Impacto '88 Mobilizing

They and others liken such an arrangement to the influence U.S. Jews exert here on behalf of Israel.

In the past year, an agency within Mexico's Interior Ministry has developed such a plan. It is called *acercamiento*.

Ruben Jauregui, chairman of the Los Angeles based Latin Business Foundation and Impacto '88, also has taken part in some of the visits to Mexico City. He emphasizes the economic aspect of a more cooperative relationship.

"When you establish economic clout, all of the other forms of clout flow naturally from that - social, political, educational," he says.

Jauregui also headed the committee that addressed business issues for National Hispanic Agenda '88.

Conceding that Impacto '88 is ambitious, Navarro says, "If we accomplish 50 to 60 percent of what we set out to do, we will have put ourselves in the position of being a major influence across the board...politically, economically, socially, educationally...in the '90's"

Bandwagon 88

Betty Anderson, president of the League of Women Voters of Lubbock, has announced plans for "Bandwagon '88," an old fashioned political rally on the Courthouse Lawn.

The community wide event will be Saturday, Feb. 20, from 6 to 7:30 p.m.

It will be co sponsored and broadcast live by KCBD TV Channel 11.

The event will be patterned after an old fashioned campaign rally, with balloons, banners, placards, refreshments and, of course, candidates for local, state and national offices.

Mrs. Anderson said that unlike the candidates' debates, also sponsored by the League of Women Voters, this will be a lighthearted, "fun" experience of the electoral process, but it will give voters the opportunity to get a closer look at candidates for office and hear their views on election issues.

"Bandwagon 88 is the best tradition of the League of Women Voters, which is dedicated to providing information for an informed citizenry," Mrs. Anderson said as she announced the event. "The League is always non partisan, which means we never endorse particular parties or candidates. But that doesn't mean we are non political on the contrary, the League is anxious for all citizens to participate fully in their government. Our emphasis is on education, information and participation."

Presidential candidates from all parties have been invited to attend

the special event, or may send family members to represent them. Invitations have also been sent to candidates for the U.S. Senate, U.S. House of Representatives, 19th District; State Board of Education; State Senator; and State Representatives, Districts 77, 82, 83, 84 and 85.

County candidates for the offices of commissioner, Precincts 1 and 3, tax assessor/collector, sheriff, 72nd, 99th and 140th District Courts, County Court at Law No. 3, Justice of the Peace Precinct 2, Place 1, and County Party Chair candidates have also been invited.

They will be interviewed and questioned, in an informal atmosphere, by League members and officers. Guests will be able to cheer and ballyhoo their favorites among the candidates, as at an old fashioned political rally.

"We think it will be a lot of fun," said co chairmen Cathy Ranck and Jeanne Griffin. "But we also think it will provide a wonderful introduction to the American political scene."

The Bandwagon will be broadcast by Channel 11 live, from 6 to 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, Feb. 20. Voters anxious to see their candidates in action, watch them field questions and, perhaps, meet their families are encouraged to attend the rally on the courthouse lawn, or to tune in to the party via television.

It will set the mood for "Super Tuesday," when primaries will be held in Texas, which many experts feel will play a pivotal role in this year's elections.

Anheuser Busch Establishes Hispanic Scholarship at Tech

A scholarship recently established at Texas Tech University by the Anheuser Busch corporation has been reserved for Hispanic students.

The endowed scholarship at Texas Tech reflects the corporation's effort to increase educational opportunities for Hispanic youth in Texas, a company spokesman said.

A gift of \$10,000 from Anheuser Busch will provide one scholar ship each year. In alternate years the scholarship will bear the name of the Rainbow Bread Company and the Budweiser Company, two subsidiaries of anheuser Busch.

