.), Barbara Mikulski (Md.), Tom Carper (Del.) and Ron Wyden (Ore.).

The comprehensive immigration bill subsequently died in the Senate.

All four remaining Republican presidential candidates support making English the official language of the United States.

Rep. Ron Paul (R-Tex.) has co-sponsored King's bill, while former Sen. Rick Santorum (R-Pa.) also supported official English measures when he served in the upper chamber.

Armed with that support, King is vowed to press House GOP leadership officials.

If House Republican leaders will act on the issue, House Chief Deputy Whip Peter Roskam (R-Ill.) was noncommittal.

would have made English the national language of the United States.

Vice President Biden — then Delaware's senior senator — also opposed the amendment, which was approved in a 64-33 vote on June 6, 2007. Seventeen Democrats backed the amendment, including Sen. Ben Cardin (Md.), Barbara Mikulski (Md.), Tom Carper (Del.) and Ron Wyden (Ore.).

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"I think the lion's share of our energy is going to be focused on jobs, the economy, energy and taxes," Roskam told CQ Roll Call.

King is also rallying support for another one of his bills that would he said would "clarify that wages and benefits paid to illegals are not tax deductible as a business expense."

Santorum and Gingrich have endorsed the New Illegal Deduction Elimination Act (IDEA), King said, noting that it is working to gain Romney's backing.

Smith, meanwhile, cosponsored King's New IDEA in December.

Rep. Brian Bilbray (R-Calif.), another backer of the bill, argued that moving the measure is the least that Congress should do to address the immigration issue this year.

"I don't think that we should take a walk at reaching out and finding a way to do the minimum — the most moderate proposal — and I think the New IDEA is the most moderate you can do [...] just stop the subsidization of employers who are breaking the law," Bilbray said.

Because the measure would deal with reforming the tax code, as well as combating illegal immigration, the issue could be one that House GOP leaders would pursue on the agenda this year.

"I've not heard that, but it sure could fit into bills that fall under the broad area of taxes, Roskam said.

Regardless, King intends to press his leaders on both pieces of legislation.

"I'm starting to work this towards a hearing, we surely ought to have a hearing. I can push it harder and I intend to," King said.

Los votantes hispanos de Colorado no apoyaron este año al presidente Barack Obama debido al alto nivel de desempleo que sufrieron, denunció el martes el Comité Nacional Republicano, mientras el Partido Demócrata del estado criticaba a Mitt Romney por su dura política migratoria.

Con motivo de la asamblea partidaria republicana que se celebra en el estado, ambos bandos se apresuraron a cortejar a los votantes registrados de Colorado, de los cuales uno de cada diez es hispano.

El Comité Nacional Republicano (RNRC) por sus siglas en inglés) dijo que la crisis económica ha azotado a los hispanos con más severidad que al resto de la población; la tasa de desempleo entre hispanos en Colorado es de 13.2% mientras que la media general en el estado es de 7.5%.

"Los hispanos en Colorado están listos para un cambio de dirección en Washington," dijo Bettina Inclán, directora de políticas de proyección a hispanos para el Comité Nacional Republicano.

"Los republicanos enviarán un líder que esté listo para generar puestos de trabajo, en lugar de tener un líder que está sólido enfocado en mantener el suyo," señaló Inclán, durante una conferencia telefónica con periodistas.

Por su parte, líderes hispanos demócratas en el estado realizaron una rueda de prensa para denunciar que Romney, uno de los aspirantes a la candidatura republicana es enemigo de los inmigrantes debido a sus intrusivas políticas migratorias.

"Hace cuatro años Romney apoyaba una propuesta para lograr una reforma migratoria y ahora habla de autodeportación y de vetar el Dream Act," dijo el hispano Rick Palacio, presi-

dente del Partido Demócrata de Colorado. "Creo que la asamblea partidaria es una gran oportunidad para que los hispanos vean las posiciones de los republicanos y lo contrasten con el valiente liderazgo de Obama."