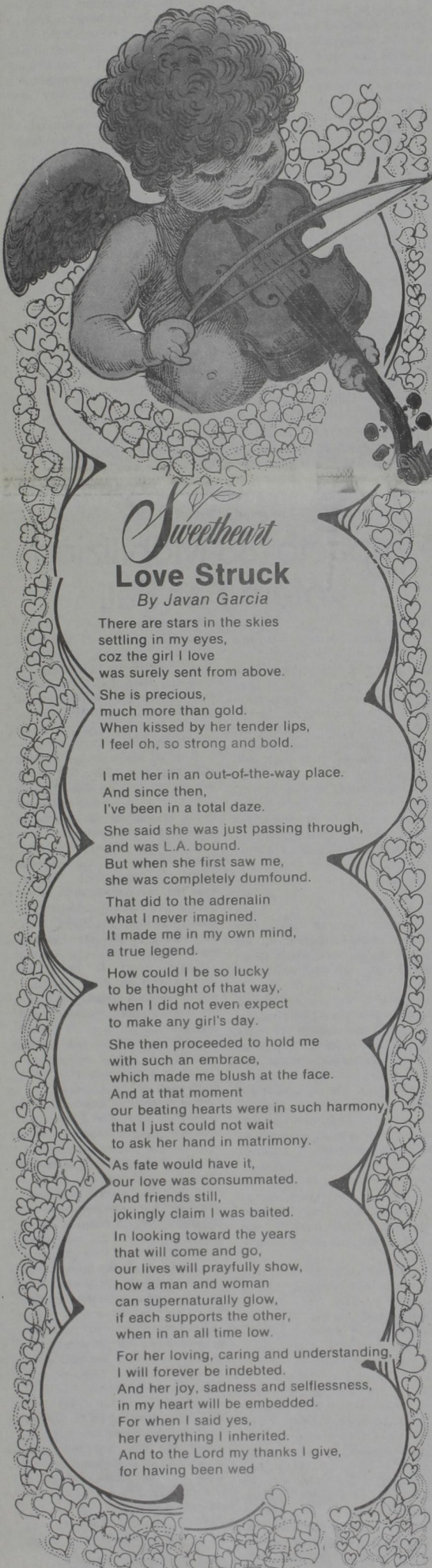
The terms of the scholarship have not been established. Tech officials said it will likely be designated for undergraduate students above the freshman year who demonstrate academic promise and financial need. The recipients will be chosen by Texas Tech according to its financial aid criteria.

Jim Estrada, Manager for Corporate Relations for Anheuser Busch, said that the company has made a "firm commitment" to increasing educational opportunities for Hispanic youth by funding similar scholarships at other state colleges.

In addition, he said, the company has a National Hispanic Scholarship Fund that helps promising young people to attend the institution of their choice.

He said that Anheuser Busch officials recognize the tremendous need to increase the numbers of Hispanic youth who attend and complete college.

Tech President lauro Cavazos said he is 'determined that Texas Tech will increase the number of minority students on our campus. We want to recruit promising young people and assure them that they will complete their education regardless of their financial resources. Scholarship endowments like this one make our task much easier.'



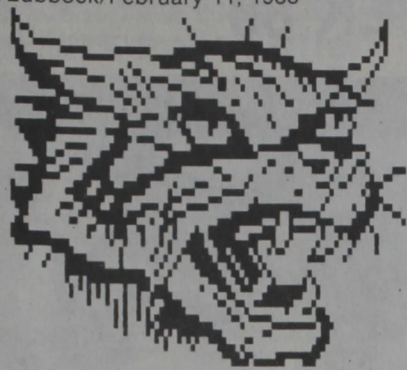
Sweetheart Love Struck

Los Medicamentos Pueden Causar Impotencia

— Frecuentemente los pacientes callan ante el problema

Enero de 1988, Chicago — El doctor W. Dallas Hall, internista y nefrólogo en el Hospital Grady Memorial de Atlanta, es especialista en el tratamiento de la alta tensión arterial. Sus pacientes le informan de un buen número de diversos síntomas, pero a él le preocupa igualmente lo que no dicen — especialmente cuando está relacionado con la impotencia.

El doctor Hall recuerda a un paciente de hace unos años que debía tomar una combinación de medicamentos para controlar su peligrosísima alta tensión arterial. Durante un reconocimiento normal el doctor Hall se enteró de que el hombre había sido abandonado por su esposa. "Parece que se había quedado impotente y su mujer estaba convencida de que él estaba viendo a otra mujer porque sexualmente ya no se desempeñaba como antes. El no sabía que el régimen de medicamentos podía ser el causante del problema".