Uno de cada diez votantes registrados en Colorado es hispano, según datos del Fondo Educativo de la Asociación Nacional de Funcionarios Latinos Electrónicos y Nombrados (NALEO).

La comunidad hispana representa un 42% del crecimiento poblacional total del estado en los últimos 10 años, asegura la organización.

La mayoría de votantes hispanos registrados en Colorado — un 51% — son demócratas, mientras que un 33% no estuvo afiliado a ninguno de los dos principales partidos y un 16% es independiente.

Se espera que Colorado sea un estado clave en las elecciones de noviembre: aproximadamente un 61% de los hispanos del estado votaron a favor del presidente Barack Obama en 2008, una cifra que le ayudó a lograr una victoria contra el senador republicano John McCain.

El gobernador de Massachusetts, Mitt Romney, se presenta como el favorito para ganar las marcas por la noche la primaria republicana del estado.

Grupos de activistas, sin embargo, critican que el ex gobernador de California Pete Wilson anunciará su apoyo al candidato el lunes. Wilson propuso en 1994 una ley que no habría permitido a estadounidenses para residir en Estados Unidos inscribirse en escuelas públicas o usar servicios públicos. La ley fue aprobada en el estado pero las cortes la rechazaron.

La próxima convención partidaria — "caucus" en inglés — está planeada para el sábado en Maine.

¿Cuándo Resulta Ser Una Elección y No Un Tiroteo?

CIUDAD DE MÉXICO — Se comunicó conmigo un editorial estadounidense porque quería que escribiera rápidamente un libro sobre los temas de importancia en México y los candidatos a la presidencia que hacen campaña para los comicios en junio. Los libros sobre México tienen mejor salud en los Estados Unidos justos antes de una elección presidencial, me dijo el editor.

El editor literalmente me dictó los temas a cubrir — armas, masacres, corrupción, tóxicos, carteles de narco, petróleo, defensas, ineficiencia, pueblos norteamericanos abandonados, caos, pena humana. Quería una nueva versión de lo que se le tituló “grasero” (grasiento) desde la década de 1930 — con plicitudes, noticias y notas en revistas.

Basta con decir que no acepté la oferta.

Si lo que quieren es una perspectiva sobre lo que está por venir, lo mejor es observar el comercio, la producción y la economía. El comercio internacional es un factor clave en México, y para los retos nacionales, incluyendo aquellos que el país ha impedido el progreso. De alguna manera, el título del reciente informe de Luis de la Calle y Luis Rubio nos da la narrativa: “Pobre no más, desarrollado no”.

Escrituraron fráncamente los autores, “ya no se puede considerar pobre a la mayoría de los

mexicanos (un avance reciente). Por ende, el país está mejor, pero aún no está bien”. De la misma manera, a pesar de poseer un nivel muy alto de acceso a información y a conocimientos, algunos de nuestros líderes de opinión no logran describir a los EE.UU. sino con normas políticas de los 1970 o como parte de América del Norte.

Pero para entender a este vecino y clima va desembrollándose lo que mira hacia el sur, cosa que extraño.

Recientemente, el presidente Felipe Calderón dio la rueda de prensa que confirmó la reunión en junio del G20, pieza jenga en el activo o para obtener empleos, para aclarar las inversiones y el consumo. El grupo Sociedad Civil Asamblea de la Ciudad Transfronteriza, dentro de los bloques de planificación, se anticipó recibir mucha atención.

La asociación incluye a Australia, Brunei, Chile, la India, Japón, Malasia, México, Nueva Zelanda, el Reino Unido, Singapur, Corea del Sur, Taiwán y los Estados Unidos. Informaron que la lluvia del TLC de Volkswagen, en asunción al Tratado de Libre Comercio Norteamericano (NAFTA) por sus siglas en inglés).

Este enfoque internacional hacia el desarrollo nacional ha surtido importantes efectos, ilustrados con el anuncio de Coca-Cola el 30

de enero en el Foro Económico en Davos, que invertiría mil millones de dólares en México este año como parte de un plan de \$5 mil millones, el cual crearía diez mil nuevos empleos en cinco años. Empresas manufactureras de automóviles como la Volkswagen, han establecido planes similares recientemente.

Actualmente, la producción de camiones japoneses en México excede las exportaciones de Japón. Acaso sorprende, entonces, que el Banco de Tokio haya anunciado este mes \$378 millones en créditos capitales para las empresas mexicanas y japonesas en México. Existe retos y problemas, por supuesto.

Como ejemplo, México recientemente que rompió discusiones comerciales con el Brasil, para concientizar el panorama de la asociación transfronteriza. Luego dio la respuesta cuando Brasil amenazó con suspender un acuerdo comercial del 2002 referente a la importación de autos, dado un déficit comercial creciente. La importación de vehículos mexicanos al Brasil aumentó más del 80 por ciento, para exceder los \$2 mil millones en el 2011, comparado con el año anterior. Entre los modelos afectados están el March, Tida y Sentra de Nissan, el Fusion de Ford, el F-150 y el Jetta de Volkswagen. La exportación de Brasil para México sólo llegó a los \$72 millones.

Estas actividades requieren un nuevo tipo de atención, en lo que nos afecta a nosotros y

al mundo. Por ejemplo, ya los neoyorquinos tienen que saber que el contrato para fabricar los taxis de Manhattan, los que reemplazan la flota actual, lo ganó Nissan. Estos autos se fabrican al sur de la Ciudad de México, en Cuernavaca.

Mi intención no es provocar el miedo, la envidia o la aversión, sino alejar que se preste atención al panorama económico verdadero. Dar una mirada hacia el futuro de la mara demanda que acuma una recuperación económica. Cuando están en juego importantes decisiones sobre la creación de empleos y el bienestar doméstico, no sirve hacer foco del mundo de interdependencias.

Está perspectiva no se volvió a la izquierda en las primarias republicanas ni en el debate presidencial. Esta falta nos lleva a considerar si se formaría una oposición digna de llamarse opositora, o si están volviendo todos como ese editor, quien no entiende la diferencia entre los temas y las personas y los intereses.

En la otra extremidad, el presidente Obama tomó las nerzas de noticias Hispanic Link & Scraps Howard, ha sido recompensado durante dos años consecutivos por *New America Media* como su “periodista más influyente”.

LULAC Heeds Order Of Federal District Judge To Keep Conversations Ongoing And Resolve The Matter In A Collaborative Manner

Washington, DC — Pursuant to U.S. District Judge Orlando García's order, LULAC continues to affirm its commitment to try to resolve this matter through negotiations. LULAC continues to support an agreement that would result in four new Congressional seats, which continues to reflect the growth of the Hispanic population in Texas, and will resist any self-serving proposals which ignore what is in the best interests of the Hispanic community.

“As a result of the Supreme Court decision, the plaintiffs now have the necessary leverage to fight for a redistricting plan that is fair to the Hispanic community,” said Luis Vera, LULAC President Margaret Moran. “Yesterday’s proposal by the Texas Attorney General not only failed to support our cause, it also exposed his vulnerability when not dealing in good faith.”

In drafting its redistricting plan, Texas ignored the precedent found in the 2004 U.S. Supreme Court case *Larusso v. Cox* 159 U.S. Ed. 2d 831, 833 whereby a 7-10% deviation in maps was still found to be in violation of minority voting rights. The Texas House redistricting plan adopted by the Texas House of Representatives has a total or top deviation of 9.9%. “LULAC National along with MALC, NAACP, the Dutton Group, and the Travis County interveners maintain that the map put forward by the Attorney General still included portions that did not respect the Hispanic voting power,” said Luis Vera, LULAC National Attorney. “Per court order, the maps must be drafted in a collaborative effort between the plaintiffs and the Texas Attorney General. Otherwise, we’re back with the discriminatory maps that were first introduced by the Texas Legislature.”