La reducción de la dosis o el cambio a otro medicamento por lo general cura la impotencia inducida por drogas pero, recalca el doctor Hall, el paciente debe informar a su médico. "Si tan sólo él hubiera dicho algo, hubiéramos podido efectuar un cambio".

Según *The Medical Letter on Drugs and Therapeutics* del 17 de julio de 1987, los agentes antihipertensivos (alta tensión), "probablemente interfieren con la función sexual normal

más que cualquier otro tipo de medicamento", aunque *The Medical Letter* nombró a más de 100 agentes que han sido relacionados con la disfunción sexual. Efectivamente, diez de los quince medicamentos de más venta dispensados con receta están relacionados con la impotencia y cambios de libido en un pequeño número de pacientes. Tales drogas comprenden los antidepresivos, los calmantes y las drogas antiúlcéricas y antiácidas.

Para la mayoría de los pacientes, el riesgo de desarrollar impotencia como resultado del medicamento es bastante bajo, aunque los riesgos varían de un medicamento a otro. Los medicamentos contra la alta tensión arterial, tales como Aldomet® y Aldactone®, han sido relacionados en ciertos estudios con la impotencia en hasta un tercio de los pacientes, mientras que otros medicamentos contra la alta tensión arterial — los inhibidores de extracto adrenocortical y los bloqueadores de conductos de calcio — raramente causan impotencia. Los medicamentos antiepilépticos tales como Dilantin® y Tegretol® han sido relacionados con la impotencia en un 11-13% de los pacientes.

La dosificación puede tener un papel importante en la causa de la impotencia. Por ejemplo, los medicamentos contra la úlcera pueden llevar a la impotencia al ser administrados en dosis de tres a cuatro veces la dosis normal antiúlcéricas para el tratamiento del síndrome de Zollinger-Ellison — una enfermedad rara en la que puede peligrar la vida. Pero en las dosis normales que se usan para el tratamiento de la úlcera péptica (es decir, 800/1,200 mg/día), la incidencia de impotencia que se reporta para Tagamet® es de solamente el 1%, lo que es algo menor que la

incidencia que se reporta para la población en general.

Otros factores que determinan si un paciente determinado desarrolla impotencia relacionada con medicamentos incluyen la duración de uso del medicamento, la edad y la salud general del paciente y, lo que es más importante, la sensibilidad particular del paciente a ese medicamento.

Frecuentemente el alcohol y el tabaco juegan papeles importantes cuando el paciente desarrolla impotencia. "El alcohol y los medicamentos compiten entre sí para ver qué es peor," dice el doctor Hall. Además, el alcohol está relacionado con la alta tensión arterial, lo que "dificulta sobremedida determinar" la causa del problema. Se sabe que las altas dosis de sedantes, marihuana, metadona y heroína también interfieren con la función sexual.

La impotencia también puede ser causada por enfermedades tales como la diabetes y el endurecimiento de las arterias, por lesiones físicas y por factores emocionales. Hoy día se sabe más sobre la disfunción sexual y hay muchas formas nuevas de tratamiento de la impotencia. El mayor obstáculo para el tratamiento eficaz es el silencio y el doctor Hall recalca la importancia de que los médicos estén conscientes de este problema. El hacer preguntas sobre la impotencia "no es parte regular del historial médico, pero debería serlo".

Si un hombre sufre de impotencia tras el inicio de un medicamento nuevo, debería decirlo a su médico a fin de que se puedan tomar las medidas adecuadas para remediar el problema.

Two new boys on the block, Charlie Galvan and Keith Blake of Lubbock, also won titles.

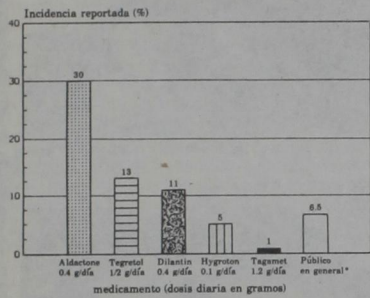

COLLEGE FOOTBALL

A&M, UT Austin Reap Recruiting Harvest

Impressive bowl victories by the Aggies and Longhorns apparently have propelled the two teams to banner recruiting years.