Section Five of the Voting Rights Act requires that legislative-drawn maps be pre-cleaned by the Department of Justice before they are put into effect. Because the state’s map has not yet been cleared, it cannot go into effect and be used in the 2012 election. This will delay voting in primary elections in the state of Texas.

FOR REAL, HOW DO YOU SAY THAT?

MEXICO CITY — Remember the Northwestern University championship women’s lacrosse team that President Bush in July 2005 wearing flip-flops?

Admittedly, they were dresses and skirts but a controversy broke out about what was proper attire. Didn’t they know better? Flip-flop sandals aren’t proper, are they?

A front-page story in the Chicago Tribune explained, “YOU WORE FLIP-FLOPS TO THE WHITE HOUSE?” Some team members’ families were dismayed. That footwear is still generally considered too informal for a formal meeting of the President and visiting the White House. The woman defended themselves, explaining they were dresser than usual flip-flops. Aly Josephs said she wore a brown \$16 pair with pin stripes.

The media made many considerations, according to USA Today, were casual versus formal, looking smart and being comfortable.

Actually, this is a perfect example of what Diccionario de modismos mexicanos, or Dictionary of Mexican Idiomatic Expressions, by Jorge García-Robles, is about.

García-Robles, at the August National Palace of Fine Arts in this city, explained why a new reference work is needed, especially as a guide to colorful expressions coming from Mexico.

Modismos can be phrases that deviate from the rules of grammar or manners.

They can take the form we like calling “street talk,” but it’s much more than key words in throwaway lines. This phonology plays a role, even provides a hard-to-reach context. The champion women lacrosse player in \$16 sandals didn’t just that by referring special casual in the context of the White House photo.

And that is what García-Robles getting at. He gave a discourse about his reference book where the most accomplished literature, poetry and symbolism address audiences. This is a performance police were in the music, dance, sculpture and historically significant paintings are performed or exhibited.

García-Robles’ book, published by the Editorial Portafolio, has 11,000 entries. He puts it this way. Language can be divided as going down two avenues. One calls technological. This is the world of grammar. It has rules of proper use and expression. It is clear, precise, logical, mechanistic, governed and uses proper words.

But modulus, who and assistants searched for in television, novels, movies, underground lit, histories come from culture. They are organic, like an Amazon rainforest which grows new varieties and evolves every day. They are human expressions that give voice to basic feelings that even recognize criticism and other feelings. Proper speech doesn’t. Modismos can express the simple and the flamboyant, comfortable and sensual just like fashion does.

Renowned writer Guillermo Samperio read a story of the book presentation about going to a market looking for a good black chick. In the audience experiences expressions that take him to the Apocalypse and Final Judgment in search of truth. The colorful speech transports someone to words that do often the arbitrariness between us and judgment.

Popular writer Alberto Vargas Harbo, on the other hand, specializes in erotica, especially that coming from farming communities and places in cities where those people migrate. He tells a story about how the popular term “goy” (literally meaning ox) originated. In the Cañón dialect it refers to the ox’s huge horns and implies how the stupid average man is when he is deceived. (Perhaps this too is the origin of the English term “horny”)

García-Robles observe that politicians and downtown executives are heard in the popular water holes, as soon as they get away from public view and from their administrative desks, relaxing among modismos. They easily call each other and adversaries “goyes.” Modismos, like this, break down power brokers to who they are and what they do. It is mostly good-humored and often ironically true.

Language like that can strip existence down to a common reality. Modismos expose basic truths, just as the lacrosse players did. We all have toces. Except some of them carry their hairy digits with socks while others wear flip-flops, just like proper grammar and modismos.

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features since the 1920s. Need I say I earned my dinner off? If you want insight into what is coming up, it’s best to look at trade, production and economic international. International trade is the key factor for Mexico and the national challenges, including those that have impeded progress in the past. In a way, the title of a recent report by Luis de la Calle and Luis Rubio seems to tally the truth, “*Poor No More, Developed Now Yet*.”

The auto industry, while partly, “most Mexicans can no longer be considered poor (recent development).” The country is becoming better, but not yet well.” By the same token, with a

very high level of access to information and knowledge, some of our opinion leaders have portrayed the U.S. by other than 1930 policy standards or as part of North America.

But to understand this neighbor and how it is developing is not looking south but overseas.

President Felipe Calderón recently told reporters that as of the upcoming June meeting of the G20 he plans an active role to gain jobs, green projects, encourage investments and trade. The group will meet in Cumbre San Lucas in Baja California Sur. The Trans-Pacific Partnership, in the planning blocks, is expected to capture a lot of attention at the meeting.

The alliance includes Australia, Brunei, Chile, India, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, China, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan and the U.S. It is officially called the NAFTA+ or the Pacific, an alliance to the North America Free Trade Agreement.

This international approach to national development has had important effects, illustrated by Coca-Cola’s announcement on January 30 at the Economic Forum in Davos that it was investing \$1 billion in Mexico this year as part of a \$5 billion plan, creating 10,000 new jobs per year. Auto manufacturers such as VW have been making similar recent announcements.

Currently, Japanese auto production in Mexico exceeds exports by Japan. It is any wonder that the World Bank of Tokyo announced this month \$267 million capital credit for Mexican and Japanese firms in Mexico.

There are challenges and problems, of course. For instance, Mexico recently said it was breaking off trade talks with Brazil to concentrate on the Trans-Pacific scenario, then said it would resume them when Brazil threatened

my fellow trustees to do what is in the best interest of all LISD students."

During his tenure on the board, dual-language programs were enhanced or expanded at Bean Elementary, Harwell Elementary, McWhorter Elementary, Ramirez Charter Elementary and Atkins Middle School. Ybarra was an advocate for the creation of a new technology and communications magnet program at Wolfarth Elementary School. The expansion of the Lubbock High School mariachi band program to Cavazos Middle School was also accomplished while Ybarra served on the board.

The 2010 Bond brought new technology to all LISD campuses and the first to receive the new hardware and infrastructure were Wolfarth and McWhorter Elementary Schools. The schools also received new paint and other important cosmetic changes. As part of the bond, new playground equipment was installed on elementary campuses. "It has been wonderful to see the playground equipment being used by neighborhood families outside the school day. That is good for kids and strengthens the important bonds of our community," Ybarra said.

More than \$21 million will be invested in Lubbock High School as a result of the 2010 Bond, including extensive interior renovations, a new cafeteria, major improvements to the auditorium and athletic facilities, classroom technology, security cameras and teacher laptop computers. A new batting facility was also constructed for Lubbock High during Ybarra's service on the Board of Trustees.

While Ybarra served on the board, Head Start programs were moved to the elementary campuses resulting in an increase of more than 300 students. Ybarra said, "The early childhood programs lay an important foundation for student learning. Bollywood epic set to film in Scotland

SUPERSTAR Shakira is ready to head to Scotland to appear in a Bollywood movie.

The Hips Don't Lie singer is in talks with film bosses about a lead role in forthcoming Indian blockbuster Desire.

It will be directed by Oscar-nominated Enamul Karim Nirjhar, who will shoot a large chunk of the movie in Scotland.

Colombian Shakira is in negotiations to sing on the film's soundtrack and on the verge of agreeing to play an acting role.

If she signs up, the star will jet into Scotland in April with the rest of the crew.

Bangladeshi director Nirjhar said: "The film is at a very early stage but, yes, we are coming to Scotland to film."

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Kansas beats Baylor, shares Big 12 lead

Whatever Tyshawn Taylor and the rest of his Kansas teammates did to motivate 7-foot Jeff Withey certainly worked.

"In practice every day, punching him in the chest, jumping on him, trying to get him fired up," Taylor said. "He came out and played amazing."