The Associated Press reported early Wednesday afternoon, the day colleges sign their football recruits to contracts, that Texas and Texas A&M skimmed off the "cream of the states" high school football talent."

Aggie Coach Jackie Sherrill called his recruits "equal to the quality we had last year when we were second in the nation."

But David McWilliams, whom Lubbock fans know all about, may be bringing the recently sleeping Longhorns back to SWC and national leadership.

McWilliams signed four of the most coveted high school football players, including center Tom McDoinald of DeSoto, defensive



lineman Tommy Jeter of Deer Park, running back Willie Mack Garza of Refugio and quarterback Jason Burkson of Sherman.

The Aggies signed blue chip running back Robert Wilson of Houston Sterling, quarterback Paul Johnson of Cameron and wide receiver Eric Broten of Boling.

Although the Aggies and Longhorns may have recruited the best prospects of all SWC teams, Texas Tech recorded a "solid" group of recruits, an informed source close to Red Raider football told EL EDITOR Wednesday.

Victories in their last two games eliminating the Los Angeles Rams and St. Louis Cardinals from playoff contention, ended the 1987 season on an optimistic note for the Dallas Cowboys.

The Rams and Cardinals triumphs followed a hard fought 24 to 20 loss to the Washington Redskins at RFK Stadium, and eased somewhat the disappointment of a second straight sub .500 season for Dallas.

The Cowboys finished with 7 wins and 8 losses, but it was a better season than the previous year, when the Cowboys finished with 7 wins and 9 losses but lost seven of their last eight games.

In 1987 the Cowboys emphasized youth and discovered some young players who will be counted on to lead the club's return to Super Bowl contention.

Here's a review of the 87 Dallas Cowboys:

YOUNG PLAYERS: The huge offensive line, with the exception of 12 year veteran Tom Rafferty at center, was a fuzzy cheeked group.

The tackles, 280 pound Darryle Smith on the left and 310 pound Kevin Gogan on the right, were rookies. Left guard Nate Newton, a 315 pounder, was in his second year and first as a starter, and 285 pound Crawford Ker was a second year starter and third year veteran at right guard.

First year kicker Roger Ruzek set a club record for field goal accuracy (22 of 25). His .880 percentage bettered Rafael Septien's old Cowboys mark of .815 (22 of 27) set in 1983.

Second year wide receiver Kelvin Edwards, who joined the Cowboys' replacement team after being released last summer by New Orleans', had 34 receptions for 521 yards (a 15.3 average) and three touchdowns and was a starter in nine games.

Rookie punt returner Kelvin Martin, after missing the first half of the season with injuries, averaged 9.8 per return, the best for a Cowboy since James Jones' 10.1 in 1980.

Second year kickoff return man Darryl Clack averaged 21.9, Dallas' best since the 22.4 posted by Ron Fellows in 1982.

On defense, rookie free agent linebacker Ron Burton caught everyone's attention with his play in the last three games after middle linebacker Eugene Lockhart suffered a broken bone in his leg.

No. 1 draft choice Danny Noonan shared time with Randy White at rih defensive tackle and drew raves from the coaches.

Third year left defensive tackle Kevin Brooks, in his first year as a starter, led all defensive linemen in tackles and registered four sacks.

No. 2 draft choice Ron Francis was a starter all year at right cornerback. When he missed most of the last game with an injury, second year man Manny Hendrix filled in and earned a game ball.

HERSCHEL WALKER: Walker, teamed in the backfield with Tony Dorsett the first part of the year, started the last seven games at tailback with Timmy Newsome at fullback.

Along the way, Herschel became the first NFL player ever to total more than 700 yards rushing (891) and receiving (715) twice in his career. Walker has topped the

700 mark in both his seasons for the Cowboys.

Projecting Herschel's rushing and receiving stats for the last seven games over a 16 game season, he would rush for about 1,500 yards and catch passes for another 1,000.

QUARTERBACKS:Duties were shared by Danny White, who showed signs late in the season of recovering fully from the aftereffects of a broken wrist suffered midway through the 1986 campaign, and fourth year man Steve Pelluer.