Withey, coming off a scoreless game, rebounded with a career-high 25 points for the seventh-ranked Jayhawks in another convincing victory over sixth-ranked Baylor, 68-54 on Wednesday night, to regain a share of the Big 12 lead.

"I don't know why Withey likes playing against us so much, but he looks like an All-American when he does," Baylor coach Scott Drew said.

Withey, who finished 8-of-10 shooting and made 9 of 11 free throws, had already surpassed his career high by halftime, when Kansas didn't lead until the final minute. He then ignited a 14-0 run early in the second half when the Jayhawks (19-5, 9-2 Big 12) took total control of the Top-10 rematch.

Jayhawks coach Bill Self, who had his own way of motivating Withey, called it was one of the best offensive games by a Kansas big man in quite some time.

"Coach definitely got into my head and just told me that I need to be able to play," Withey said. "I can't go games where I don't score. ... My teammates definitely trusted me. They made great plays and got me open."

Baylor (21-3, 8-3) was 17-0 with the longest winning streak in school history before a 92-74 loss at Kansas just more than three weeks ago. The Bears followed that with a one-point home loss to Missouri, where they play their next game Saturday.

The Jayhawks, coming off a 74-71 loss at fourth-ranked Missouri on Saturday when Withey missed his only shot, grabbed a share of the Big 12 lead with

the Tigers. Kansas hasn't lost consecutive games in more than six years - a span of 228 games since January 2006.

In the Jan. 16 game against

After Withey made the technical free throw, Tyshawn Taylor's 3-pointer with 16½ minutes left pushed Kansas to a 47-32 lead.

Jackson led Baylor

with 16 points, while Quincy Acy and Cory Jefferson had 11 each.

Baylor worked the already raucous sellout crowd into a frenzy by scoring the first seven points. Self called timeout less than 2 minutes into the game.

The opening play was an alley-oop pass from Jackson to Perry Jones III for a slam dunk. Jackson then penetrated for a short floater, and the Bears were up 7-0 when Jackson had another assist, a bounce pass to Quincy Miller for a 3-pointer with Robinson sitting on the bench from the right wing.

Neither Jones, the preseason Big 12 player of the year, or Miller had another field goal. Miller came out for good after his flagrant foul with 16:38 left.

Aftak making its first three shots, Baylor missed the next five and Kansas got even at 7-7 all when Withey made two free throws. But the Bears pushed back ahead 19-9 after Jackson's alley-oop pass to Aky for another rim-rattling dunk that reigned the fans, before Jackson stole the ball from Withey and scored on a baseline floater.

Kansas then scored 14 points in a row, a stretch started by Withey's layup before he added a three-point play.

Withey then had consecutive steals that led to jumpers by Robinson, who foiled making the

Baylor, Taylor and Thomas Robinson had combined for 55 points and both matched career highs for field goals made. Taylor had a career-best 28 points in that game and Robinson had 27.

Taylor finished with 19 points this time, his ninth consecutive game with at least 15. Robinson, the only Big 12 player averaging a double-double, had 15 points with 11 rebounds.

The Jayhawks went ahead for the first time, and to stay, during a 14-3 run over the final 4½ minutes of the first half when the Jayhawks (19-5, 9-2 Big 12) took total control of the Top-10 rematch.

Withey had already matched his previous career high of 15 points on a free throw with 2½ minutes left in the first half to get Kansas within 30-25. He then blocked a shot, which led to a 3-pointer from Conner Teahan. Withey then made a tying layup with 13:44 left.

The Jayhawks finally led on Teahan's 3-pointer in the final minute for a 33-30 halftime lead.

After the first half-ending spurt, Withey had a turnover to start the second half before Pierre Jackson came away from a scrum on the floor with the ball from Withey and scored on a baseline floater.

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Cómo prevenir la osteoporosis

Estar delgado no siempre es de gran ayuda. Contrario al resto de las enfermedades, tener un poco más de peso puede salvar a las mujeres que están en la menopausia de padecer osteoporosis.

Esta enfermedad silenciosa que significa, literalmente, hueso poroso, se ha incrementado en la actualidad, contrario a tiempos pasados.