White passed for 700 yards in his last two starts, against Minnesota (341) and Washington (359). He threw six touchdowns and four interceptions in those two games.

Pelluer was the quarterback in the two season ending victories, and played error free football. His only two interceptions of the year came in his first start, a 20 to 14 loss to Miami. Pelluer will take a string of 94 consecutive passes without an interception into the 1988 season, closing in on the club record of 99 set by Roger Staubach in 1971 and 72.

Also on the '87 roster were eight year veteran Paul McDonald and rookie seventh round draft choice Kevin Sweeney, who starred on the Cowboys' replacement team with four touchdown passes in two games and a 10.4 yards average per attempt.

RUNNING BACKS: With the 26 year old Walker hitting his stride in Dallas and with Newsome's blocking and receiving providing the ideal counterpoint, the backfield looks solid for 88.

Dorsett, only the fourth man in NFL history to rush for more than 12,000 yards and the Cowboys'

No. 3 alltime passcatcher, would add spice to the mix with his still formidable skills.

Darryl Clack and Todd Fowler were the backup running backs in 87.

RECEIVERS:Ten year veteran Mike Renfro led the team's wide receivers with 46 catches for 662 yards (14.4 avg.) and four touchdowns.

After Renfro were youngsters Rod Barksdale and the two Kelvins (Edwards and Martin).

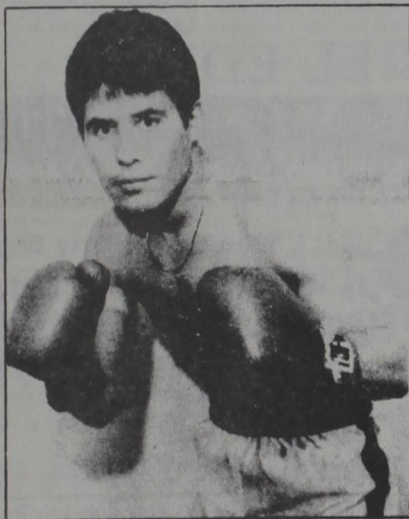
The player projected to be the club's top receiver, second year man Mike Sherrard, spent the year on injured reserve after badly breaking his leg in a freak training camp mishap. Sherrard has had surgery to emove the plate, screws, etc., that aided in the healing process and has begun rehabilitation.

The other promising young sters, rookie Everett Gay (ankle) and Canadian Football League star Ray Alexander (wrist), also were on injured reserve all year, and five year veteran Gordon Banks ended the season on the side lines with an injured foot.

At tight end, nine year man Doug Cosbie had another solid season with 36 catches for 421 yards and three touchdowns. Backing him up second year players Thornton Chandler and Steve Folsom.

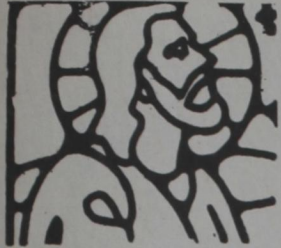

The Challenge of Discipleship

Although this coming Sunday is Transfiguration Sunday, one who has a deep message for all disciples of Jesus; this coming Wednesday is one whose message is even deeper and more important for contemporary disciples of Jesus/that is, Ash Wednesday. Before those of you who are Protestant quit reading this article right here because you believe that this observance has nothing to do with the Bible; bear with me just one minute. The meaning and message of this day in one that all contemporary disciples of Jesus need to understand and appropriate whether you observe the customs of this day or not. Consider for a minute what God said to Adam after Adam had sinned, "In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust and to dust you shall return." (Genesis 3:19) Many people in our society and perhaps you are among them, live as if they will never die. They use all sorts of cosmetics and stylish clothes and surgical means to forget that they are getting older and that they are getting closer to their deaths one day at a time. One of the messages of this day is that we came from dust and that one day we shall