"El papel que juega la genética en la osteoporosis en nuestra población es no modificable hoy por hoy", explica Carlos Garza Moreno, ortopedista con especialidad en medicina del deporte. "Sin embargo, en donde nosotros tenemos control es al cambiar el estilo de vida (dieta, ejercicio, tabaquismo).

Zoilo Vázquez Matute, ginecólogo, agrega que la osteoporosis predispone a las fracturas y se detecta en mujeres mayores de 40 años y en hombres arriba de 60, aunque el sexo femenino registra el mayor número de casos.

Actualmente la osteoporosis y la osteopenia, que es el preámbulo de la primera, se detectan en personas más jóvenes, porque la

tendencia es estar más delgado y eso significa ingerir menos nutrientes o alimentos que contengan calcio, como la leche o los quesos.

Además, el tabaquismo en las mujeres ha aumentado en los últimos años y las posibilidades de padecer este adelgazamiento en la estructura de los huesos también.

"De las pocas ventajas de tener sobrepeso es que entre más kilos extras, menos osteoporosis; contrario a que si la mujer es de edad temprana y pequeña, mayores probabilidades de sufrirlo, porque como sus huesos cargan menos peso, se deposita un también menor calcio".

"Pero es estafa, sana, hace ejercicio y tiene una buena alimentación, no tiene por qué estar en riesgo", expresa Garza Moreno.

También puede aparecer cuando la mujer toma esteroides por mucho tiempo, agrega el ginecólogo, y padecer menopausia precoz, aproximadamente a los 30 años.

"Este padecimiento empieza a afectar más en la etapa cercana a la menopausia (perimenopausia) a partir de los 45 años.

"La razón es que hasta los 25 o 30 años, muestra reserva ósea

va en aumento y posterior a esta edad, en decremento", indica el ortopedista.

Otro factor importante a considerar en las mujeres en edad cercana a la menopausia (alrededor de los 50 años) es la disminución de la secreción hormonal (estrógeno) que trae como consecuencia una depresión o vaciamiento de la reserva ósea.

Se puede prevenir o tratar la osteoporosis mediante una dieta rica en vitamina D, calcio y proteína, así como realizar ejercicio regularmente de bajo impacto, como caminar, correr o trotar, ya que es un estímulo para el depósito de calcio en el sistema esquelético.

"El ejercicio estimula el sistema hormonal, que al mismo tiempo logra que se estimule la producción de vitamina D y de absorción de calcio que se deposita en la estructura ósea; si le damos poco uso al hueso, estos estímulos no se producen y, en consecuencia, no demanda calcio", señala Garza Moreno.

Las reservas del hueso también se van perdiendo, si la persona ingiere café o refrescos de cola,

fuma y es sedentaria.

El diagnóstico más sencillo se realiza mediante una densitometría ósea, que es un estudio no invasivo de 30 minutos, de la columna y cadera.

Estos estudios se basan en estándares que miden cuánta densitometría ósea se debe tener de acuerdo a la edad y a partir de esto lo que determina si es osteopenia o osteoporosis leve o moderada.

Recomendaciones
Cualquier mujer mayor de 36 años debe realizar una densitometría ósea.

"Si la persona padece osteopenia tiene que tomar calcio en una dosis de 1200 mg diarios que contenga vitamina D; la mujer que padece osteoporosis tiene que seguir el mismo tratamiento, pero por tiempo indefinido, pero además debe utilizar otro medicamento que facilite la entrada del calcio a los huesos, porque de otra manera gran parte lo va a desearchar el cuerpo", recomienda Vázquez Matute.

Hay varias opciones: pastillas que se toman a diario, una vez por

semana, dos veces por semana y hay una cápsula que se ingiere una vez al mes.

"Lo que está resultando muy efectivo en la actualidad es una solución intravenosa que se aplica una vez al año", agrega el ginecólogo. "Estos medicamentos pueden ser un poco caros, pero vale la pena utilizarlos".