return to dust. We are going to die sooner or later! Because it is certain that we will die, we do well to reflect on how and for whom we are living and how we are going to spend eternity? Are we living for God? Have we been reconciled with God? That reconciliation can only happen when we ask God to forgive us for our sin and when we ask Christ to come to live in us and to rule our lives. We do well to cry out to God with all our heart asking God to forgive us and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness as did King David in Psalm 51. Read Psalm 51. "Have mercy on me, oh God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity and cleanse me from all my sin!" began King David in Psalm 51. He wrote this psalm after having committed adultery with Bathsheeba. If this king who the Bible describes as a man after God's own heart committed sin and recognized his need to repent of it and to ask God forgiveness, how much more do we? Think about these things, read the chapters mentioned above and Matthew 6:1 to 6, 16; Joel 2:1 to 2, 12 to 17; and II Corinthians 5:20 to 6:10; and go to your church on Wednesday, February 17. It will do you good. May God bless you this week to bea blessing to others.

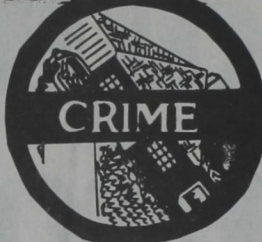

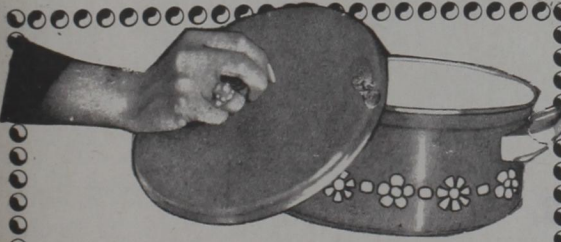

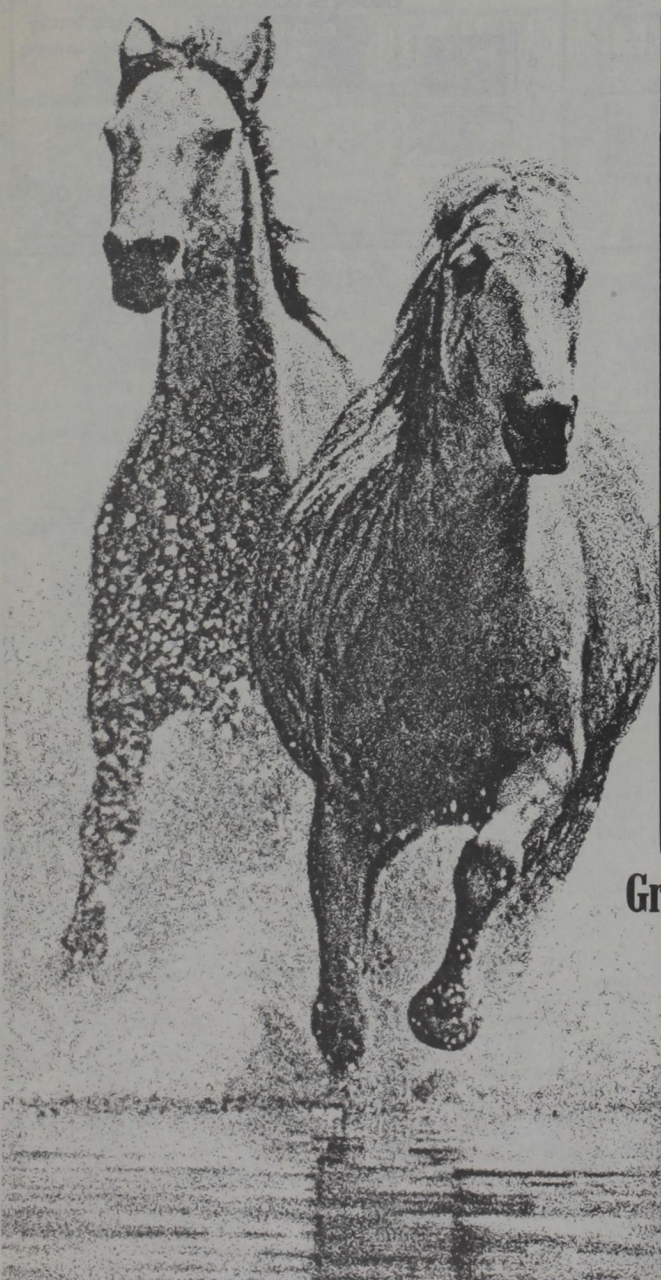