La ventaja de una sola dosis anual es que facilita el tratamiento.

"Haciendo cuentas, sale más económico esa inyección que un medicamento tomado por todo un año", explicó.

También existen medicamentos anabólicos del hueso, es decir, que meten calcio al hueso, aunque no son los más comunes, comparte Garza Moreno.

Es curable.

Si el tratamiento se cumple como lo indica el especialista, los huesos pueden rehabilitarse en por lo menos dos o tres años, pero hay que llevar una vida sana y combinar los dos medicamentos.

"Es muy importante prevenir las fracturas, porque una persona de la tercera edad, si sufre una lesión en la cadera, se immobiliza

por mucho tiempo y luego se presentan problemas de tromboembolismo, accidentes vascular-cerebral y neumonía, que pueden acabar con su vida y no la fractura en sí", señala el ginecólogo.

Después de recuperarse de la osteoporosis es muy difícil reincidir, pero si es necesario continuar con las dosis de calcio.

"Si padece solamente osteopenia es cuestión de tomar el calcio a largo plazo, pero si al año se empieza el resultado, se debe utilizar el otro medicamento que facilite la entrada del calcio a los huesos", agrega.

Riesgos

Los riesgos de padecer osteoporosis aumentan al sufrir una fractura, y las más comunes ocurren en la muñeca, columna, específicamente en las vértebras lumbaras, y en la cadera, que es la más peligrosa, porque muchas personas mayores no ya vuelven a caminar sin la ayuda de un andador.

Si se padece osteoporosis es importante prevenir las fracturas, sobre todo en las personas de la tercera edad.

Mexicanos acumulan mil millones de kilos de sobrepeso

México es el primer país en Latinoamérica en realizar un estudio sobre las dimensiones antropométricas de su población, la cual, de acuerdo con los resultados, tiene un sobrepeso total de mil millones de kilogramos.

Con el apoyo de las secretarías de Economía y Salud, así como del Instituto Nacional de Estadística y Geografía (INEGI), la Cámara Nacional de la Industria del Vestido (Canave) realizó la investigación para conocer las tallas

más comunes en el país.

El presidente de la Cámara Nacional de la Industria del Vestido (Canave), Marcos Cherem, dijo que el estudio era necesario para evitar el desperdicio de materia prima y la acumulación de inventarios.

Tras destacar que en los últimos años se ha registrado una tendencia en la mujer madura a usar tallas más grandes, indicó que la medida promedio del mexicano se asemeja mucho de la media de habitantes de otros países.

De acuerdo con el estudio "Cuánto mide México?" de la Cananeve, en México las mujeres registran exceso de peso por seis kilogramos en promedio, en tanto que en los hombres la media es de ocho kilogramos.

En la investigación en

la que participaron 17 mil 364 personas de ambos géneros mayores de 18 años se concluye que la altura promedio de las mujeres entre 18 y 25

años es de 1.60 metros y de 1.67 metros en el caso de los hombres en el mismo rango de edad.

En este segmento, el peso promedio en mujeres es de 62.90 kilogramos y en los hombres de 70.43 kilogramos, mientras que en un rango de edad de 40 a 50 años, en el sector femenino la media se incrementa a 72.15 kilogramos y en los varones a 77.30 kilogramos.

En las mujeres entre 26 y 39 años, el peso promedio en la zona centro es de 72.62 kilogramos con una altura promedio de 1.62 metros, mientras que en los hombres

es de 72.37 kilogramos con una estatura media de 1.60 metros.

En conferencia de prensa, Marcos Cherem comentó que en 2010 iniciaron las mediciones del cuerpo humano con tecnología en tercera dimensión, en la ciudad de México y su área metropolitana, así como en Puebla, Toluca, Monterrey, Chihuahua, Tijuana, Guadalajara, León, San Luis Potosí, Mérida, Veracruz, Acapulco, Tuxtla Gutiérrez y Cancún.

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
